

Loy-Allen Family

Formation of the family of Sam Loy and Anna Allen represents an improbable convergence of people hoping for better opportunities in the vicinity of Mound City, SD.

1.0-Loy-Allen Family 7

The Allen family that Anna was a part of came from the area around Blooming Valley, PA. Her maternal ancestors can be traced to colonial Connecticut by way of NY and PA. Her paternal ancestors trace back to Fabius, NY, but from there backward in time there is uncertainty. (See one of the "Mysteries" entries.) Anna seems to have been a kind soul as viewed by her grandchildren. And she was a good shot!

Sam's path to South Dakota was probably somewhat rocky and included a prior marriage to a lady (Margaret Rower) in Ohio which produced a son named William H. Loy, who became an undertaker in Auburn, IN. Sam's predecessors were Germanic in origin. His father emigrated in 1853 from near Pforzheim in Baden to near Prospect, Ohio, just after the 1848 Revolution in the German states. His mother was from a family that moved to near Waldo, OH, from PA in the middle of the 19th century. In 1860, Sam's father (John) and mother (Susannah) headed a family of 6 people, including a one year old Sam and siblings from John's former marriage to Sophia (Kaelber) Heidegger as well as the current marriage. Susannah may have died (or left the family) when Sam was fairly young, and his father relocated a little farther west in OH (Van Wert & Allen Counties) . It also appears that he married twice more, and he had cousins from the Baden area living in Crawford Co., OH. I have created a separate document to describe in some detail what is known about Sam's father, Johann Georg Lay, a.k.a. John Loy, in locations ranging from Göbrichen in Baden to Delphos, OH.

Tracing Susannah's family has been very challenging. Her parents (John and Catherine Snyder) were from PA and moved to OH in about 1833. They probably are the descendants of people who emigrated from the Rhein Palatinate to Pennsylvania. The details of their lives have largely eluded me, but you can read what I have found in a section devoted just to this topic.


The family group sheet for Sam and Anna is here. Ahnentafel reports for each can be found here. A fan chart centered on one of their children is here. A more traditional interactive pedigree chart centered on one of their children is here.

In the course of researching this family, I have assembled additional documentation, including source descriptions and photos. For example, there is an analysis of the locations of related families that relocated to Campbell Co., SD, late in the 19th century. I have also investigated the maternal (mtDNA) line that Anna represents. The analysis is in an accompanying section entitled "Tracing Ellen's mtDNA". Ellen is the likely name of the first person in this line to settle in the New Haven area of Colonial Connecticut around 1640. A general document providing some detailed source information is here.

Locations of Sam and Anna's families in the latter part of the 19th century are shown approximately in the period map that follows. The picture that follows shows the family probably sometime around 1910.

1.0-Loy-Allen Family

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Introduction

Sam Loy (b.1859 in OH) is a great grandfather of mine. His father, John Loy, came to the USA (OH) in 1853 from Baden. John already had a family, but it appears that his wife, Sophia, did not survive long after arrival. John remarried in the late 1850s to a lady named Susannah Snyder, whose family originated in PA. Susannah is Sam's mother.

This is an attempt to weave a story, consistent with known facts, to explain events associated with the families of John Loy. Along the way I will also explain some potentially confusing or not currently understood facts and some apparent transcription errors.

My goal is to provide a framework that can be built on and revised to arrive at the most accurate history possible, given the nature of the known facts. Future research is also suggested.

Others have written documents that have been helpful. See for example, . . .

Coming Together: Portrait of a Family, by Winona Garmhausen. c.2004, ISBN 978-1-4140-4400-2 (ebook), ISBN 1-4140-4401-1 (paperback). - Winona Garmhausen's book provides a hint that John Loy was married some time before 1846 to a lady whose surname was "Hydaker". Once it occurred to me that this was a corruption of the surname name Heidegger, I was able to build a trail of plausible "evidence" pertaining to their lives in Baden.

<u>Germans To Marion County, Ohio and Their Ancestors</u>, Allen, L. Potts, 2010, ISBN 0788406035. - The book by A. Potts provides a likely hint as to the immigration of John and first family.

Birth Family


I believe that John's name in Baden was actually Johann Georg Lay. Unfortunately, this appears to have been a common name so tracing his records is a little difficult. The location of Göbrichen is a common thread that makes the trace somewhat easier. Current day Göbrichen is just north of Pforsheim as shown on this contemporary map by the red arrow near Neulingen.

A quick summary is that John's father (another Johan Georg Lay) and mother (Christine Klauss) were married in Göbrichen in 1819. John was born in the subsequent year (8/15/1820).

(Another key location later in his life is Würm, indicated by a red pin south of Pforzheim.)



Deeper Ancestry

I have received copies of the Ortssippenbuch for Gobrichen, and I have used the information to construct John's family tree. A researcher with the ID of "tereni" on geneanet.org has compiled quite a bit of information along with source citations as well. (See https://gw.geneanet.org/tereni? lang=en&m=N&v=LAYH .) Following is a summary of some this information in the form of a sketch of descendants of Peter Lay., who is the great grandfather of Johann George Lay (b.1820 - a.k.a. John Loy).

Here is a sketch of some of the descendants of Peter Lay, leading to John Loy (Johann Georg Lay).




Here are the immediate descendants of John's grandfather, Georg Jacob Lay.

John's father is Johann Georg (b.1792).

Many children and grandchildren of Ernst (b.1787), John's uncle, emigrated to the USA. In fact, it appears to me that all children that were living in 1850, except the eldest son Ernst (b.1814), moved from Göbrichen. Some emigrated to America or they had children that emigrated to America. It could be that as eldest son, Ernst took over his father's carpentry business. - The Elder Ernst's unmarried son Gottfried (b.1834) and unmarried daughter Rosina (b.1827) likely traveled to the USA in 1853. They could have traveled with John and his family for all I know. Also contributing to travel to the USA were the families of Barbara (b.1812), Catharina (b.1816), Jacob (b.1821), Georg Adam (b.1825).

The point is that John had cousins from this line in America, as well as possible traveling companions. This may be fertile ground for future research.



Here are the descendants of John's cousin, Mattheaus. [Lay, Matthaeus is the first cousin twice removed (up) of John Loy. Their common ancestors are Lay, Peter and Hoffsaess, Maria.]

There are a number of reasons why offspring of Mattheaus and his wife Margaretha Marquardt are significant to John.


First, John married Matthaeus' daughter Christina (b.1815) in 1843. They had a child that survived less than a year, and the marriage ended in divorce.

Next, it is clear from genetic matching with some of my contemporaries and from various records that Matthaeus' son Jakob (b.1801) immigrated to Crawford County, OH. Various offspring of Jakob have left their mark in the Crawford area. Sister Christina also immigrated with Jacob in 1854.

Jakob's daughter Carolina (b.1838) married Gottleib Ott (b.1837) and their line leads to a person whose DNA matching with me is consistent with the genealogy presented here.

Jakob's daughter Friederika (b.1843) married Martin Suhn and then James Myers and lived in OH.

I wonder if John knew of their presence so close to where he lived.



Early Marriages

John's first marriage was in 1843 to his second cousin, Christina, as mentioned above.

Then, the geneanet.org site also indicates that he may have been married to one Barbara Maier (b.1825), but I have have not looked for supporting evidence of this. The Ortssippnebuch does not mention this marriage.

Then, there is the marriage to Sophia Kaelber.

John's Marriage to Christina Lay

Following is a record of the younger Johann's marriage to Christina Lai in 1843. This means that Johann was married once prior to his marriage with Sophia Kaelber. Also, because of Christina's last name, I wonder if Johann was marrying a cousin.

John's Marriage to Sophia Kaelber

As noted above, John was married to Sophia Kaelber on 2/20/1848 in Würm. ("Deutschland Heiraten, 1558-1929," database, FamilySearch (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:NZM5-92D: 9 March 2018), Johann Georg Lay and Sophia Kaelber, 20 Feb 1848; citing Würm, Baden, Germany; FHL microfilm 1,238,352.) This is slightly later than Winona Garmhausen had estimated in her book, but it seems to fit many facts.

Birth of Mary in OH on 9/26/1853

Some evidence indicates that John's third child, named Mary, age 7, in the 1860 Federal census, was in fact a child of John and Sophia. This reasoning is based on a death record for Mary that follows. It indicates that she was born in OH and that her mother's name was "Sophia Calver", which could be corruption of Sophia Kaelber. Immigration in 1853 supports this. See the Gobrichen Ortssippenbuch.

This leads to the conclusion that Sophia must have made it to the USA, where she gave birth to Mary. It also implies that immigration of the family took place some time prior to 1853 (Mary's birth in OH) and after 1851 (Catherine's birth in Baden). Also, because Sophia does not appear in US records in the 1850s, it is tempting to speculate based on this that she died some time between 1853 and 1857 (when John remarries). More will be said about this later.

Sophia Kaelber and Her First Marriage

Birth and Death

Below are records that describe Sophia's birth and death. They indicate that she was born on 11/1/1820 in Eutingen and that she died on 5/16/1853. The location of her death is not given.

The date of death, however, needs to be considered in light of the birth of the daughter, Mary, who definitely seems to be hers and was born in OH. Here are the key dates that need to be resolved as well as their sources.

- Sophia dies May,1853, according to the German records that follow
- Mary is born in 1853 +/-, according to the 1860 Federal Census
- Mary is born in March, 1854, according to the 1900 Federal Census
- Mary is born in September, 1853, according to her death certificate

So, it would not be unreasonable to assume for now that Sophia died in 1853 and that Mary was born in the same year. Perhaps the birth was associated with the death. This all should be validated through other independent sources, if they exist.



Sophia's First Marriage

To resolve the assertion in W. Garmhausen's book that John's first wife was named "Hydaker", I explored the German records for Sophia in more detail. I did in fact discover that she had been married to one Jakob Friedrich Heidegger in 1842. I have not found a record of Jakob's death, but I suppose that it must have happened after the birth of their son, Wilhelm, in 1846.

Together Sophia and Jakob had four children as follows. (All were born in Würm in Baden.)

- unnamed (b. 1/30/1844, died a few days later)
- Sophia (4/9/1845)
- Friedrich (4/9/1845, survived for nearly one year)
- Wilhelm Martin (11/12/1846)

Evidence for Emigration of Children

I made a quick search of 1860 Federal Census records in Marion Co., OH, for people with the name Heidegger just to see what I would turn up. In fact I found two candidates that appear to match Sophia's surviving children, Sophia and Wilhelm. (This is the county where John Loy and his family appear in 1860.)

These records show what appear to be orphaned children, born in Baden, living in the house of other people from that part of the world.

I suspect that these children lived not too far from John Loy throughout their lives. It is interesting to speculate whether they actually interacted with each other and with John. (By the way, the 1900 Federal Census indicates that Sophia, child of Sophia and Jakob, immigrated in 1853.)

This is consistent with transit to the USA in 1853 by Johann Georg (John) Lay. And, this fits nicely with the information that follows regarding immigration and naturalization.

Immigration

As mentioned above, the dates associated with the death of John's wife, Sophia, and the birth of their third child, Mary, indicate that travel between Baden and OH must have taken place some time around 1853. This is a period of time just after the 1848 Revolution in the German states. Much has been written about this, so I just mention it in passing here.

The book noted above by Allen Potts (page 57) does have an intriguing entry for one John Loy, a son John, and daughter Catherine for 1852.

Key pieces of information are the names, birth dates (close, but I believe inaccurate based on other sources), country of origin (Baden), residence in Prospect Township, and immigration in 1852 (for all).

Sophia is not mentioned. This further deepens the mystery surrounding her arrival in the US and the circumstances of the birth of her daughter, Mary.

Naturalization


The Delaware Co. (OH) Records Center provided me with a document from 1858 that may record the naturalization of John Loy. A copy of the document follows. It records the naturalization of seven people – 4 from Ireland and 3 from Germany.

The document is dated 9/28/1858. The names of the seven men are shown in the enlarged insert here.

The three "Germans" are Jacob Koch, William Koch, and John G. Loy/Ley/Lay.

The date of this document would fit well within the time-line described so far. (I understand that during this era, a person would declare his intention to become a citizen and five years later could file final papers to achieve naturalized status.) In other words, arrival in 1852 would allow reasonable time to accomplish naturalization in 1858.



So, this is not definitely a record for John, but it easily could be based on the timing and the location of the court not far from John's residence in Prospect Township.

By the way, a quick bit of research shows that the boundary between Marion and Delaware Counties, which is where John lived, had shifted some years before this. It is possible that Delaware was the preferred location to handle naturalization if you lived near the boundary between the counties, which is where John lived.

Marriage (to Susannah Snyder)

At this point, we have a pretty good case for the fact that John arrived in Prospect Township, Marion Co., OH, in about 1852. His Wife Sophia somehow arrived in the vicinity as well, and their third child (Mary) was born. Sophia dies in 1853. John works as a carpenter, perhaps a skill that he brought from Baden.

This, however, leaves him as single father, supporting three children (Mary, an infant, John, 5 years old, and Catherine, 2 years old). Somehow he made the situation work, but it is not surprising that he would have sought help and companionship. This he found in the person of one Susannah Snyder, who resided with her family in the nearby township of Waldo.

John and Susannah married in March, 1857. By the time of the 1860 Federal Census, their family consisted of John's original three children and two of their own. -

In 1864 they had another daughter, Sarah Ann. - Her 1946 obituary shows her birth date as 2/2/1864.

So, by 1864, there is a family consisting of 6 children, ranging in age from newborn to 16. My great grandfather, Sam was about 5 years old.

At about this time, Susannah no longer appears in records that have been found so far. We will see that the 1870 Federal Census does not show her. Exactly what happens is not at all clear and deserves more research.

Following is a family group chart for the Loy/Snyder family. Note that, where birth locations are found in the historical record for the children, none explicitly show Marion Co., OH, as the place where they were born. Also, note that the family is clearly shown as being in Marion Co. in 1860, however. Perhaps John's work (carpentry) made them a mobile family, or possibly just as likely recorded birth locations reflect inaccurate information and an association with Delphos, OH, which spans Allen and Van Wert Counties.

I have not found the family in 1860 or 1870. It is possible that Susannah's brother, George, became entangled in the Civil War. Her sisters, Martha and Elizabeth, could have married. This would have left parents, John and Catherine, alone and harder to trace. This is another potential future avenue of research that might accidentally reveal something about Susannah's life during the 1860s.

Activities From Mid-1860s Until Death

In this section I investigate some possible events in the life of John Loy. These are "stories" for now until additional corroborating evidence is uncovered.

What does seem certain is that the Loy family (minus Susannah?) moved from the Prospect (Marion County) area to Van Wert county (and Allen county). The cities of Van Wert and Delphos and Lima all seem to be significant in some ways.

Based on what follows, my current best guess is that the Loy/Snyder marriage ended some time between Feb, 1964 and Sept., 1965. This is the time period when I would expect to find death information or divorce information for Susannah. See what you think.

Marriage to Mariah Augustine

Just to confuse the story of John's life, a marriage record exists that might pertain to John. This is not proven, however, and if true the associated date would need to be reconciled with the birth date for Sarah Ann (Feb., 1864) and the fact that Sarah's death certificate says that her mother's name was Schneider (Snyder). Perhaps this marriage is for another John Loy in Marion Co. Many people have picked up on this marriage as fact for "our" John Loy, but I have seen no corroborating evidence.

For now, I choose to view this record as VERY suspicions and doubtful in terms of its applicability to our John Loy. This is another possible area of future research.

Here is the record of a marriage of one John Loy to Mariah Augustine on 12/10/1863 in Marion Co., OH.

Subsequent Marriage to Catherine Klinger Louth

In June, 2018, I contracted with researchers at the Allen Co. Public Library in Ft. Wayne, IN, to see if they could provide some clues regarding what might have happened to Susannah (Snyder) Loy. They were not able to answer that question directly, but they did turn up an interesting fresh twist to somethings that happened to John between the mid-1860s and the time of his death.

They turned up death and burial records for one Mrs. John Loy in Van Wert in 1887. Interestingly, they identified this person as Catherine Klinger, married to Andrew Louth in 1857, and John Lay in 1865. Assuming that this is correct, then John remarried to Catherine Klinger and they were subsequently separated or divorced. (She shows up divorced in the 1880 census.) The sequential evidence trail follows. (This is not a "clean" story and requires support from independent sources.)

"South" is probably a transcription error encouraged by the way the letter "L" was written in the original document.





Here is a corresponding news article and some confirming evidence that we are tracking the right person. First an article from the 12/9/1887 "Van Wert Weekly Bulletin". Then a copy of the death certificate for Sophia Barlow, a daughter from the marriage of Catherine to Andrew Louth. Note that Sophia is born in 1859 in Jennings Twp in Van Wert Co. This becomes important later when we look at the 1870 Federal Census.


The 1870 Federal Census

By the time of the 1870 census, Loy family members would have had the following approximate ages.

- John: 50
- Susannah: 38 (?)
- John: 22 (about to be married to Catherine Parker)
- Catherine: 19 (already married to William Stopher)
- Mary: 17 (within 8 years of marriage to Francis Kopp)
- Christena: 13 (within 7 years of marriage to Andrew Moreo)
- Sam: 11 (within 12 years of marriage to Margaret Rower, 25 years from marriage to Anna Allen)
- Sarah: 6 (within 12 years of marriage to Samuel Archer)

There are two records of interest from the 1870 census. Both confirm that John and family have relocated farther west to the area of Van Wert County. One record from June shows John alone as a carpenter (the expected occupation), but the other may show him and some of his children with another family 2 months later. Here's the first (simple, indisputable) record for the Village of Van Wert.

In this second record, there are some things that make you think that part of the Loy family is present in this household. Namely, . . .

- John Loy has the right age (50), but farming is shown as an occupation not carpentry.
- Mary has about the right age (16 versus 17)
- Christena (Tena) is 13 as expected.
- Sam is the right age (11).
- Sarah is about the right age (7 versus 6).
- Other people are present that do not appear to be part of the original Loy family. Quite possibly this is the family of Catherine Louth (after her divorce/separation from her husband Andrew). This would fit quite nicely with the information proposed by the Allen Co. Library researchers. However, for this to be true, the age of Catherine would need to be wrong (60 versus other estimates that would put her age at about 50 in 1860).
 - Catherine, age 60, from Hesse Darmstadt
 - o Lizzie, age 12, born in OH
 - Sophia, age 11, born in OH
 - Mary M, age 6, born in OH

If this second record represents a blending of the Loy family with another, then John's oldest children, John (22) and Catherine (19) are elsewhere. Catherine is married to William Stopher, but I have not found John, who is clearly old enough to be working on his own. This makes sense.


Susannah is not present in either record. Her whereabouts are a mystery. I am inclined to think that Susannah has died at this point, perhaps at the birth of Sarah Ann in about 1864. John has moved west from Marion Co., and, while he does carpentry in Van Wert, he also has property, perhaps through his wife, Catherine, in Jennings township. (There were many Louth families in Jennings Township at the time.)

Let's see whether or not this can play out reasonably with the 1860 and 1870 federal census enumerations for Jennings Twp.

Here is a page from the 1860 census for the same township. It shows the Anthony Louth family. Anthony was a brother to Andrew. The purpose of this is just to demonstrate the presence of another Louth family in the area, near a Hance family.



So, it certainly appears possible that some time after the birth of Mary M. Louth in 1864, the marriage of Andrew and Catherine (Klinger) Louth ended. Catherine then married John in 1865, and they moved in to the farm near other Louth families.

The 1880 Federal Census

As a tribute to John's mobility, I now find a John Loy alone in Lima, Allen Co., OH, as a carpenter. His birth information is wrong, but this may be him. He is a boarder at a hotel.

By this time it makes sense that he would be alone. All children except Sam and Sarah are married, and Sam and Sarah are fending for themselves – Sarah is working in Delphos for sure, but I have not found Sam. (Finding Sam in 1880 is another research goal.)

But, what happened to Catherine? Here is a possible answer, also from the 1880 census. (She is divorced in Van Wert and with daughters Catherine Louth, Linda Louth and Sophia Louth, but she maintains the Loy surname.)

If this is the right person, then the birth date for the divorced Catherine is 1827, not 1810 as would be implied by the 1870 census (noted earlier). Also, the names of the children are not quite the same.

In 1880 we have . . .

- Catherine, age 21
- Sophia, age 20
- Linda, age 17

as opposed to the following in 1860 . . .

- Lizzie, age 12
- Sophia, age 11
- Mary M. 6.

The age differences of the children are believable. Was Catherine (12) in 1860 also known as Lizzie? (I can't find any evidence of this.) Was Mary M. (6) in 1860 known as Linda? For this there are some opinions that she is the same person that married Elias Hinton in Van Wert in 1887 and moved to IN. These opinions list her as Linda Mary Louth or Mary Malinda Louth.

So, John Loy's life in the 1870s and 1880s might have been pretty complicated. Perhaps with patience and perseverance, reality will emerge.

Death



John died in 1892 at the home of his youngest daughter, Sarah, in Delphos. He is buried not far from there.



Here is a map of part of Baden that shows the area where John lived. This map is from the Meyers Gazetteer for the period between about 1871 and 1919. The red pin shows roughly where John and his first wife, Sophia, were married. The births of their first two children, John and Catherine, were both recorded in Würm. Sophia was from Eutingen.



Here is a map of Ohio that shows locations where John lived. This is a map from 1860. The areas of Marion, Van Wert, and Allen Counties where John was present are indicated.



Future Research

Confirm/refute speculation about the identity of a third wife.

Determine what happened to second wife, Susannah.

Find out the details of travel to USA.

Explore the history of people from Baden in Marion County, OH.

Determine what happened to first wife, Sophia. - Resolve the sequence events in the early 1850s to confirm correct dates for Mary's birth and Sophia's death. This should confirm/refute to assumption that Mary is Sophia's daughter.

A research note: If you do research on Loy families, note that, in addition to the families described in this document, there are other families with similar names that may be confusing. Here are some that I have encountered.

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Overview

Sam Loy and Anna Allen encountered each other in Campbell County, SD. I suspect that Sam came to the area from Ohio in about 1888 or perhaps slightly earlier. Sam may have traveled there alone from OH– I believe just after separation from his first wife in 1885-1886. Anna and her family moved to the area perhaps somewhat sooner than that. Anna was part of a group of related families that moved from Crawford Co., PA.

To help understand the encounter, this note starts by exploring land patent information for the township (Fairview) where Sam and Anna lived prior to their marriage in 1895. Inter-relationships among certain of the people who settled in Fairview Township are presented in the context of these patents.

Some (much) of this information was earlier presented by John Allen in a publication entitled "A Treasure – The Family of James H. Allen." Here I focus on just one aspect of the lives (i.e.,locations) of the some of the people that John Allen discussed in more detail. Here is what he had to say about the move of Anna's family to SD.

In 1885 the Dakota Territory was open for homesteading. With the exception of son John, the whole family moved to what is now Campbell County, South Dakota. Cousins Frank and Ira Hatch had discovered the area when they were returning from the "Gold Fields" of Colorado. Mound City was 100 miles from the end of the railroad at Aberdeen. The move to South Dakota and the early years are well described by daughter Anna Loy.

Land Patent Information

The picture that follows shows select homestead "sites" in part of Fairview Township in Campbell Co., SD, based on BLM information for T125N R77W (5th principal meridian). Surnames mentioned are Allen, Hatch, Kimmy, Stuart, Robbins, and Loy. Except for Loy, all of these names represent families that moved from the vicinity of Meadville, Crawford Co., PA, in the last 15 years of the 19th century. At this time South Dakota had just become a state, and public lands were made available for settlement. In general, Campbell County was settled by German-Russians, Norwegians, and an assortment of others. This group of homesteaders is part of "the others."



Following are slightly more detailed descriptions of the land patents shown in the picture.

For now, I am ignoring the patents for Harry Eugene Robbins. His patents are much later than the others being considered here. However, his line may trace back to Robbins people in colonial CT, and so he may be distantly related to the other Robbins people, whose histories are discussed here. This might be an interesting line of research for the future.

The patent for John E. Robbins, however, is of interest as he is John Edwin Robbins III, the brother of Lucia.

Charles Stuart - in section 14

The homesteads mentioned above can be understood in the context of just two families. - The family of John Edwin Robbins Jr. / Electa Warner and the family of their daughter Lucia Elila Robbins and her husband James Henry Allen.


Relationships of Homesteaders to Lucia Robbins Allen

I tend to think of her as the matriarch of or virtual focus at the center of this group of settlers. I wonder if she viewed herself in this manner.

Rather than re-write a description of this family, I'll just include a few excerpts from John Allen's publication and refer you to the family group sheet presented here earlier. Following is text describing James H. Allen's life. Along with that are copies of obituaries for him and Lucia.

The study of James Henry is fascinating. We have no record of his place of birth except that it was in New York. The records of Lillian Allen state that he came from Brant, Cattaraugus County, although Brant is now in Erie County. We find his name in the federal census of Crawford County, Pennsylvania of 1850. In 1854 he married Lucia Elila Robbins, the daughter of John Edwin Robbins Jr. and Electa Warner Only in the 1860 census is his mother "Mercy" listed with the family. The 1860 and 1880 censuses list him as a farmer. The 1870 census as a butcher age 39. In the 1880 census his wife Lucia age 45 and seven children are listed: Mary age 21, John age 19, Albert age 17, Harry age 12, Frank age 11, Rolland age 4, and Anna age 1. Presumably his mother had died by 1870. At any rate, James must have changed occupations from butcher to farmer. We have no photos of Elisha or James. In 1882, court house records show that James purchased two parcels of land in Crawford County. It seems reasonable to infer that his holdings would not be sufficient to provide employment for James and his five sons.

Mrs. Lucia Allen Passes Away.

Mrs. Lucia Allen, who has resided in this city for the past four years, passed away at the home of her son, Frank Allen on Thursday, October 20, after a brief illness. This makes the second death in the Allen family within one week, their 13 month old baby having died with infantile paralysis on Monday night, a few days previous.

Mrs. Allen's maiden name was Lucia Robbins and she was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Robbins of Crawford County, Pa. Mrs. Allen was born in Crawford County, October 15, 1833 and was aged 77 years at the time of her demise. She was married to James Allen when she was 19 years of age. Mr. Allen having died in the year 1888. Since the death of her husband, Mrs. Allen has made her home with her son, Frank.

After the death of Mr. Allen in Dakota, Mrs. Allen accompanied her son to Alberta, Canada, and from that place came to Canby.

Deceased leaves, besides her son, Frank E., of this city, three other sons and two daughters, who are Rolland, of Alberta, Canada, John of Meadville, Pa., Henry (sp) of Campbell, S.D., Mrs. Anna Loy of Campbell, S.D., Mrs. Mary Kimmy, of Sumas, Wash.; the latter who attended the funeral.

Funeral services were held at the family residence on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock and the interment was in the family plot in Zion Cemetery. The services were attended by many friends of the family and many beautiful flowers covered the casket.

Mr. and Mrs. Allen have many friends in this city who deeply sympathize with them.

Obituary for Lucia Robbins

John E. Robbins (brother)

I don't know much about John E. Robbins III. Based on ancestry.com trees, he may have been married to one or more ladies with maiden name of Price.

More research could be done into his history, but for now it appears that he was born on 3/5/1831 in Livingston Co., NY, and he died on 4/9/1901 in Erie Co., NY.

This means that he must have sold or forfeited the homestead in Campbell Co., SD. Further research might yield the details.

Charles Stuart and Martha Naomi Robbins (sister)

Below is an early photo of Martha from a collection found in Ankorage, AK. This was presumably taken there by her sister Sophia, who moved there with her husband. (See http://www.forgottenphotosproject.com/)

Martha was married to Charles Stuart in Meadville on 4/15/1866. The second photo that follows shows the family after relocating to Vernon Co., WI. She was born in 1845 and died in 1936 (at age 91!).

She/they had four children – Gertrude Helen, Eva Mae, Eva C., and Louise F.



First, from findagrave memorial 95317120, there is the following text about Columbus. - "Moved to Wisconsin . . ., joined the northern army . . ., Civil War veteran, saw action with General Sherman, to Campbell County in 1885. Married Louisa Robbins." Other information from ancestry.com sources indicates that he was born on Crawford Co., PA, on 6/2/1826. He married Louisa Robbins on 4/17/1850 in Blooming Valley, PA. He died in Campbell Co., SD, in May, 1904. Clearly he had an active life.

Louisa was born in Livingston Co., NY, in 1829 and died in 1922 at age 93(!). She is buried in Crawford Co., PA, so she must have moved back to PA some time after the death of Columbus. (The 1910 to 1920 federal and South Dakota census enumerations should clarify this.)

I believe that they had six children: Frank, Ira, George, Mary ("Minnie"), Cora, and Virgil. (I have not tracked this family in detail.) The children were born in an assortment of locations, which reflects the family's movement from PA to WI to SD.





Georgina Smith, a descendant of Mary and Myron, has written the following on familyserach.org. -

"Myron Samuel Kimmy was the seventh child born to Peter Kimmy and Mary Pike in Meadville, Pennsylvania. He had one younger brother, Perry, who was four years younger. Their mother died when Myron was eight years old. In 1870 Census he was dwelling with Samuel Hobbs, and wife, who was a hotel keeper in Meadville Ward 2. He was age 13 and worked in a Cigar Factory. Nov 8 1883 he married Mary Electa Allen in Blooming Valley, Crawford County, Pennsylvania. In 1900 they were living in Madison Township Lake County, Ohio where his brother Perry lived. Occupation

of Myron was carpenter. In this Census Mary indicated that she was the mother of 4 children and 3 were living. No information has been found about the other child who would have had died young. When they moved to Alberta Canada Myron applied for Canadian Citizenship. He farmed on a homestead obtained. When he went to Washington State in 1910 he had to apply for United States Naturalization which seemed rather strange since he was born in Pennsylvania, United States. "

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
Here is a copy of the marriage license for Albert and Mary.

Albert's wife, Mary Jane, was a part of the William Kightlinger family, which settled in the same area in Campbell Co., SD. Her maiden name is reported as Hanes, however, and she was born prior to the marriage of William to his wife, Anna. So, there is a story waiting to be discovered to explain her association with the William Kightlinger family. The Kightlingers were also from Crawford Co., PA, and they are likely related to a large number of people in PA with the same surname.

After Albert's death, Mary remained in the Campbell Co. area until her death in 1923. It appears that her children remained in the area as well.

Sam Loy and Anna Louella Allen (daughter)

Following are pictures of Sam an Anna extracted from other group pictures.







Anna Louela Allen

Anna's birth family is fairly well described above. Sam was from Ohio, and there exists some information about him that I believe is inaccurate. Based on my research, I believe that he was born in 1859 to John (Johann) Loy and Susanna Snyder, who were married in 1857.

Sam's father immigrated from Baden just after the 1848 Revolution that preceded the formation of a united German state in 1871. Johann had been married to Sophia Kaelber, who had previously been married to Jakob Heidegger. (Sophia and Jakob had three children, some of whom I believe immigrated to the US and adopted the surname Hydaker.) In any event, Johann and Sophia had three children (John E., Catherine, and Mary). Sophia either died in transit to the US or shortly before.

When John/Johann married Susanna, their family consisted of themselves and John's three children. (Susanna was part of a family that came to OH from PA.) John and Susanna had four children (Christina, Lizzie, Sophia, and Sam). Sometime, not too long after Sam's birth in 1859, Susanna disappears from the family for an undocumented reason.

In 1863 John marries again, this time to "Mariah Augustine" according to a marriage certificate. Based on period records for the area in Ohio around prospect and Waldo, OH, where John lived, I suspect that Mariah's surname was actually Augenstein and that her full name was Maria Catherina Augenstein. Although exact dates are somewhat elusive, John and Maria added two children (Mary M. and Sarah Ann) to the family.

The point of all of this is that Sam had a number of siblings in OH. Their own families are pretty well documented and confirmed from DNA testing. There is no evidence that I have seen that Sam participated in the Civil War as suggested by findagrave.com memorial 95504249.

I believe that in 1882 (age 23) Sam married Margaret Rower. They had a child named William H. (b.1883). However, something happened that resulted in Sam moving to South Dakota and Margaret marrying Sam E, Clevenger (a former neighbor of Margaret's) in 1891. William was left with his maternal grand parents, James and Sarah Rower. [All of this is based on paper records, but I hope to confirm it through DNA testing.]

So, this brings us back to the story in South Dakota, where Sam encounters Anna Allen and marries her in 1895. There is likely a 20 year difference in their ages, not the 30 years reported by some. Their own family is depicted in the family group sheet that follows.

Here is an excerpt from John Allen's publication that focuses on Anna but describes the exploits of the Allen/Loy family better than any other source of which I am aware.

1879: Edison invents the electric light.
1880: First electric street lights in NewYork.
General Douglas McArthur born.

ANNA LOUELLA (ALLEN) LOY

Born 4 February 1879 in Meadville, Pennsylvania. Died 15 March 1941 in Lemmon, South Dakota.

Anna was the youngest of ten children born to James Henry Allen and Lucia Elila Robbins. When she was only six years old the family moved to Campbell County, Dakota Territory with six of their children. James took up a homestead six miles south and two miles west of Mound City. She wrote of her vivid memories of growing up on the prairie, and how on a gala day each child was given ten cents to spend. She was sure that boys and girls never had as much fun as they had in those days. She also recalled the time when her father, who was a justice of the peace, received a five dollar gold piece for a court fee. Anna begged to be allowed to hold it. She dropped it and it rolled between the floor boards, which had to be taken up to retrieve it. Summers found the younger children herding cattle for neighbors. For 25 cents per head the cattle were cared for from May till October. Since they had to herd their own cattle "the money

was a clear gain." Much of their riding was done on calves or steers.

Only three years after the move, Father James Henry died of influenza while Mother Lucia was visiting in Pennsylvania. This was such a shock to Lucia that she took Frank,



Rolla and Anna, the three youngest, and moved back to their farm in Crawford County, Pennsylvania, where they stayed for several years before returning to South Dakota. When she was 16 years old (1895) she married Sam Loy who was 46 years old at that time. The couple had 6 children, Ruth, Guy, Marian, Ralph, Howard and Arlo. They farmed southwest of Mound City, adjacent to other family members. Because of their operation, which was increasingly directed toward livestock, they needed more land, and in 1916 they moved to a new place, 7 miles north of

Lemmon, South Dakota (in North Dakota). Grandson Ralph Scoular describes the operation. They farmed 80 acres and used 1500 acres for grazing livestock. All in all, they operated about 1600 acres. Son Guy did most of the farming as Sam was gone a good deal, buying livestock. Their main source of income was buying and selling horses. They also raised pigs, and cattle which they fattened for slaughter. Anna was a great reader, a lifelong student, a good singer, and played the organ well. She was a fine horseman, an expert with the bull whip, and a crack shot. Sam died in 1920 at age 71. Anna was 41 at that time. She and the children continued to operate the farm for as long as they were able. Anna then moved into Lemmon where she lived for the rest of her life. She died of leukemia, in 1941, at age 62. Anna was a life-long Christian, reared in the Methodist faith. Some time in the early 1930s the Church of God held tent meetings in Lemmon. During those meetings Anna had a life-changing spiritual awakening. Her Christianity became greatly intensified after that experience. Howard, her youngest child, came to the Lord after a near drowning, and was a great joy to his

Ruby Beckman, later to become a lay pastor, lived with Anna during the 1935-36 school year. She writes about the profound influence which Anna had on her, and about how, in a very patient and tender way, she led Ruby's brother to the Lord. Photos taken late in her life show a radiant and joyful person. The reader is referred to two articles written by Anna for details of her early life. She was certainly a remarkable woman. 
A Robbins Family Bible

A few years ago, a bible was discovered in SD that is special to the descendants of Robbins/Warner family. The provenance of the bible is as follows.

- 1864 Published in Hartford, CT, by Case, Lockwood and Company. (This is interesting, even if it is a coincidence, as the maternal line of this family traces back to Colonial CT (Hartford, New Haven ,etc.))
- 1864 Given to Daughter Lucia by her father John Robbins within a year of the death of his wife Electa Warner.
- 1873 Passes from Lucia Robbins Allen to her daughter Mary Electa Allen Kimmy.
- 1898 Passes to the youngest daughter of Lucia, namely Anna Luella Allen Loy.
- 1941 Passes to Anna's daughter Marian Loy Bates.
- 1980 Passes to Marian's daughter Shirley Bates Nelson.
- 2004 Passes to Shirley's daughter Kristie.

The bible was restored in 2004. Unfortunately, nothing was recorded in the bible other than its passage along the maternal line. It is a special artifact that documents part of an interesting maternal line that can be traced to Colonial CT and then to England.



Before restoration. The inscription reads "Lucia Allen."




Related Census Information

Basic information for this time period comes from two sources – the 1895 South Dakota Census and the 1900 Federal Census. Following are excerpts from these sources that support the analysis above that is centered on land patents.



This page of the 1895 South Dakota Census shows names and ages of people in Allen and Hatch families.

Sam Loy's name is at the top of the list. (His age is off by 5 years. He should be 36.) His future wife, Anna Allen is shown on line 6. Her age is reported correctly. Anna is with her mother Lucia and brother "Rolly" in Frank Allen's house (her brother).

Also shown is the household of Lucia's recently widowed daughter in-law, Mary (wife of son Albert). Albert had died earlier in the year. Note that Mary's oldest brother, Robert Kightlinger, is present in the house with Mary's family. It makes sense that he is helping after the recent death of Albert. The rest of the Kightlinger family is nearby.

The fact that the Kightlingers do not appear in the 1895 census is an indication that they arrived in the area some time between 1895 and 1900.

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

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Snyder Family Research

Only one concrete bit of evidence exists for the parents of Susannah Snyder, my 2nd great grandmother. That evidence consists of the 1850 Federal Census for Marion Co., OH. See https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:MXQL-MV2. It shows her parents (John and Catherine), two sisters (Elizabeth and Martha), and a brother (George) as follows.

Tracing John and Catherine back to PA has proved to be very difficult, but I have made some headway by using DNA matching technology and by investigating two other families with similar characteristics who lived nearby in 1850. The other two

families appear on the same page of the 1850 census. They are the families of William Selanders and Simon Culp. Accompanying documents summarize my investigations into Culp and Selanders families in OH, PA, and elsewhere.

These investigations lead me to suspect that Susannah's mother's maiden name was likely Catherine Culp. She was likely a sister to Simon Culp and his two brothers, Andrew and Samuel. Research into PA records shows a close association between Culp and Selanders families in Cumberland Co., PA. Unfortunately, my investigations have not yielded the same kind of evidence that would demonstrate how Snyder people relate to the Culp and Selanders families. You can find the details of my research into Snyder families in OH and PA in this document.

My proposal regarding the identity of Catherine Snyder can be found here.

The experience of doing this research has resulted in a presentation on the DNA matching techniques used as well as the "oblique" traditional research. See the Education section of this web site.

Until a well-defined solution is found, I have the following proposed solution involving the family of Phillip and Barbara Snyder, who lived near New Kingstown in Cumberland Co., PA. ->


"The elder Phillip Snyder in the east settled near New Kingstown. His wife's name was Barbara. They may be connected somehow with the western Phillip and George Snyder clan. The western clan may have had an association with a Simon Culp who could be the father of Simon Culp (b.~1801).

The eastern elder Phillip had a family whose members were baptized in the Lutheran church in New Kingstown, near where the family had various tracts of land. The first son was also named Phillip, and his son Johann Jacob born in 1804 could be the person who appears as John Snyder in the 1850 OH census.

Nearby to the Snyder family (within 5-10 miles) can be found families associated with Valentine Selanders. And a younger Simon Culp is clearly associated with these families. Perhaps a sister of Simon's named Catherine married John Snyder. Many of these families can be found in OH in 1850. There may be an association with Mennonite or Church of the Brethren Churches."


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A Speculative Family Tree





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The Problem (Introduction)

In the middle of the 19th century, much of Marion Co., OH, was being and had recently been populated by a significant number of people from Pennsylvania as well as from what is now western Germany. This research note is about an effort to trace the ancestors of an example germanic family that appears in the 1850 Federal census in Waldo Township in Marion Co. The research is an example of how the combination of DNA analysis and an oblique approach to conventional records can yield useful information, in this case the identity of the mother in this family.

The family in question is headed by John and Catharine Snyder. An image of the entry in the 1850 census follows. Because of the poor image quality, transcriptions of names are shown as well.

The heads of this family are my maternal third great-grandparents by way of their daughter Susanna. In spite of few definitive conventional records, I believe that there is enough evidence to suggest that Catherine was born Catherine Culp.

Seeking a Solution

In order to find out more about this family, I used a combination of conventional research as well as DNA matching techniques. Conventional records about the family have been sparse and hard to find. Consequently conventional research relied heavily on analysis of information about their neighbors in 1850. Augmenting this with DNA analysis it became possible to identify Catharine more fully with reasonable certainty.

Conventional Research

Direct Approach

An attempt was made to follow the family forward and backward in time in OH. Because of the birth years of the children, records in OH were searched from 1830 – 1870. The following sources were explored. Note that sources in Marion and Delaware Counties were employed. This is because governance responsibility for the (Waldo Twp) area in question changed from Delaware Co. to Marion Co. in 1848.ⁱⁱⁱ

- Marion County Genealogical Society; Delaware Historical Society
- Marion Library
- Newspaper articles
- Graves online, genealogical society information, phone; Twp trustees
- Church records phone
- Wills/Court records
- Property transactions (U.S. Military District); online & OGS.org

The results of this work were as follows.

- Nothing was found regarding the family in OH prior to 1850. There were a few possibilities in the census enumerations, but nothing that clearly matched.
- There were no birth records for the children born in OH.
- There were no land transaction records for the couple.
- There were no death/burial records for either parent (John or Catharine).
- The marriage record of daughter Elizabeth to Jacob Boyer in 1859 was found, but no one other than the groom was mentioned. iv She and her family were followed forward in time with nothing to hint at the identity of her parents.
- It is likely that son George joined the Union Army and died in the war. He was not found in records after the war, but likely records of his enlistment and death were found. No hints about parents.v
- Daughter Martha does not clearly appear in any records after the 1850 census.
- Daughter Susanna married John Loy (a.k.a. Johann Georg Lay) in 1857, has two children, and disappears from the records after the 1860 census. Her husband remarries in 1863. (His 4th - 5th marriage!)vi

So, the direct approach yielded nothing useful about Catharine (and John) Snyder.

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Indirect Approach

Having failed at the direct approach, another approach based on finding interesting families in the 1850 census for Waldo Twp was tried. "Interesting" means families with similar characteristics to those of the family of John and Catharine Snyder. Specifically . . .

- Parents born in PA prior to about 1810.
- First children born in PA.
- Subsequent children born in OH.
- Implied migration to OH in 1832-1834.
- Preference for Germanic names.
- Proximity to the Snyder family in Waldo Twp, Marion County, OH, in 1850.

Two families immediately suggested themselves from the same page on the 1850 census that showed the Snyder family. The surnames for these families where Selanders and Culp as shown below.




Figure 2: 1850 Federal Census for Marion Co., OH

A little research revealed that the wife of Simon Culp was a sister of William Selanders as well as the fact that both Simon and William had lived close to each other in Cumberland Co., PA. So, research was focused on Selanders and Culp people in Cumberland County, PA. Two research reports resulted from the subsequent work. VIII Some select details from these reports follow.

Here are some examples of what was found regarding Selanders people. - Members of the family of William Selanders b. about 1806-1809 (PA) and Anna Boyer b.1809 (Cumberland Co., PA) follow. The

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history of each child was followed for hints about the origins of the parents. No new information was found.

- Alvina b.1829 in PA
- Samuel b.1831 in PA
- Malinda b. 1833 in PA
- Mary b. 1836 in OH
- Valentine b. 1840 in OH
- Frances b. 1843 in OH
- Sarah b. 1848 in OH

William migrated with parents (Valentine & mother Rachel Bruce) & siblings (Samuel, Ellen, and Malinda) to OH in about 1833-1834. ix

Here are some examples of what was found regarding Culp people. - The members of the family of Simon Culp b.1801 (PA) and Ellen Selanders b.1806 (PA) follow. The history of each child was followed for hints about the origins of the parents. No new information was found.

- A record shows that Simon & Ellen were married in 1828 in Silver Spring Twp, Cumberland Co., PA. Their children were . . .
 - Rachel b.1829 in PA
 - Caroline b.1831 in PA
 - John Valentine b. 1835 in PA
 - Malinda b.1838 in OH
 - Margaret b.1839 in OH
 - Mary Jane b.1844 OH

Simon had two brothers – Andrew and Samuel, who also passed through OH on their way to other places farther west.

The 1830 census puts both Valentine Selanders & Simon Culp in Silver Spring Twp in Cumberland Co., PA.^x




Figure 3: Culp Brothers

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A summary of results of the indirect research includes the following.

- The ancestors in PA of the Snyder family are still undefined. There were many possibilities based on the Snyder surname and no way to choose the right one(s).
- Culp hints of Anabaptist religion; only obvious tie is between Culp & Selanders families
- Selanders interesting family, Evangelisch
- In both cases, however, I now had lots of information about brothers, sisters, descendants in Culp and Selanders families.
- Many bits of information point to Cumberland County, PA.



DNA Matching (autosomal)

Having made little progress using conventional records, DNA matching was next employed. I chose to use my mother's DNA since this problem only involved my maternal line. My mother's DNA had been submitted to these companies.

- 23andme There were about 61x25 = 1525 matches at 23andme.
- FTDNA There were 5113 matches at FTDNA.
- Ancestry.com There were hundreds of matches with trees at ancestry.com

In order to make this a tractable problem, a way needed to be chosen to focus and find the hidden gems. I employed a method somewhat similar to that used in the Leeds method. (i.e., limit the range of matches considered to focus on more distant matches) This meant looking at some relatively weak signals. The shared cM Project Tool provided guidance in this regard, and I chose to look at matches in which the amount of shared DNA was approximately 25-30 cM. Here is a picture of the tool with an entered value of 25 cM and names filled in for my mother's ancestors.




Figure 5: Example Output of Shared cM Tool

The "sweet spot" identifies the range where I hoped to find matches with people of my generation who are descended from my mother's 3rd great grandparents.

At ancestry.com I looked for people with a DNA match in the right range and who mentioned Selanders in their trees. Then the same process was used to look for matches that mentioned the name Culp. This revealed three candidates with ties to Culp family members – namely the three brothers mentioned above (Simon, Andrew, and Samuel). Each match traced to a different Culp brother. These matches were in the range of 22-34 cM!


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At 23andme.com, the same process yielded three matches again when the Culp surname was used. Communication with these three individuals has been tried without success so no detailed ancestor matching information is available.

At familytreedna.com the process yielded just one match, and it turned out to be a duplicate of one of those identified at ancestry.com.

When the Snyder surname was used at ancestry.com, one match of interest appeared, but it is not relevant to the search for Catharine since common ancestors could not be identified. Interestingly, the match does point to a Sarah Snyder of Cumberland Co., who was born there in 1797 and died there in 1863. It would have certainly been nice if this match had led to John Snyder in Cumberland Co. More work on this needs to be done.

In a separate effort, using the tree creation tools at 23andme, a tree was constructed for my mother's matches. Carefully following the maternal line of descendants from Susanna Snyder to daughter Christina to Helen Moreo to Viola Lause to Winona Garmhausen, it appears that Susanna's mtDNA haplogroup is T2F1. This must be the haplogroup for Catharine as well, and this information may be useful at some point.



The conclusions that were drawn from the DNA matching work are the following.

- No matches related solely to the Selanders name were found.
- Mom appears to be related to each Culp brother.
- Catharine Snyder may very well have been born Catharine Culp.
- Indirection pushed the research forward!



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Final Proposed Solution

My proposal based on all information above is that the woman in the 1850 census enumeration and identified as Catharine was born Catharine Culp, the sister to Simon, Samuel, and Andrew Culp. She was born in PA in the early 1790s, possibly in Cumberland Co., PA. Furthermore, her mtDNA haplogroup is T2F1.

Future Work

It is necessary to keep on working to prove/disprove the proposal. For example, the Historical Society of Cumberland Co. PA may have more information. (Request has already been sent.) Maybe a marriage record for John and Catharine can be found in Cumberland Co. - or even a birth record for Susanna. The former might also lead to information about John's ancestors.

It is possible that Catharine's birth family is shown in the 1800 and 1810 Federal Census as follows. This is based on a hint from another researcher that the father of brother's Simon, Andrew, and Samuel Culp was also named Simon. Perhaps this can be proven/dis-proven based on land, tax, or church records.



Mennonite records may be useful in the event that Catharine's family was associated with this group.


Continue exploring in Marion and Delaware Counties (OH) for more information.

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



1 Johann Christian & Anna Maria (Zimmer) Selanders

I have found some source information about Christian (elder), but not much about his wife (Anna). Anna Maria's maiden name may have been Zimmer (or Jost/Yost according to some information on ancestry.com). Some people claim that the elder Christian was born in the village of Traben in the Rheinland-Palatinate on 1/5/1754, with a marriage om 6/13/1773 in the same village to Anna Maria. See image 74 of https://www.ancestry.com/discoveryui-content/view/319431:61131 for the record of the marriage. This is why I have use the Zimmer name here, but the writing leaves much to be desired.



Johann Christian's father probably was married at Traben-Trarbach on 4/141750 as well. See image 17 of https://www.ancestry.com/discoveryui-content/view/900321959:61131. The given name of Valentine is probably significant as it recurs among descendants.



1.1 Immigration (1774)

One ancestry entry refers to their immigration in 1774 to Philadelphia on the Minerva from London. They were 22 & 28 years old at the time, meaning that they were born between 1746-1752. 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



This record shows that the elder Christian died 12/8/1804 and that the executor for his estate was his son, Valentine. (Son Christian died 2/26/1805, just over a year later, and the executor was Christopher Wunderlich, who I believe was his brother in-law.) He is also present in records of the First Evangelical Lutheran Church in Carlisle, PA.


I have not found a believable death record for Christian's wife, but one person on ancestry.com states that it is 1/11/1795 in PA. This, however, must be weighed against the following record from the 1800 census. It indicates one male over 45 and one female over 45, so Anna Maria may in fact have been alive at this time. It also shows one female under 10 years. Perhaps this was Catherine. Two other children in the list remain unaccounted for (a girl and a boy both between 10 and 15).




I have so far found no unequivocal evidence other than the surname to link Catherine Solander to the family of Christian and Anna Maria. If she is indeed their daughter, she was born rather late in their lives, but not unreasonably so. BTW, I have not found evidence for another Selander/Xylander/Solander family in the area.

I also have found no information about Nathaniel. Jonathan's existence is clearly established, however. Sections that follow show what I have found regarding the children (**Elizabeth**, **Christian**, **Jonathan**, **Valentine**, **Francis**, and **Catherine**).

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As a hint, here is an overview of where I believe the six children eventually moved/stayed.



2 Elisabeth (1775-1855)

2.1 Birth

Date inferred indirectly from other sources. She is likely the first child of Christian & Anna Maria.

2.2 Marriage





No sources found. I am not sure where the estimate came from that is found on familysearch. The AGBI shows a range of 1780-9, but I think the lowest number is the most believable based on the marriage date.







Notes for Frederick Wise and Eva Elizabeth Wunderlich

1798 John and Frederick Wise, sons of Jacob Wise and grandsons of Jacob Wise, were named in the will of their grandfather, who died in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania. [1]

1799 Frederick Weise was taxed in South Middleton Twp, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania as a freeman (single, no land). [2] This suggests he was at least age 21 and was born before 1778.

1800 Frederick Wise, farmer, was listed on the septennial census for Middleton Twp, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania. [3]

1801 Eva Elizabeth Wunderlich married Christian Solanders on April 7. Christian Solanders died not long after, in 1804. [4]

1802 Mrs Catherine Wise, wife of Frederick Wise, died in child-birth at age 19 years and 8 weeks. She was buried at the dwelling of her father, Peter Puttaw. [5] Perhaps this is the same Frederick Wise who later married Eva Wunderlich Solander.

1804 Letters of administration were issued to Valentine Solander and David Gray for the estate of Christian Solander, deceased. [6]

1806 Christopher Wonderlich petitioned the Cumberland County Orphans' Court, on May 13, to cite Valentine Salender and David Gray, administrators of the estate of Christian Salendar, deceased, to appear. [7] Widow Elizabeth Salender petitioned the court to appoint guardians for John and Daniel Salender, orphans, under the age of 14, of Christian Salender, deceased. Elizabeth was appointed as guardian. [8] On 9 September, Valentine Selander and David Gray presented the account of the estate of Christian Selander to the Orphans Court, showing a balance of £211. [9]

1806 Mrs Elizabeth Salander [previously Eva Elizabeth Wunderlich] married John Frederick Wise, both of Middleton Twp, Cumberland County, on September 1. [10] [11] [12] [13]



5 Valentine (1783?-1868)

It appears to me that Valentine, his wife (Rachel), and their four children relocated from Cumberland Co., PA, to Marion Co., OH, sometime between 1833 and 1836. This is based on the birth dates and birth locations for his son William's children as shown the 1850 census for Waldo Co. See "United States Census, 1850," database with images, *FamilySearch*

Valentine and Rachel have their own household until about 1859, when Rachel dies. Shortly thereafter Valentine moves in with daughter Malinda and her husband Sylvester Boyd. Valentine dies in the late 1860s.

I believe that understanding Valentine and his children is central to understanding the Snyders and Culps that lived near each other as shown in the 1850 census. Some supporting information follows.

5.1 Birth (1783?)

5.2 Marriage (1804-1805?) to Rachel and Subsequent Children


No sources found. Year inferred indirectly. Various places indicate that Valentine's wife was named Rachel Frances Bruce (b. 7/28/1784 in PA), daughter of William A. Bruce and Mary Perciful Lucas, both of Virginia.

5.2.1 William (1806?-1862)

William was born in Cumberland Co., PA, some time between 1805-1807 based on census records. He married Anna Boyer in PA around the year 1830 or somewhat earlier.



She and her future husband seem to have come to OH with one child between 1833 and 1836 according to the birth years of children mentioned in the 1850 census. This almost exactly parallels John and Catherine Snyder. This and the fact that they lived near each other makes me wonder if they traveled together and perhaps started out together from PA.



Probably in 1833 (est.) William and his family moved with his father, Valentine, and some siblings and their families to Marion Co., OH. Anna and William had the following children that are listed in William's will: Melinda, Alvina, Samuel, Valentine, Mary, Frances Elizabeth, and Sarah. William died in 1862 in Waldo. His probate record exists, lists his surviving children, and indicates that Valentine Coleman (daughter Mary's husband) is his executor.

• **Alvina** (b~1829 in PA) married Jacob Coleman in 1849 in Waldo Twp, and she was buried there in 1914. In 1860, they were living close to her father, William.

- **Samuel** (b.~1831 in PA) married Mariah Miller in 1855 and died probably in Mercer Co., OH, in 1919.
- In 1855 **Melinda** (b.~1833 in PA) married Frederick Ellmaker (Co. C, 145th Ohio Inf.), and she died in 1895 in Waldo Twp.
- Mary (b.~1836 in OH) married Valentine Coleman in Delaware Co., OH, in 1854. Mary and Valentine's marriage is recorded here https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:X8FM-S7Q.



Valentine Coleman served as executor for William Selanders' estate. Valentine is somewhat older than Mary (by 6 years). He and Mary and their children are likely listed in the 1850 census next to his possible father (John) as follows. 

- **Valentine** (b.~1840 in OH): Valentine served in the Civil War (Ohio, 4th Battalion, Company C). He married Amy Emma/Ellen Ayers in about 1870. - Sarah (b.~1848 in OH) Sarah (Ann) probably married Henry Strine 5/5/1870 in Waldo. They appear to have had four children. However, there is confusion in the records between a Sarah born to William and one born to Samuel Selanders (b.1831), William's son. This Sarah died in Waldo in 1912. By the way, Samuel was present in William's house in 1850 and did not marry until 1855. Sarah is also mentioned in William's will in 1862. The 1860 census shows that Samuel did indeed have a daughter named Sarah in about 1860, so there are two Sarahs, but they are 12 years apart in age. 
5.2.2 Samuel Adam (1817-1871?)

A biography of Joseph's family is included in a sketch of his son, John Wesley Boyd, published in a county history.15

John Wesley Boyd ... is a son of Joseph and Sarah (Devol) Boyd, both born near the Potomac River in Maryland, who came to Ohio about the year 1814, and located in Licking County, and in 1825 or 1826 came to Marion County and entered eighty acres of land three miles north of Waldo. They subsequently bought 160 acres of land in Pleasant Township, some three or four miles west of their first farm. The father died on the old farm in 1850, and his wife died at the same place four years afterward. They had four children - Edwin, Sylvester, John W. and George. Previous to his marriage to Sarah Devol, he was married to Miss Scott, by whom he had the following children: Joseph, Hiram, William, Eleanor, Ann and Mary, all deceased. He was an old-line Whig in politics, and served the township as Justice of the Peace two terms.

Prospect Twp. -

AUSTIN A. BOYD, farmer, was born in Waldo Township, this county, Jan. 6, 1811, and was the son of Sylvester and Melinda S. (Selanders) Boyd. Mr. Boyd has always been engaged in farming, and is now farming forty acres of the old homestead in Prospect Township, which was bought by his father in 1862. His father died on his farm Jan. 31, 1871, and the widow still resides there. Our subject was married Nov. 2, 1871, to Mary E. Wasser, daughter of Charles Wasser, of Prospect Township. They have three children - Edna May, born Dec. 1, 1874; Charles Carey, Nov. 23, 1876; and Mary E., Aug. 18, 1878. Mr. Boyd is a member of Prospect Lodge, No. 483, I. O. O. F., and in politics, is a Republican.


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

6.3.4 Daniel (1827-1916)

Daniel was born in Cumberland Co., PA, on 9/30/1827. He married Mary Jane McIvor in 1949 in Putnam Co., Illinois. They had a family of five children (all born in IL) and ended their lives divorced and in California. They must have been close to sister Elizabeth for a while as they lived in Rock Island, IL, for a while. Interestingly, the 1900 census indicates that his father was born in Switzerland and his mother in Scotland. This may point to the origins of the Xylander family name.

6.3.5 Ann Jane (1830-1924)

8.6 Summary Diagram (Tree)




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Introduction

In two other documents I have described the results of research to indirectly establish the ancestors of John and Catherine Snyder, who are enumerated in the 1850 Marion Co., OH, census. (See https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:MXQL-MV2.) These are 3rd great grandparents of mine. The indirect approach was suggested by the proximity of this Snyder family to three others with characteristics that looked very similar to those of the Snyder family. Those characteristics are . . .

- Parents born in PA prior to about 1810
- First children born in PA
- Subsequent children born in OH
- Implied migration to OH in 1832-1834
- Germanic names
- Proximity to the Snyder family in Waldo Twp, Marion County, OH, in 1850

The three families of greatest interest were all on the same page of the 1850 census: William & Anna Selanders, Simon & Ellen Culp, and Henry & Sarah Coleman. Of these three, I chose to investigate just the Selanders and Culp families. During these investigations, however, another possible connection between Selanders, Coleman, and Snyder families surfaced, and I will describe it later. (See the section starting at page 34.)

The results of the two investigations can be found in these documents: "Children of Johann Christian & Anna Maria Selanders" and "Simon Culp and Ellen Selanders of PA, OH, KS." The research did not reveal a relationship between the Snyder and Selanders families, except that of proximity in in OH in 1850. In the case of the Culp investigation, however, in addition to the physical proximity relationship, I discovered through DNA matching (using my mother's DNA) that there is a clear relationship between the Snyder and Culp families. One generation back from John and Catherine Snyder and Simon Culp there was probably a common ancestor. The most likely scenario seems to be that one of Catherine Snyder's parents (probably the father) was a Culp and that Simon (and his two brothers) were Catherine's siblings. So far this is only a conjecture that needs to be proven/dis-proven.


Research did show a relationship between the William Selanders family and that of Simon Culp, however. So it is clear from conventional research and DNA mapping that these three families knew each other well. Here are some details in the context of the 1850 census.

The Culp and Selanders families are shown below. The fact that William Selanders' sister, Ellen, was Simon Culp's wife is called out. And, for possible future reference, the identity of William's wife (i.e., Anna Boyer) is noted. The Boyer surname appears later with the husband of the Snyder daughter Elizabeth shown above, but I have never been able to make a solid connection with this possible hint.



Details of the analysis that led to these bits of information can be found in the two documents noted above. The purpose of this document is explain the research that I have done to directly explore for the ancestors of John Snyder and to find the ultimate fate of John and Catherine.

Ohio Hints

Following are descriptions of various attempts to find more information about the John and Catherine Snyder family from records in OH. The 1850 census implies that the family moved from PA in about 1832-1834, so there may be a census record in 1840 for the family. Since I have not found a death/burial record for either John or Catherine, it is possible that they are recorded in the 1860 census as well.


In addition, there are some relatively obscure grave site records from Marion County as well as will/probate information to review. There are summaries of what is known about each of the Snyder children identified in the 1850 census.

1840 Census

Following are descriptions of three attempts to find the family of John and Catherine in 1840.

John Snyder Query

For this investigation, I looked at all census records for John Snyder (including name variants) across the entire state. One reason for doing this is that county boundaries changed between 1840 and 1850, and I did not want to overlook the fact that the Snyders may have appeared in a county other than Marion. Here is a table that shows the results of the 1840 query. Of those 106 records, 102 seemed easy to reject and marked with an "x", three were close and marked with a "c", and one was closer than the others and marked with an "m". In spite of all this, there is no clear match to the 1850 John and Catherine Snyder family in the 1850 census. The analysis took into account the ages of the various people as implied in the 1850 census - Susanna 8, Elizabeth 6, George 3, Martha unborn, John 36, Catherine 45. 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Daughter Susanna (Snyder) Loy

Susanna is my great-great grandmother. She married John Loy in March of 1857 and was gone from the scene some time between when the 1860 census was taken in July, 1860, and Dec.,1863, when John married Maria Augenstein. Presumably Susanna died during this three year period, but I have seen no record of her death. Susanna was John's third wife, and she cared for his children by his second wife, who incidentally were born in Baden. She and John had two children – Christina in 1857 and Sam in 1859. Sam is my great grandfather, and I have written about his life and that of his father in some detail.

Descendants of Susanna Snyder and John Loy are apparent in DNA testing at 23andme and ancestry. It is this data that has led me to Susanna's mtDNA haplogroup and the conclusion that the last daughter of John's is not with Susanna but perhaps with Maria Augenstein. (Susanna's mtDNA haplogroup and hence that for her mother Catherine is T2F1.)

Aside: John/Johann Loy/Lay is an interesting character with a string of 4-5 wives during his roughly 72 years. He is a carpenter/cabinet maker from Baden. In Baden he first marries a cousin who dies in childbirth. Then he marries a widow, with whom he has five children – four that survive and make the voyage to the USA. Somewhere during the voyage or shortly after arrival (1853) the second wife disappears from the scene. John marries Susanna in 1857, and they have two children. In 1864 he marries Mariah Augustine (probably Maria Augenstein), and Sarah Ann Loy is born in the same year. In the 1870 census, John appears in two entries for Van Wert Co. – in Jennings township with an obviously blended family of his children and those of a woman named Catherine from Hesse Darmstadt and in the village of Van Wert alone as a carpenter. In 1880 John is living solo in Lima, OH, and it appears that this Catherine is still living with children by another marriage in the village of Van Wert. John dies in 1892, having been living with his youngest daughter Sarah Ann (married to Samuel Archer) in Allen Co., OH. I suspect that the potential wife number 5 who appears in the 1870 Van Wert census is Catherine Klinger, who had been married to Samuel Louth. I am still working to verify the parts of this story with more concrete evidence than the census information.

Daughter Elizabeth (Snyder) Boyer

Susanna's sister, Elizabeth, was born in 1834 in OH. This was probably not long after the Snyder family had arrived in OH. In 1859, Elizabeth married Jacob Boyer.

Jacob had been married previously to a lady named Lucinda Tarr, with whom he may have had two children (John William and Mary Ellen). Jacob served in the Union Army. With Elizabeth he had five children (Lenora, Martha, Jacob, George, Samuel) from what I can tell.



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Luckily, a record from the 1890 census survives that shows Jacob. It confirms his service during the civil war, and it records the fact that he was wounded. The record indicates that he is living in Claridon, (Marion Co.,) OH. Here is the reference. Probably Elizabeth and Jacob were still living in Claridon, OH, in 1900. However, this would be <u>inconsistent</u> with a death record (March 1900) for Elizabeth. See "Ohio, County Death Records, 1840-2001," database with images, *FamilySearch* (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:F662-JT5 : 1 March 2021), Elizabeth Boyer, Mar 1900; citing Death, Claridon, Claridon Township, Marion, Ohio, United States, source ID v 3 p 11, County courthouses, Ohio; FHL microfilm 384,350. This record shows her age as 61, which is about right. But, there is an entry later on the same page for Mary E. Boyer (death on 14-October-1900). This would be consistent with the 1900 Census. The problem with this, however, is that her age (53) is many years too young. The most that can be concluded with certainty is that Elizabeth died in 1900, after the census was taken in June of that year.

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There is a likely headstone for Jacob shown in findagrave.com that was ordered in 1961 showing a death for Jacob in 1899. This date on the stone may be wrong based on the information from the 1900 census. See "Find A Grave Index," database, *FamilySearch*

The following record of burial may be the correct one. If so, then Jacob's death occurred in 1905 (after that of Elizabeth), and the 1900 census makes more sense.

Clearly the records are confusing, but it does appear that Jacob and Elizabeth ended their lives in the vicinity of Claridon some time around 1900-1905.

Along the way, I found no reasonable hint about the fate of John and Catherine Snyder. My indirect connection to Boyer descendants has been confirmed through DNA matching at ancestry.com using my mother's DNA.

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5.3-JohnSnyder-Clues

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
Son George Snyder

George was born in 1837 according to the 1850 census. I have found no credible records of a marriage or death. He was also of prime age for participating to the Civil War, but I have not clearly found him in military records. He maybe identified as Private George Snyder, who served from April, 1861, until September 25, 1862, in company H of the 4th Ohio Infantry. DNA testing has so far not yielded any clues. See pages 120 & 126 of the *Marion County Roll of Honor* -

If this is indeed the right George Snyder, then he was killed near Murfreeboro, TN, at the Stones River Battle. See https://www.nps.gov/stri/learn/historyculture/battle0.htm. However, following may be the right record and it would show that he enlisted in the same unit (4th Ohio Volunteer Infantry) as brother in-law Jacob Boyer, who enlisted about two months after him. If this is the case, then George may have been fatally wounded at Antietam and died on the way to Harper's Ferry. 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Daughter Martha Snyder

Martha was born in 1841 according to the 1850 census. That is the only record of her that I have found. Is it significant that her sister Elizabeth named a daughter born in 1860 Martha? Perhaps Martha died sometime between the 1850 census and 1860.

1860 Census

In 1860 I believe that John and Catherine's children are accounted for except Martha, who would be about 19 years old. Martha's siblings have either married or been killed in the Civil War. Unfortunately, I can find no record of her marriage or death. Since marriages are fairly well documented in the 1850s in Marion Co., I suspect that she may have died. Consequently, my best guess is that she died in the 1850s.

Given this suspicion, I looked for possible matches to the 1850 Snyder family of John and Catherine in 1860. In fact one family stands out. See https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:33SQ-GBSZ-FRG? cc=1473181&wc=7QGH-184%3A1589432777%2C1589422242%2C1589423641.

This family is in Pleasant Twp, and there are several discrepancies, so it may be a coincidence. The discrepancies compared to the 1850 census are . . .

- John is slightly too old (by 6 years)
- Catherine is too young (by 13 years!)
- Margaret should be Martha.
- The information about the family in the tree at familysearch.org is scattered and suspicious and probably largely wrong.

Probably this is not a match to the family of John and Catherine family in the 1850 census, but it is the closest match that I could find.

Unfortunately, there were no clues about John and Catherine, but the information is interesting in other terms.

Jonathan Snyder

This Jonathan Snyder was born about 1805 in PA and moved to Marion Co., OH. He was Married to Margaret (Keagle?), and it appears that they had no children. He is the brother of the George Snyder whose will follows. Jonathan died in 1855 in Pleasant Twp and his findagrave memorial is 103818190. According to the 1840 census, they were somehow associated with Leander Harmon, whose relationship to them is not clear to me. 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





William's family was next to that of John and Catherine in the 1850 census. Here is a copy of probate case 606 from Marion County in 1862.




At this point it is appropriate to point out another potentially significant clue regarding the interrelatedness of the Selanders, Snyder, Culp, and Coleman families.) This was mentioned in the introduction.) The clue stems from an investigation into Valentine Coleman, the husband of Mary Selanders, daughter of William Selanders. Valentine is noted as the executor for William's estate in the probate case above.

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The relationship of Valentine to the Selanders family was noted in the document summarizing research into the Selanders families. See the section devoted to William Selanders, part of which I repeat here.

• **Mary** (b.~1836 in OH) married Valentine Coleman in Delaware Co., OH, in 1854. Mary and Valentine's marriage is recorded here https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:X8FM-S7Q.



Valentine Coleman served as executor for William Selanders' estate. Valentine is somewhat older than Mary (by 6 years). He and Mary and their children are likely listed in the 1850 census next to his possible father (John) as follows. 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According to the information here, John may have been married to a Catherine Snyder. See https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/L6BV-VTH. Perhaps this is a clue to the origins of the Snyder family in the area. (i.e., Catherine Snyder might be a sister to John Snyder. Evidence is missing.) John Coleman died in 1872 according to

https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/29653257/john-coleman . There is another older Valentine Coleman in the area as well – slightly younger than John. He is the source of some confusion in the complied records.

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Remembering the family of Henry Coleman from the introduction sparked an investigation of the Coleman families in Marion County. - In 1850 there were three Valentine Colemans living in Marion Co. - one born in about 1889 in PA, one born in about 1816 in PA, and one born in 1828 on OH and


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living with the Valentine Coleman born in 1889. Presumably this third Valentine is the son of the eldest Valentine, and he is the one that married Mary Selanders. A quick search of familysearch.org reveals this person - https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/LKR4-3BX. The first son of Mary and Valentine is named Henry, but he can not be the one that appears near near the Snyder and Selanders families in the 1850 census. The correct person is shown here -

https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/L71P-K9G . This Henry appears to be the son of John Coleman (b.1786) and Catherine Snyder (b.1795). I suspect that John Coleman (b.1786) and Valentine Coleman (b.1789) were both sons of Valentine Coleman (b.1755) and Margdalena Spengler (b.1761). So, the Valentine Coleman that is executor in the will above is a cousin to Henry Coleman who lived near William Selanders, John Snyder, and Simon Culp. It is a somewhat twisted story, but it demonstrates that these families were geographically close in PA and OH, and they intermarried.

Here are pictures of trees to illustrate the possible relationships. It is a complicated group, and I suspect that there are errors in the trees, but it illustrates the possible connection of Snyder and Coleman families. It may help explain the proximity of the families in Waldo Twp on 1850.



A Delaware County Note


A search of probate records held by Delaware County yielded just one item. The case involved John D. Snyder in 1859. This man (along with others) was brought before the court for selling illegal alcoholic beverages. He was a resident of Delaware. Because of this and the fact that I did not recognize his fellow offenders, I have assumed that this does not describe the John Snyder that I am reseraching.

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Land Records

Background

The area of interest in Waldo Twp (Marion County) is a complicated area in terms of how it was originally subdivided and made available to "settlers" after it was taken from native tribes. Its boundaries now (and in 1850) are shown below in red in the context of Marion and surrounding counties. (See https://www.co.marion.oh.us/?page_id=1554.) These boundaries have been in effect since about mid-1848.



In the roughly 15 years prior to that, when the Snyder, Selanders, Culp, etc. families lived after coming from PA, however, the county boundary between Delaware and Marion Counties appeared as follows. See



Note the diagonal boundary running from SW to NE. This represents the Treaty of Greenville Line. (See https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Treaty of Greenville .)





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BLM Records

So, with this understanding of the area, what land/deed records exist that pertain to the Snyder family or their neighbors (particularly the Culp and Selanders families) in the 1850 census? First to BLM records. -

I searched the BLM general land office records for people with the Snyder surname in Marion Co. and found the following patent from 1832. It is for a quarter section in Pleasant Twp about midway between the village of Waldo and the city of Marion, held with in common with Henry Snyder. Its location is indicated in the map immediately above. See

The only Henry Snyder that I can find at familyserach.org is a person in his thirties at the time of the 1840 census, and this person may have died in 1841. This person was enumerated in Marion Twp, however. He and his wife and their three young children were living near a much older John Wolfe and another young family of Henry Wolfe. There is a Jonathan Snyder in the same township in the 1840 census, who perhaps is Henry's "partner," but this is speculation.

A similar search of patents in Delaware county for anyone with the Snyder surname returned an empty set. Searches for the names Selanders and Culp in both Marion and Delaware counties were fruitless as well.

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County Records

County deed records exist at familyserach.org. They even have some indexes, but there are many entries. I have conducted some searches in Marion County records for Synder, Culp, and Selanders people to see if I can find examples where property ownership was transferred from them to someone else between about 1850 and 1870. Then, since grantee indexes exist for Delaware Co., I looked for situations in which one of the surnames of interest appeared as a grantee before about 1850. This approach is based on an assumption that land was acquired in the vicinity of Waldo before the county boundary shifted (when the Waldo area was in Delaware Co.) and then sold after the boundary shift in 1848.

Details follow, but a summary is that there are property transactions for Selanders and Culp family members in the U.S. Military District lands areas just east of the village of Waldo as well as slightly south to the village of Norton. I never found a property transaction that seemed to apply to the family of Catherine and John Snyder. Perhaps they were too poor to have purchased land and that is why he is listed as a laborer in the 1850 census.

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

In image 11, there is a transaction in which Anna Selanders obtains land from the county auditor on 4/18/1871. (This is after the death of husband William in 1862.) The property is section 3 of twp 7 rng 19. This property is not too far NE of the village of Waldo.

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In image 10 of the index, there is an earlier transaction in which land (10 acres) in the same section is deeded to Anna Selanders by Jacob Coleman and wife Elvina. The date is 12/7/1862, and this is probably after the death of husband William. This 20 acre parcel is in the U.S. Military Reserve.

Snyder Transactions

None were found that appeared interesting – names, dates, locations too far from geographic area of interest.

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Culp Transactions

Image 10 of https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:3QS7-L93H-CRQF?i=9&cat=252960 shows a number of transactions involving Andrew S. Culp, the son of the Andrew who is the brother of Simon Culp. These transactions (purchases) are in the 1880s involving land in section 19 of twp 7 rng 19, which is just a short distance east of the village of Waldo in the U.S. Military District. (The property descriptions are amusing , being metes and bounds using poles and links and perches for distances relative to things like rocks!)

Image 9 of the same reference given above shows a few more transaction involving Andrew S. Culp and land east of Waldo. In addition, however, there are two transactions involving Andrew Culp (the father). These involve land in twp 7 rng 19 in the 1860s. An example is a transaction from 11/24/1869 involving Henry Strine. Andrew's wife Leah signs the deed, so the identity of Andrew as the father is proven. See image 533 of https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:3QS7-893H-7DF2? i=532&cat=252960.

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Image 8 shows another transaction involving Andrew Culp. This transaction also involves land in section 12 of twp 7 rng 19 (40 acres). The date is 3/21/1857, and it involves Adam Pfirsch. Andrew (of Franklin Co., PA) is buying 40 acres (partly bounded by land owned by Henry Strine. 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

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

Pretty clearly Simon and Eleanor (Selanders) Culp were tied into people in the community of Norton, including the brothers William Glaze (1829-1914) and Benjamin Glaze (1833-1890), who married Simon and Eleanor's daughter Caroline Culp. Children inter-married and land was exchanged. No sign of Snyder folks, however.

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
1835 Male Residents

There is a reference text from the Delaware Co. Historical Society that shows male inhabitants of Delaware Co. in 1835. Searching for Culp, Snyder, Selanders, and Glaze yielded the following list. Other than names, no other information is provided.

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US Military District Bounty Lands

It is possible that a Culp, Selanders, or Snyder person was originally granted bounty land for service in the Revolutionary War. The US Military District in OH is a possible suspect place based on the presence of these people in or near the district around 1850. Perhaps they acquired bounty land in the 1830s from someone else. I have not delved into sources about this land, except to identify where a person might look. Genealogical sources pertinent to the military district can be found at familysearch.org - https://www.familysearch.org/en/wiki/United States Military District Genealogy .

The US National Archives has some early bounty land information for the Military District. See https://catalog.archives.gov/id/567388.

Familysearch.org has images from a register of land warrants for the Military Distric of Ohio as follows: https://www.familysearch.org/search/catalog/249409?availability=Family+History+Library.

On the single roll of this microcopy is reproduced a register of bounty-land warrants, 1799-1805, which were surrendered for land in the Military District of Ohio. Under the Military Bounty Land Acts of July 9, 1788 (Journals of the Continental Congress, v. 34, p. 307, 308), and of March 3, 1803 (2 Stat. 236), the Federal Government granted public land to veterans and heirs of veterans of the Revolutionary War. Under an act of June 1, 1796 (1 Stat. 490), a U.S. Military District in Ohio was reserved solely for the use of these warrants.

After a veteran's application had been approved, he was issued a warrant entitling him to "locate" a specified number of acres on the public domain. He could himself present the warrant at a district land office and ask that a patent be issued for a particular tract; he could sell the warrant to someone else who might use it to obtain title to land; or under the scrips act warrants could be exchanged for land scrip, which in turn could be used to pay for public land.

The entries in the register are arranged chronologically. Each entry shows the name of the person who presented the warrant and therefore received a patent for the land, the name of the person who originally received the warrant for military service, his rank, and a legal description of the land in terms of lot, quarter section, township, and range. Most of the warrants were surrendered in groups of 4,000 acres by individuals who bought warrants from veterans or their heirs.

There are 311 images to be investigated here, and I have not done that work.

Originally the lands in the U.S. Military District of Ohio were to be distributed by January 1, 1800. By the end of 1802 about 14,000 warrants had been issued for 1,612,605 acres, of which 552,605 acres had not been located. To provide additional time to locate warrants, and also to grant warrants to soldiers who had made late applications or had not completed their claims, Congress passed the act of March 3, 1803, which was amended by the act of April 15, 1806. After 1806 Congress periodically extended the time limit necessary for registering and locating the warrants.

Until 1830 all U.S. Revolutionary War bounty land warrants, as distinct from Revolutionary War bounty land warrants issued by the States or through special acts of Congress, could be used to locate land only in the U.S. Military District of Ohio. By an act of May 30, 1830 (4 Stat. 423), scrip certificates were issued in exchange for unused warrants and could be used to purchase land in Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. By an act of July 27, 1842 (5 Stat. 497), the scrip was honored for any land open in the public domain.


The warrants and related papers reproduced in this publication are arranged by date of act and thereunder in numerical sequence. The first series includes U.S. military bounty land warrants issued under the act of July 9, 1788, which are numbered 1-14220.

There are many images here to be reviewed, and I have not done the work.

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The Ohio Genealogical Society also has a reference that lists some early land records for the US Military District. See

I requested a "copy service request" form to see if there are entries for Culp or Snyder. The result was null for Culp, but three Snyder entries surfaced: one for a Henry Snider in Ross Co. consisting of 2 tracts of a total of 167 acres dated around 1800; one for Philip Snyder (!) in Scioto Co. consisting of 400 acres dated in 1800; one for J. Snyder consisting of the NE quarter of section 8 of Twp 3 Rng 14 (about 162 acres in Licking Co.(?)) dated Jan, 1828. None of these three appear relevant to the current search.



A search of http://catalog.wrhs.org/collections/search (Western Reserve Historical Society) turned up no new sources.

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PA Hints

Looking for John Snyder and his wife Catherine with few clues may be a fool's errand. In the 1700s there were probably hundreds or thousands of people with the Snyder surname name, and the same can certainly be said of their given names. There is even one governor named Snyder from 1807-1817, and there is a county named Snyder, although it was not carved out from Union Co. until 1855.

Cumberland County is a natural place to start to look because of the evidence associated with the Selanders and Culp families that were neighbors to the Snyder family in OH in 1850. The following sections are an attempt to discover some possibly relevant information based on hints from perviously named sources that provide rough birth dates.

Birth in Cumberland County?

There is the following baptismal record that caught my eye because of the date, the location, and the given name information. If this record actually pertains to the John Snyder that I am seeking, then significant bits of information are (1) the location (New Kingstown) in Silver Spring Twp just to the northwest of Mechanicsburg, (2) the identity of a father named Phillip Snyder, (3) a specific Lutheran church, and (4) a specific birth date - 1/7/1804.

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Examining the records for this church (St. Stephen's Evangelical Lutheran) in the book *Cumberland County Pennsylvania Church Records of the 18th Century* by F. Edward Wright, ISBN 978-0-7884-7691-4, pp. 65-70. led me to another intriguing family that included a first son Phillip, who may be the father named above. Here is a list if the births/baptisms for the family of Phillip Schneider and his wife Barbara (unknown surname).

- Maria Magdalena b. 7/1784 (twin)
- Margaretha b. 9/1784 (twin)

Witnesses along the way included these: Phillip Langsdorf, Susanna Emminger, Balthazar and Susanna Schneider, Wilhem Bohr, Maria Magdalena (?), Martin Langsdorf, Anna Margred, Johann Seiler and Anna Maria (Seiler?), George Bauer and Anna Maria (Bauer?). These associations may prove useful in future research. [Some of these names can be found in land tract information as well.]

So, one line of investigation then might involve the proposal that Phillip (b.1774) is the father of the child Johann Jacob b. 1804 and noted above. This could be him in the 1800 census in Franklin Twp. - "United States Census, 1800," database with images, *FamilySearch* (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:33S7-9R8K-9G4C?cc=1804228&wc=3V1X-CX6%3A1585149703%2C1585149702%2C1585149713 : 10 June 2015), Pennsylvania > Cumberland > Frankford > image 5 of 5; citing NARA microfilm publication M32, (Washington D.C.: National Archives and Records Administration, n.d.). Based on location (Frankford Twp) this may not be the same Phillip, however.

In what follows, I will focus on the name Phillip Snyder just to illustrate the kind of information that is available. Perhaps one day it turns out to be particularly relevant to my search for the origins of John and Catherine Snyder.

However, another less likely option to investigate is the family of Johannes Schneider (b. 1778). They appear to be having children in 1801. See the child named Johannes above born in 1801. Perhaps they had a son named John in about 1804.

From this it is clear that there was a concentration of Snyder holdings in Frankford Twp with a secondary concentration in West Pennsboro, which could also be interpreted as being in roughly the same area. Possible family clusters could be centered on the following people: Balthazar Snyder, two people named Phillip Snyder, and a cluster around George Snyder. Perhaps the John Snyder that I am seeking information about is associated with one of these groups. See the map that follows in a later section for a spatial representation.









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Culp Families

See the separate document about Culp families for details. The Simon Culp name is circled because of the association of that name with the family of John & catherine Snyder in the 1850 OH census.

The 1830 entry is the one already mentioned in which the entry for Simon is next to that for Valentine Selanders. This Simon and his wife are in their 20s, with one young girl (under 5).

Circumstantial evidence of a relationship. (Simon's wife, Ellen, is a daughter of Valentine.) Also worth noting is that Emminger families appear on this page. This is a name that appears in at least one of the baptismal records for the children of Phillip Snyder.

The entry in 1800 in Frankford Twp can not be the same Simon Culp because he was probably not born at the time. This may be a record of his purported father of the same name. This Simon Culp is between 27-45 and his wife may be older. They have a number of small children, four girls under 10, one of whom might be the Catherine that married John Snyder.

The 1810 entry may be for the elder Culp's family. If so, the family has added many children in the preceding decade. (boys: 4 under 10, 2 between 10-15; girls: 1 under 10, 3 between 10-15, and 1 between 16-25) The older girl

The Phillip Snyder entries are as expected based on the 1793 census and tax information from assorted years.

The one in Frankford Twp is between 27-45 years old, has a wife in the same range, and there are two sons (0-10 and 11-16) and six daughters (five under 10 and one between 11-16).

The one in East Pennsboro/Allen Two is also between 27-45 years old, but his wife is younger (17-26). Also present are one young son and two young daughters, all under 10 years old. Probably this is the family of the Phillip Snyder b.1774 mentioned above in the baptismal records from St. Stephen's Church in New Kingstown. See

It is not clear how/if these two people of roughly the same generation are related.

A similar query for Jacob Snyder returned an empty set. Looking for Schneider/Snider also made no difference.

And, as another note, there is a Phillip Snyder in Union Twp, Centre County, to go along with the John Snyder in Centre County above. Phillip is in his 30s and his wife is in her 20s, and they have one small boy. Actually there are many Snyder families in Union Twp. The John Snyder one has four children, the man is in his 20s, but the woman in the family is in her 60s. Consequently, these families are eliminated from consideration.

If John and Catherine are married by 1830, they most likely do not appear in the Cumberland County census for 1830. There are many possible reasons for this – not married yet for example.



This organization was not static, and the following reference explains the evolution of the townships. Briefly, the county is currently divided into 22 townships as shown here. According to the US Gen Web project referenced above, there were originally four townships - "Townships 1-6 were formed from the original **East Pennsborough Twp**; 7-9 from the original **Middleton Twp**; 10-15 from the original **West Pennsborough Twp**; 16-22 from the original **Hopewell Twp**." Formation dates for the four "kernel townships" are 1745, 1810, 1745, and 1735, respectively. This is important because many of the sources used here date to times prior to the subdivision of the kernel townships.


The three largest cities (boroughs) in the county are **Shippensburg**, settled in 1733 and originally embedded in Hopewell Twp, **Carlisle**, settled in 1751 and embedded in Middleton Twp, and **Mechanicsburg**, settled in the early 1800s and straddling the boundary between Silver Spring and Allen Twps in the original East Pennsboro Twp.

Following is a copy of the 1858 map noted above, onto which I have drawn rough boundaries of the four original townships. I have also added tags (stars) to show locations of records associated with families



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that I regard as significant. There are obvious limitations reflecting limitations in the source records. For example, it may be hard to differentiate one Phillip Snyder from another, given that one Phillip Snyder father and his son had identical last names. Also, the fact that I have focused on the name Phillip Snyder based on a birth record that may or may not pertain to the John Snyder in whom I have an interest is an obvious limitation. Be that as it may, the tags cluster in two groups – one eastern and one western. Sections that follow examine the tags in each group.



Here is a list of the tags (stars) in the map above. Each refers to a fact described earlier in this document, and the cluster assignment is indicated by an E or a W.



The instances of Simon Culp in the 1800 and 1810 census enumerations can not be for the Simon Culp who was a neighbor of John and Catherine Snyder in OH in 1850. They might apply to a relative of his who was one generation earlier (a father or uncle?).

As indicated earlier, a review of the 1830 census entries for John Snyder did not suggest that any of the four entries describe the family that I am seeking.

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Eastern Records Cluster

The eastern records are much more interesting. Towns of Mechanicsburg and New Kingstown are of some significance.

The baptismal record (Star 1) is the basis of the speculation about the association of John Snyder (OH) with the Phillip Snyder family(ies) in Cumberland County. And, although the relation is truly speculative at this point, the geographic proximity to the other pieces of information make it very attractive.

Stars 4 and 13 represent multiple bits of information about the Phillip Snyder family that I believe lived just south of New Kingstown. This location of Star 3 fits with on-line information as well as a publication of the Cumberland County Historical Society – *First Families of Old Cumberland County: Vol. XVIII – Mechanicsburg and White Rocks*, by Eschenmann and Barner. Page 42 (and others) describe tracts of land associated with Phillip Snyder and Baltzer Snyder that lie just south of New Kingstown. Taken together



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with the information presented earlier from St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in New Kingstown, there is a nice view of the Phillip Snyder families in the area – who the family members were and where they farmed. Here is an image of the part of the map that shows the tracts (MCH 40, 42, 120) owned by Phillip Snyder in the early 1800s. The distance between Mechanicsburg and New Kingstown is about 5 miles.



Three tags (Stars 5, 6, and 7) show rough locations associated with key males in the Solander/Selanders family that I have described in a separate document. Valentine and Francis are brothers, and William is the son of Valentine. William is also a neighbor of John Snyder and Simon Culp in OH in 1850. Their proximity to the Phillip Snyder and Simon Culp family is perhaps of significance. Star 5 is placed according to the Silver Spring Meeting House mentioned in the transcription of the 1830 census entry for William Selanders (Solander).

Star 8 indicates the location of the marriage of Simon Culp and Ellen Selanders in 1828, just before they moved to OH. Ellen is a daughter of Valentine Selanders (sister to William). These are neighbors of John and Catherine Snyder in OH in 1850. Simon is one of three brothers with whom I have established a genetic link to my mother. This is described in a separate document describing the Culp families.

Star 9 indicates the 1830 census entry for Simon Culp, which appears next to that for Valentine Selanders.

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Lastly, Star 14 roughly locates an 1830 census entry for a John Snyder family that might be of interest. This is not clear, however.

DNA Analysis


Autosomal Matching

Using an approach similar to that used to find Culp connections at the time of about 1800, the following match was discovered. That has led to Sarah Snyder, who could be John Snyder's sister, which would explain the match.



See https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/L8Q8-NWK. The amount of matching DNA is 28cM, which is about right for a common ancestor living in about 1800. The bulk of the records associated with Sarah are geographically associated with Carlisle and just west of there (around Newville).

I have contacted the owner of the tree for details, if any exist.

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Mitochondrial DNA

As noted above, using the tree building facility at 23andme, I have constructed a tree based on autosomal matches for my mother. By inspection of descendants of Catherine Snyder along maternal lines, I have determined that her haplogroup is T2F1. This may be useful at some point.

Conclusions

The fate of John and Catherine Snyder after 1850 has been so far impossible to determine. Perhaps there are records that would help understand their fates and the nature of their ancestors. I will continue to look with the help of a contacts in OH.

DNA evidence has provided a significant link of my mother to Simon Culp (b.~1801) and his brothers through her great grandmother Susannah Snyder (daughter of John and Catherine). This most likely argues in favor of Catherine being a sister of the Culp brothers. More information about the Culp family might prove/disprove the proposed nature of the relationship evidenced by the DNA matching.

Also, the possible connection to Sarah Snyder through DNA matching may prove to be very useful.

For now, however, even though built on circumstantial (spatial proximity) evidence, the best solution seems to be that John Snyder (b.1804 according to the 1850 census) is a son of Phillip Snyder (b.1774). And, his wife, Catherine, is a sister of the brothers Simon, Andrew, and Samuel Culp.

I have contacted the Cumberland County Historical Society to help find a marriage record for John and Catherine as well as a birth record for daughter Susannah. They may have additional information that I will pursue. Topics of particular interest are the New Kingstown area:

Here is a story that I keep in my head to keep all the information together. It may be totally fictitious. -

The elder Phillip Snyder in the east settled near New Kingstown. His wife's name was Barbara. They may be connected somehow with the western Phillip and George Snyder clan. The western clan may have had an association with a Simon Culp who could be the father of Simon Culp (b.~1801).


The eastern elder Phillip had a family whose members were baptized in the Lutheran church in New Kingstown, near where the family had various tracts of land. The first son was also named Phillip, and his son Johann Jacob born in 1804 could be the person who appears as John Snyder in the 1850 OH census.

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Nearby to the Snyder family (within 5-10 miles) can be found families associated with Valentine Selanders. And a younger Simon Culp is clearly associated with these families. Perhaps a sister of Simon's named Catherine married John Snyder. Many of these families can be found in OH in 1850. There may be an association with Mennonite or Church of the Brethren Churches.

And, here is a speculative family tree that summarizes all of the suspicions raised in this document. It may be nonsense, but it fits what little information exists.

A Speculative Family Tree



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

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
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1 Introduction


By doing the research described below I hope to obtain some clues about the identity of the parents in the Snyder family shown in the 1850 Marion Co., OH, census – the Snyder family of John, Catherine, Susannah, Elizabeth, and George. This research starts with the family of Simon Culp and Ellen Selanders also shown in the 1850 Marion Co., OH, census. It expands to include other Culp families in the vicinity, some of which I believe are related to Simon Culp. In particular, one theory that emerges from this work is that Simon and two other Culps living nearby (namely Andrew and Samuel) are brothers. Furthermore, I present some DNA evidence that Catherine Snyder is likely tied to the Culps. There are other more complicated scenarios to explain the DNA matches, but the simplest explanation is that Catherine and Simon share a parent, i.e., they are siblings.

Here are images from the 1850 census that show Snyder, Culp, and Selanders families. See https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:MXQL-MKH. Proposed relationships are labeled.



I suspect that these three families migrated from PA and that they knew each other prior to the move. I also believe that many of the Culp families described here were members of the Church of the Brethren, which I believe is an Anabaptist group. If you follow some of the links pertaining to burials, you will see why I have come to this conclusion.

Following is a sketch that shows migration paths that the evidence supports for the proposed three brothers (Simon, Andrew, and Samuel). Everyone started in PA and passed through OH.



Now to the details, starting with Simon Culp and his family with Ellen Selanders.

2 Simon Culp (1801?-1893)

This is the Simon Culp whose family lived near the Selanders and Snyder families in Marion Co., OH, according to the 1850 census. I suspect that all three families had common ties to PA based on information this and other census records.


2.1 Birth (1801 - PA)

Indirectly estimated from various sources.

2.2 Marriage (1828 - PA) to Ellen Selanders (1806-1903)

This event is actually documented. They were married on March 20, 1828 in Silver Spring Presbyterian Church in Cumberland Co., PA.

2.3 Children

2.3.1 Rachel (1829-1903) & Simon Burgraff

Probably named after her grandmother Rachel Selanders. Married Simon Burgraff in Marion Co., OH, 1/9/1851. They had four children before Simon died in 1863. Rachel subsequently married Robert J. Bennett 9/24/1866 in Delaware Co., OH, after children are assigned (temporarily?) to Silas Cleveland as guardian in 1865. Rachel & Robert had at least one child before Robert died in 1870. By 1880,

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Rachel and (5) children by both marriages are in Labette Co., KS. See https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:MF5Q-3LR.

2.5 Death (1893 - KS)

Simon died in KS while living near his son and grandson in Anderson Co., KS. See the 1900 census above that shows Ellen (Selanders) Culp with her daughter Malinda. 3 Other Culp Families in OH

In this section I investigate the other families/people with the surname Culp who appear in the OH census records in and near Marion Co., OH, from 1850-1880. The goal is to find candidates who might be related to Simon Culp. At a first glance it appears to me that Andrew and Samuel are good candidates to be brothers or cousins to Simon Culp (above).

3.1 Andrew Culp (1809-1890)

Andrew is sometimes identified as Andrew Z. Culp. At least one researcher claims that Andrew is a brother to the Simon Culp who appears in the 1850 OH census in Waldo Twp. See https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/L2RK-GT9.

3.1.1 Birth (1809 - PA)

Eld. A. S. Culp died at his home near Auburn, Nemaha Co., Nebr., Feb. 16, 1902. Pneumonia and heart trouble ended his life at the age of fifty-nine years, nine months and fifteen days. He was born in Washington County, Maryland, May 1, 1842. He moved from there in 1854. Married Sarah A. Mattix, of White County, Ind , Dec. 18, 1865. A year later he went to Marion County, Ohio. He united with the Brethren church in i86g. He moved to the Monticello church, Ind-, in 1873. He was called to the ministry March, 1873, advanced to second degree in 1875. He was ordained elder in 1881, moved to Harrison County. Ind., in i891, then to Kentucky as missionary in October, 1894. I shall never forget how glad we all were to have him and his wife, two sons, two daughters and their husbands, cast their lots with us. Such good, pious members as Brother and Sister Culp and their family (who are members) are helpful to any community and always in demand. But his stay with us was so transient. Oh, that he could have stayed with us longer! He was such a wise counselor, so kind and so energetic in the cause of the Master. The church had prospered under his care. We all felt as if we could not give him up, but were member the Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away, and blessed be his name, He knoweth all things and doeth all things well, and we must be submissive to God's will.

Bro. Culp leaves a sorrowing wife, four sons, two daughters, two sisters and one brother, a minister, to mourn their loss, but we know that our great loss is his eternal gain. Feb. 14 he was anointed with oil in the name of the Lord, thus complying with the last requirements we have recorded in God's perfect plan of salvation. Services at the Baptist Highland church, conducted by Bro. H H. Ross, our home minister. His remains were laid to rest in the cemetery near by the church, where he had preached his last sermon nearly two weeks before, Miriam A, Maxey."

3.2.4.2 Mary (1844-1914) & Adam Boger

Mary was born in 1844 in MD according to https://www.familysearch.org/tree/person/details/LH64-DT6. She married in 1866 in Morrow Co., OH, to Adam Boger (Boyer?). In 1870 they were in Delaware Co., OH, with one child named Samuel. 3.2.5 Death (1881 - IN)

One researcher asserts that he died 1/22/1881 in White Co., IN. (And his father is listed as Simon (1785-1860).) The headstone indicates that her birth was 12/30/1822.

3.3 Jacob Culp (b.~1829 in Baden)

Both he and his wife are from Baden/Wurtemburg. Probably not relevant to this search. Lived in Marion Twp.

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


4.1 DNA

DNA matches with my mother at more than one company have provided the final clues that convinced me that Catherine Snyder was a Culp descendant and very possibly might be a sister to the three Culp brothers (Simon, Andrew, and Samuel) whose families are described above. Catherine's birth date (est. to be in the mid 1790s) means that she was likely an older sister. Following are example matches that I have found to support this proposal.


The matches of significance are rather distant, and that is consistent with the distance back in time to the most recent common ancestors who are estimated to be named Culp based on conventional family tree research. Most of these matches that I believe are significant involve about 30 cM of autosomal DNA. Using the shared cM project tool at DNApainter is instructive. See https://dnapainter.com/tools/sharedcmv4 with 30 cM entered.


Using this estimating tool, leads me to believe that the most likely relationship between my mother and the matching people presented here is approximately 4C1R, but you can see the range of possibilities in the chart that follows.



4.2 Pennsylvania Clues

So far, it has been established that William Selanders (b.1806) and Simon Culp (b.1801) lived near each other in Cumberland County, PA. Also, DNA evidence shows that there is a link between Simon Culp and his brothers and a descendant of Susanna Snyder. The most likely common link is one generation before that of Simon Culp and Catherine Snyder. In other words, my proposal is that Catherine and Simon were brother and sister, and less likely first cousins.

These facts regarding locational proximity and shared DNA make it possible to eliminate some research possibilities, and they point to the reasonableness of looking for evidence of the link between Simon Culp and Catherine Snyder. That means going back to PA records to try to establish relationships prior to migration of the families to OH. The following sections explore relevant PA evidence.

The analysis that follows in this section is based on proven associations and the one speculative baptismal record that may pertain to John Snyder. However, it is important to remember that some of what follows may in the end not be relevant to finding the ancestors of John and Catherine Snyder. It does, however, serve the purpose of defining some concrete proposals that could be confirmed or rejected as more research is done.

4.2.1 Intriguing Snyder Birth/Baptismal Record

Earlier in this document and in a separate document devoted to Selanders families, I have outlined the many important aspects of the Culp and Selanders families. Relationships among Snyder families are more numerous and difficult to research, however there is one intriguing birth/baptismal record that seems worth remembering. It may not be about the John Snyder of interest here, but it could be, and it is worth remembering because it points to a person of interest – Phillip Snyder – and a location – New Kingston in Silver Spring Twp, Cumberland Co., PA.

4.2.2 Cumberland Co. PA Tax Records

Here is a summary of Cumberland County tax records from 1798 showing surnames and locales. The purpose is to show proximity of people with surnames of interest. Similar information for Franklin and York counties was considered, but this is the most interesting set of information since all three surnames of interest are present. The people that I expect to be present in these roles are the parents of John and Catherine Snyder, Simon Culp and his brothers, and William Selanders and his siblings (i.e., Christian Selanders).

The table shows 51 instances of tax record entries by locality (township) and taxed individual for people with the three surnames of interest.

From this table, I see the following locations of most interest because of the presence of multiple surnames of interest.

- Cumberland Co. (no twp identified)
- East Pennsboro Twp (Silver Spring Twp had not been separated at this time)
- Frankford Twp •

These define areas where the families of interest may have interacted. Stars indicate people of interest. (Another researcher has suggested that Simon Culp's father was also named Simon.)

4.2.3 Review of Census Records

4.2.3.1 1800-1820 Census Enumerations

If you assume that Simon Culp, John Snyder and the sons of Valentine Selanders were born in Cumberland Co., PA, then it might be possible to find their <u>fathers</u> in the 1800, 1810, and 1820 census enumeration.

1800

In 1800, I find <u>Christian Selanders</u> (the elder) in Middleton Twp. This is probably the right family because Christian (the younger) is married in 1801 in Carlisle, which is juxtaposed next to Middleton Twp. Here is the information about the other Phillip Snyder family in Frankford Twp. This is a much larger family – 2 boys, 6 girls, Phillip and wife! It is also the closer Snyder family to the Simon Culp family, but it is the farther one from the Christian Selanders family. 
In 1810, both the elder and younger Christian Selanders were dead. However, brothers Francis and Valentine are reasonable targets.

<u>Francis</u> did not marry until 11/29/1814. See . This may explain why I have not found him in the 1810 census. That is, he may not have had a residence of his own. See image 223 of . . . 

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

It would be very useful to know the names of all the children! One may be Simon (jr.) at age 9, and one may be an older sister Catherine at age about 15. This is all feasible, but umproven.

<u>Phillip Snyder</u> does not appear in the 1810 census in Cumberland Co. However, many other instances (12) of Phillip Snyder appear in PA. The most interesting one is that in Antrim Twp, Franklin Co., PA. This location is about 12 miles from where Andrew Culp was living a couple of decades later. BTW, it appears that this Phillip died later in 1810. His will indicates that he did have sons named Phillip and John.



4.2.3.2 1830 Census Enumerations


Since we know that Simon, John, and William were located close to each other in 1850 OH, perhaps they were also close together in 1830 PA, just before they migrated to OH. If that is the case, the 1830 census might reflect this. Each of these people is probably married by this date, so it makes sense to switch from looking for the families of their suspected parents to looking for their own families.

I believe that what follows strengthens the relationship between Simon Culp and Valentine Selanders, and it provides some interesting possibly useful facts to help identify John Snyder. However, the latter issue still requires more information – like a marriage record for John Snyder and Catherine (Culp?).

Valentine Selanders

First, however, the same Phillip Snyder household that was found in 1810 in Franklin Co. seems to be present. See . . .

There is just one "find" of interest – that being the record of the marriage of Simon Culp and Ellen Selanders. Note the location (Silver Spring Twp) and the presence of Ellen's brother Valentine. I am not sure of the significance of the other witness named John Bender(?).

Running a similar query for "Selanders" entries centered on 1828 yields a list of 15 events as shown below.

First, note that all events took place in Cumberland County – usually Carlisle or Mechanicsburg, the two largest towns in eastern Cumberland Co.

There are multiple entries for the marriage of Christian to Elizabeth Wunderlick in 1801. The 1806 marriage of Elizabeth Selanders pertains to a sister of the Selanders brothers. The 1814 marriage of Francis Selanders to Jane Brally is recorded. There is the 1816 marriage of sister Catherine to James Mulhall. The 1826 marriage of Daniel Selanders pertains to a son of Christian. Ellen's marriage in 1828 to Simon Culp is present. Valentine's marriage is not present for some reason, but the 1832 baptism of a daughter (Rachel) is recorded. The 1843 entries for



Searching for events involving John Snyder centered within 5 years of 1827 yields the following list. This particular query was chosen because it spans a period of time between when John would have been about 18 and when his daughter Susanna was born.

The first two entries (for 1831) come from a Methodist attendance record in which a wife is not identified. The church is the Allison United Methodist Church.

The next two entries record a marriage in Carlisle to Mary Heyser/Huyser on 6/7/1832, both from Frankford Twp. It is not clear if this is a significant find.



Note: I have looked through a copy of the book entitled *Cumberland County Pennsylvania Church Records of the 18th Century*, by F. Edward Wright, ISBN 978-1-58549-279-4. There was nothing new in this reference, except for the following note that may help explain why records have been so sparse. (Remember that Silver Spring Twp is proven to be of special interest based on the 1830 census notes above.



4.2.6 Anabaptist Records

A quick review of the sources listed in the two following sections led to no new information. This may largely be due to the fact that records from these sources are quite sparse prior to about 1850. Apparently, congregations purposely did not maintain records of the same quality as Luthern and Catholic records due to a strong desire to be independent and less involved with an outside world that offered little more than taxation requirements. A person who knows more about such congregations can perhaps confirm/refute this impression of mine.





This record may show the arrival of the eldest son of Dielman Kolb, but it could also pertain to another person with the same name.

It appears that Dielman and his wife spent their lives in the vicinity of Montgomery Co., PA. All the children that made the trip to North America but one seem to have stayed in/near the Montgomery Co. area, moved to the. Son Johannes, however, makes his way to South Carolina, where he dies. Perhaps this indicates a tie to Kaspar Kolb, who is described in a following section. Later descendants ranged as far as the Carolinas and Canada.

My efforts to tie Simon Culp (b.~1801) to the family of Dielman Kolb have so far failed. The closest that I have come is the discovery that Tillman Culp (b.1775) and family were in Scioto Co., OH, (just south of Marion Co., OH) during some of the time that Simon & his family were in Marion Co. See https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:MX7Q-BCD. This certain;y could be a coincidence.

4.2.7.2 Kaspar Kolb (b.~1708)


There is another Kolb immigrant named Kaspar Kolb, who is worthy of note. He and his family came to North American in about 1729, twelve years after Dielman and family. He relocated to the Carolinas in 1754. The reference that follows describes his descendants. Because of the relocation to the Carolinas, Kaspar is unlikely to be a direct line ancestor of Simon (b.~1801).

5 Conclusions

The main accomplishments of this research so far are the identification of the three Culp brothers, Simon, Andrew, and Samuel, as well as the discovery that my mother shows a genetic tie to each of them. It is hard to avoid the speculation that John and/or Catherine Snyder (who lived in Waldo Two, Marion Co., OH, in 1850) are genetically linked to people with the surname of Culp. The speculation that Catherine's maiden name was Culp seems to be the most likely explanation.

However, it is still necessary to find traditional evidence to prove or refute this speculation. To that end, I have requested help from the Cumberland County, PA, Historical Society. Perhaps they can find a marriage record for John and Catherine or a birth record for their first daughter, Susanna, that sheds some light on their ancestry.

This is a description of a quest to identify all direct-line female descendants of a lady probably named Ellen (or Dorothy), who lived in Colonial Connecticut. I have not discovered her surname, but it seems that she married a man named John Thompson, and, after his death, she married a man named Thomas Harrison. The second marriage produced no female offspring, but her first marriage did yield

female offspring. I have found no hints about Ellen's ancestors. I assume that they were from England. As best I can tell, Anna Allen's maternal line traces clearly back to Ellen and John.

Why might such an analysis be useful? - Test results from familytreedna.com indicate that my mtDNA (,and hence Anna's,) is a close match to that of about a dozen people. Taking heteroplasmy into account, some of these may effectively be exact matches. The purpose of the work documented here is to create information that might help to identify our most recent common ancestor, who likely lived a few hundred years ago. There is a chance that our most recent common maternal ancestor existed in the American Colonies. Tracing the female descendants of my first maternal-line female ancestor to appear in colonial records might be used to identify the common ancestor if others can drive their family trees far enough back in time.

Having said all that, you can see/read considerably more detail in a PDF that describes 600+ descendants of Ellen that carried her mtDNA and who lived between 1640 and 1800 (roughly). And, there is a PDF that holds a graphical rendering of these people and that shows their interrelations. (The PDF is about 3 feet by more than 20 feet in size, so please don't try to print it! Use your PDF viewer to zoom and pan.) The surnames represented are lsited below, followed by a picture of a name cloud representation to emphasize frequency of occurrence.

I added a section to summarize "Undocumented Lines (Dead-ends)". This is where I am collecting a list of research problems that may indicate that more individuals might be found if the problems can be solved.

Rev. 02, 2/10/2019: Information added for Abigail Thompson Alsop and Kezia Moulthrop Barker's lines.

Rev. 02, 2/12/2019: Finished Sarah Thompson's line.

Rev. 03, 2/22/2019: Finished all Thompson lines. This is the first complete draft.

Rev. 04, 2/24/2019: Revised information about Elizabeth Booth, daughter of Esther Osborn Booth. Death information looks very shaky, so turned her death date and location to unknown. Updated info for Lydia Todd Smith – I had missed her daughter Mary (b. 1747).

Rev. 05 3/17/2019: Added information along Mary Pinter's line in an effort to extend that line to provide a proposed connection to a mtDNA cousin. (See the section on Mary Painter Mallory.) I also updated the descendant report at the end of this document.

Objective

Test results from familytreedna.com indicate that my mtDNA is a close match to that of about a dozen people. Taking heteroplasmy into account, some of these may effectively be exact matches. The purpose of the work documented here is to investigate one line of reasoning that might help to identify our most recent common ancestor, who likely lived a few hundred years ago.

There is a chance that our most recent common maternal ancestor existed in the American Colonies. Tracing the female descendants of my first maternal-line female ancestor to appear in colonial records might then identify the common ancestor if others can drive their family trees far enough back in time.

I am lucky to have had the assistance of one of the people with matching mtDNA. This person has traced her maternal line back to Fairfield Co., CT, in the late 1700s, but there is a roadblock at that point. My maternal line starts in the area of New Haven Co., CT, and I have a clear trail of linked ancestors leading back to myself. Perhaps this work will help break the roadblock and help us to determine if our most recent common maternal ancestor lived in England or the American Colonies.

So, this is a description of a quest to identify all direct-line female descendants of a lady probably named Ellen, who lived in Colonial Connecticut. I have not discovered her surname, but it seems that she married a man named John Thompson, and, after his death, she married a man named Thomas Harrison. The second marriage produced no female offspring, but her first marriage did yield female offspring.

By the way, I have found no hints about Ellen's ancestors. I assume that they were from England.

You will not find source references here. This is basically a birth/marriage/death document to establish existence. I am recording some source information in a family tree that I maintain. So, I think that you have to regard what follows as a current estimate, subject to errors and corrections. It is something to work from, not a polished final product.



The children of this marriage are often listed with the sames names as the one from the other marriage - that being between Sarah Russell (daughter of John and Sarah (Russell) Shepard) and the same David Grannis.

The issue of the two Mary's needs to be resolved before anything can be confidently concluded about marriages and offspring.

I can find no evidence that either of her marriages produced children.

Abigail's first husband was Joseph Alsop, whose findgrave memorial (https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/8639056/joseph-alsop_allsup_) reads as follows.

Joseph was the son of Joseph & Elizabeth (Preston) Alsop and grandson of my ancestors, JOHN & TEMPERENCE (GILBERT) ALSOP of Derbyshire, England.

His father, Joseph, Sr. came from London to America in 1635 in the "Elizabeth & Ann." He was a mariner.

Joseph, Jr. married Abigail Thompson, daughter of my ancestors, JOHN & ELLEN (HARRISON) THOMPSON on 25 Nov 1672 in New Haven, CT.

Abigail's second husband was John Miles, whose findagrave memorial (https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/28364373/john-miles) reads as follows.

Donald Lines Jacobus's article "Captain John Miles the Weaver, Ancestor of the Wallingford and Goshen, Conn., Families," in The American Genealogist (vol. 35 [October 1959], p. 247-55), established that Capt. John Miles who was buried at Grove Street Cemetery in New Haven

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was all but certainly *not* the same man as Capt. John³ Miles, son of John², grandson of Richard¹ Miles, the 1639 emigrant to New Haven from Great Munden, Hertfordshire. Capt. John³ Miles moved to Elizabethtown, New Jersey and died there in 1708.

Capt. John Miles who died 10 Feb 1709/10 and was buried at Grove Street Cemetery was variously called "weaver" and "clothier" in New Haven records. By a first wife whose identity is unknown, he had four sons:

- 1) Maj. Thomas Miles (c1682–1741), m. Abigail Mix
- 2) John Miles (c1684–1760), m. Sarah Ball
- 3) Joseph Miles, presumably the man who m. Jane Bowden 19 Nov 1718 in Newtown, Conn.
- 4) a fourth son whose name is unknown.

By 1694, John Miles the weaver married as his second wife Abigail (Thompson) Alsop, widow of Joseph Alsop, who had died 12 Jan 1690/1.

Mabel appears to have married Noah Alling (1757-1848). We have seen the Alling family before!

The Alling family looks to have been popular with Esther as well. She married Roger Alling (1762-1840).

Dorothy Married one Samuel Thomas (b. 1750). Their children included two daughters: Susanah (1790-1795) and Statira (1794-?) - according to a family tree on ancestry.com at least.

Dinah Bristol Candee b. 1751 d. 1785


Dinah and her husband David (1747-1841) may have had a fairly large family that included daughters Dinah, Lucena, Lucinda, Polly, and Esther. I have not tracked any of these daughters.

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Mary Tolles b. 1730 d. 1731?

I can find no evidence that Mary ever married. One unsourced tree indicates that she died in 1731, which would account for the null result. It may be that she is being confused with another Mary Tolles born in 1729 of different parents (Henry Tolles and Mary Goodsell). I'm going to speculate that this is a mtDNA dead end.


Dinah Thomas Sherman b. 1678 d. 1769

Lydia Sherman's daughters, all born in the New Haven Co., CT, area were Lydia,Lois, and Eunice.




Lydia Todd Smith b. 1727 d. 1819

Mabel married Merriman Munson




(b. ? d. 1818). According to a findagrave memorial, they had three children – two males and one

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female. The one daughter, Mary was born in 1804 and married a John Cook (1799-1858). They lived in New Haven Co., CT, and they had a family that included two daughters.

Lois Todd Turner b. 1729 d. 1812



Records indicate that Lois (1748-1776) married one James Ives (1751-1826) and that they had one daughter, Bede, who survived and married Jared Goodyear.

Mary (1754-1829) married Hezekiah Tuttle (1749-1835) and they had many children, apparently including just one daughter, Lydia (b.1783 d. 1862?), who may have married one Amos Abbey.


Dorcas (1756-1831) married Samuel Thorpe (?-1820). They also had many children in their family in New haven Co., CT. Here is a list of daughters: Chloe (1779-?), Patience (1780-?), Lowly (1786-1858), Rhoda (1789-?), Sally (1794-1795). I have not traced any of these daughters.

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Eunice Todd Gilbert b. 1732 d. 1832

Eunice may have married John Gilbert (1731?-1779?), but there is some confusion that may stem from the existence of two John Gilberts and/or two wives (Eunice Todd versus Lydia Ives). I was not able to sort out the conflicting views of history.

What I present here is the version in which Eunice Todd married John Gilbert and built a family in New Haven Co., CT, consisting of six children, four of whom were daughters.



Sarah Gilbert (1758-?) - It seems clear that Sarah was a daughter of Eunice and John. However, I can find no clear evidence of her marriage or death. She would be easily confused with Sarah Gilbert (b. 9/9/1758) to Hezekiah Gilbert and his with Tameson Gregory in Fairfield Co., CT. More research could be done on this.

Eunice Gilbert (1762-1835) married Jesse Tuttle (1759-1848). I did not look for any offspring that they may have produced.

Consensus opinion is that Mabel Gilbert (1767) married Ezra Munson (1757-1800). Their family located in new haven, CT, consisted of Lydia, Harriet, Austin, Chauncy, Justus, and Kezia.


Lydia Gilbert (1769-1774) died quite early in life.

The marriage of Dinah Sherman and James Atwater looks like the right one to follow in this case.


The Atwater/Sherman family likely had six children – James, Abigail (1727-?), Elijah (2x?), Lydia (1734-?), and Rachel (1737-?). Note that after Dinah's death in 1739, James must have married Elizabeth Alling. Following the daughters of the first marriage yields one more generation

Abigail married Nicholas Peck (1732-1793) in New haven in 1753 and they had the following female children.

Mary Peck b. 1758 d. ?

I can find no clear records for Mary other than the record of her birth. More research is needed.

Pamela Peck b. 1761 d.?

I can find no clear records for Pamela. Just one pedigree submission mentions her. - "Pedigree Resource File," database, *FamilySearch* (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/2:2:SBQK-7FM: accessed 15 February 2019), entry for Pamela /Peck/; file (2:2:2:MM7Y-Z63), submitted 14 May 2011 by shalom [identity withheld for privacy].

Mary Dinah Peck b. 1767

I can find no clear records for this Mary other than the record of her birth, which shows her name as Mary Dinah. More research is needed.

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Sarah b. 1770 d. 1770


Lydia Atwater b. 1734 d. 1748?

There are at least 3 death records for a person named Lydia Atwater. Assuming that one is accurate, it is reasonable to assume Lydia died before she could have been responsible for any daughters.

Rachel Atwater Bradley b. 1737 d. 1809




Sarah Gilbert Potter b. 1730 d. 1798

Experience Thomas b. 1687 d. 1703



Mary married John Cooper, Jr, and they had a fairly large family in New Haven.



Hannah Munson Andrews b. 1697 d. 1785

It appears that Hannah was the last wife (the first being Lydia Johnson?) of Gideon Andrews They may have married in 1739, and they may have had one child – Samuel (1742-?). I suspect that this branch of the mtDNA trail ends here.

Amy Munson Sperry b. 1704 d. ?

Amy married Joshua Sperry in about 1727 in New Haven. Their children seem to have included the following daughters – Rebecca (1730-?), Amy (1732-1748), Phebe (1735-1756), Sarah (1739-1740), Thankful (1740/1741-?), and Rachel (1746-1748). the ones that might have had children are analyzed below.

Rebecca Sperry Osborn b. 1730 d.?

Rebecca Sperry married Jehiel Osborn (1728-?). They in turn had the following daughters –

- Amy (1750/1751-1761) did not live long enough to produce offspring.
- Rachel (1755-?) who married Michael Kenney,
- Lucy (1758-?) who married Zophar Atwater,

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- Rebecca (1764-1842) who married Elijah Hotchkiss,
- and Elizabeth (1772-?) who married Harmon Payne.

Amy Sperry b. 1732 d. 1748

Amy Sperry likely died in 1748 at about the age of 16. She shared a birthday (6/10) with her sister, Rebecca. I have found no marriage records, so I will assume that she had no children.

Phebe Sperry Downs b. 1735 d.?

Phebe married Joseph Downs in 1756. They had a family in new haven Co., CT. All children but two were male. One female was Phebe (1765-1844) and the other was Candace (1756-?). Both daughters married men with the surname of Downs (!) and stayed in the New Haven area.

Thankful Sperry b. 1740 d. 1740?

I have found just the records of birth and baptism, separated by about 2 months. Other than this, there is no trace. I have a suspicion that this child did not survive long.

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Ruth Munson Hotchkiss b. 1708 d. 1785

Ruth married Caleb Hotchkiss in 1728 in New Haven. They had four children, one of whom was a daughter – Esther (b.1745).

Esther Hotchkiss Murray b. 1745 d. 1831

Esther married Philemon Murray and they had just one son, Hezekiah. This myDNA line ends here.

Mehitabel Munson Morris b. 1709

Benjamin Munson (b. 1699) married Mehitabel in November of 1731. They had three children – two of whom were female.

Sarah Morris b. 1737 d. 1829?

Sarah married Judah Thompson and probably had just two children. One one a daughter named Rebecca Thompson (b. 1760). I can find no record of a marriage for this Rebecca, but I did find a potential death record – from phthisis (!) in 1829 in New Haven. I am inclined to accept this in lieu of other evidence. Taking that assumption, this branch of the mtDNA line end here.

Elizabeth Morris Humpreville b. 1739 d.?

It appears that in 1759 Elizabeth Morris married Thomas Humphreville (b. 1736) in New Haven Co., CT. Their children were Lemuel (1760-?), Thomas (1762-1850), Elijah (1764-?), Elizabeth (1766-1825) who married Ezra Lines (1760-1820), and Mehitabel (1770-1806) who apparently was never married.

Sarah Munson Stone b. 1713 d. 1737

Sarah married Enos Stone in 1731 and they had two children – Daniel (b. 1732) and Elizabeth (b. 1735).

Elizabeth Stone b. 1735 d.?

I can find no record of what might have happened to Elizabeth. There are some potentially confusing similarly named people at this point in time. This is a line that could be investigated further.

Elizabeth Munson Perkins b. 1695 d. ?

Elizabeth married Seth Perkins (1685-1733) in 1716. Their children were Thomas (b. 1717), Amy and Eleanor.

Amy Perkins Peck b. 1726 d. 1799

Amy married Joseph Peck (1718-1788) in New haven. Their family consisted of the following. They mostly lived in the area of Woodbridge, CT.

Bathsheba Peck (1745-1832), who probably married Roswell Palmer (b. 1742)

Seth Peck (1747-1831)

Joseph Peck (1749-1800), who married Sarah Allcock (b. 1749)

Amy Peck (b.1751) who married Wilmot Bradley (1751-1814)

Dan Peck (b.1753)

John Peck (1756-1825), who married Lois Osborne.

Dorcas Peck (b.1758), who probably married William Osborne (b.1755).

Asenath Peck (1760-1838), who married Stephen Russell (1756-1817)

Electa Peck (b.1761), who married John Alling (b.1761).



Eleanor Perkins Hotchkiss b. 1726 d. 1816

Eleanor married Solomon Hotchkiss (b.1724?) and lived in Woodbridge, CT. They had one daughter and two sons named Solomon (1752-1793) and David (1754-1823). Their daughter was Elizabeth Hotchkiss (b. 1749). Elizabeth married Daniel Johnson (b.1749).

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Mary Cooper Smith b. 1677 d. 1761 *

The consensus among researchers is that Obedience died not long after birth in New Haven.

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Mary Smith Painter b. 1707 d. 1786

Mary married one Deliverance Painter (1701-1781) on 6/23/1775 in New Haven. There is a sad story about the death of Deliverance that you can see at his memorial -

https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/66645028 .Their family consisted of the following, including five daughters. Of these five, it appears that only one (Mary) had any children. The family lived in New Haven Co., CT.

Mary Painter Mallory b. 1728 d. 1804

Mary married Daniel Mallory (1720-?) in New Haven. It appears that they relocated to Litchfield Co., CT, where they had a large family that included the following daughters.

Abigail Mallory Curtiss (1748-?): Abigail married Israel Curtiss (1742-1802). They may have had a fairly large family, and they may have moved into Saratoga Co., NY. Their daughters included Polly (b. 1771), Charlotte (b. 1773), Mary (b. 1776), and Alathea (b.1785).

Mary Mallory Curtiss (1749-10-17-?): I believe that Mary (like her sister) married a Curtiss (Stephen Curtiss 1744-1813) in Litchfield Co., CT. They also had a fairly large family, but most members stayed in CT. Her daughters included Amey (b. 1774), Mabel (b. 1778), Abigail (b. a780), Betsy (b.1783), Laura (b. 1790), and Louisa (b. 1792).

Note that there are two people named Mary Mallory/Mellery, living geographically very close (in Litchfield Co., CT), who are within a a year of each other in age. The other Mary Mallory (b. 1748-06-23) was the daughter of John Mallory and probably Mary Sanford. She may have married a Simeon Minor (b. 1743) – who was also shadowed by a person with the same name in the same location but born about 7 years later.

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Freelove Amy Osborne (1752-1794): Married Jared Osborne (1745-1832). They had four children, and their family stayed in the Oxford area of New Haven Co., CT. There was one daughter named Electa (b. 1793).

Lois Mallory Chatfield (1756-1790?): Lois married Eli Chatfield (1754-1840) in Oxford, New Haven, CT. There were six children, one of whom (Sherman) may have made it to Illinois. The daughters included Mary (b. 1778), Obedience (b. 1782), Lucinda (b. 1784), and Polly (b.1788).

Adah Mallory (Hitchcok?) (1762-?): There is confusion among researchers about who Adah may have married. — For now I choose Caleb Hitchcock, but that should be confirmed. If this is true, then their children included the following daughters: Polly, Huldah, Leusinia, Esther, Adah, and Phila.

Rebecca Mallory Osborne (1764–1846): There is evidence that Rebecca married Nathan Orborne (1763-1845). They may have had a large family and at some point moved to NY. This is worthy of more research.

Mabel Mallory (1765-?): I can find no clear evidence regarding what became of Mabel. It is clear that she was born on 11/17/1765 to Daniel and Mary in Litchfield Co., CT.

Pene Mallory (1767-?): It is clear that Pene was born on 9/9/1767 to Daniel and Mary in Litchfield, but I can find no evidence about the rest of her life.

Amy Painter b. 1730 d. 1751

Died unmarried at only 21 years of age. She is buried in West Haven, New Haven, CT.

Abigail Painter b. 1738 d. 1755

Died unmarried at only 16 years of age. She is buried with her sister in West Haven.

Rebecca Painter b. 1744 d. 1788

I have seen in ancestry.com that there is suspicion that Rebecca married John Sherman (1734-1803). The evidence does appear to be strong, but if it is correct, they had just one child – Nathan Sherman (1767-1857). See https://www.ancestry.com/family-tree/person/tree/151746240/person/342011163400/facts? phsrc=VqT14& phstart=successSource . This is the only hint that I have had about Rebecca's life.

Freelove Painter b. 1749 d. 1751

This child died at about age 2 in West Haven, New Haven Co., CT.

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Amy Smith b. 1709 d. ?

It is clear that Amy was born 3/10/1709 in New Haven to Samuel Smith and Mary Cooper Smith. There is speculation that she died in 1709, or before 1715, or Her actual fate is unknown based on the evidence that I have seen. More work might be useful here.

Margaret Smith Smith(!) b. 1711 d. 1803 *

Here the trail is much clearer. Margaret married Austin Smith (1711-1797) in New Haven, CT, on 2/7/1733. They share one set of great grandparents, namely George Smith (1618-1662) and his wife Sarah Bourne (1614-1683), so they were second cousins. Their offspring are listed below and the daughters' families are examined in following sections.

Margaret Smith Thompson b. 1734 d. 1821

Margaret married Jonathan Thompson (1733-1784) in New haven Co., CT. Some researchers think that Jonathan's line can be traced back to the John Thompson that was Ellen's husband. There was another John Thompson in New Haven at the same time, however, and it seems more likely that this Jonathan Thompson's line leads back to him and his wife, Dorothy. This needs clarification, however. DNA analysis might ultimately be needed to separate of the Thompson lines (assuming that the two John Thompsons were not related).

In any event, Margaret and Jonathan had four children – Stephen (1759-?), Esther (1766-?), and Mary (?-1829).

Mary Thompson married David Hopkins. They lived in the Waterbury, CT, area and had a family that probably consisted of seven children, including three daughters (Polly, Mabel, and Laura).

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Mary Smith (Thompson?) b. 1737 d. 1773

There is speculation that Mary married Joel David Thompson (1737-1804). If that is the case, then there are a number of daughters to consider. This is VERY tentative, however.



Hannah Smith Hickox b. 1746/1747 d.?

There is speculation that Hannah (1746-?) married James Hickox(k) (1746-1833) on 11/28/1766 in New Haven. They may have had a daughter named Olive (1744-1806), who married a man named John Bouton.

Philena Smith Hickox b. 1750 d. 1826 *

In the context of autosomal DNA matching results, Philena's family represents a likely practical limit to which autosomal DNA matching could be expected to yield a match worth pursuing. Someone descended from one of her children could theoretically share about 0.1% of autosomal DNA with me or my mother. The statistical nature of inheritance, however, means that a living person who shares a most recent common ancestor from this family may share no DNA or a little more than 0.1%.



occurred on 8/29/1771 in Waterbury, New haven, CT.

There is evidence for just four children, all born in Waterbury. However, the family moved to Chenango Co., NY at some point. Chenango Co. is where Gideon and Philena are buried.

The families of their daughters and son are investigated below.

Sarah Hickox Beebe b. 1774 d. 1864

Sarah married Orillana Beebe (1770-1863), probably in CT. His name is spelled in an assortment of ways. They moved to Cortland Co., NY, and probably had quite a few children. Sarah and Orillana are both buried there.

Polly Hickox Warner b. 1777 d. 1849 *

Polly married Richard Warner while still in Waterbury in about 1792. They must have moved with her parents sometime between 1792 and 1802 based on the birth records for their children. My direct line maternal ancestor, Electa was born in Chenango Co., on 2/2/1802. It is her marriage to John Edwin

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Robbins Jr. that produces the first first family for which I have some pictures. This Robbins/Warner family lived in Crawford Co., PA.

Hannah Smith Hickox Terrill b. 1781 d. 1856

Hannah married Elias Terrill (1766-1835) in New haven Co., CT, on 5/6/1798. They probably had a large family – some born in CT and others born in NY. (They eventually moved to Chenango Co., NY.

David Hickox b. 1772 d. 1847

David married Kezia Dutton (1783-1865), They lived in Litchfiedl Co., CT, and they had one son named Caleb.

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Mehitabel Smith Benham b. 1755 d. 1834

Mehitabel married Elihu Benham (1748-1836). They lived in New haven Co., CT, and they had a family consisting of the following children (or something close to this?). (There is disagreement about the children.) Once again, this was a New Haven Family.

- Mehitabel (1773-?): married Zebah Farrell (1776-1862), had a family and remained in the New Haven Co., CT, area.
- Sally (1775-1862): She may have died 2/19/1862 in New Haven Co., CT. And, she may have been married to one Jacob Monroe on 3/12/1793.
- Elihu (1777-1862)
- Laurena (1785?-?): unknown fate.
- Leverett (1799-1851)
- Ransom (1790-1860)
- Philena (1791-?): unknown fate.
- Barzil (1795-1878)

- Desire (1798-1803)



Thankful Smith Tolles b. 1712 d. 1769


Thankful married Daniel Tolles (1705-1782) probably in the early 1730s. (Some people have confused her with her daughter, Thankful Tolles, who married Daniel Sanford.)

Thankful Smith and Daniel Tolles lived in New Haven Co., CT, where they may have had an impressive array of children. Estimates include the list of twelve in the accompanying picture.

Assuming this list is correct, there were four daughters to investigate: Thankful, Dorothy, Desire, and Mary.







Irenah Sanford (1753-1830?): Irenah probably married Samuel Fenn (1743-1820) in 1767. There are multiple Samuel Fenns around at about this time, but this appears to be the correct one. That being the case, their children were likely included . . . Irena (1768-1830), Samuel (1770-1854), Eli (1772-1822), Thankful (1776-1829), and Anna (1778-?). Litchfield Co., CT, looks to have been their final home area.

Thankful Sanford (1755-1759): This Thankful did not survive long enough to have offspring.

Lois Sanford (1760-1832): Lois married Daniel Curtis (1754-1803) in 1776. They lived in Litchfield Co., CT, and had three children – Polly (1782-?), who married Isaac Newton (I did not make that up.), Eli (1786-?), and Philena (1779-?).

Phebe Sanford (1762-?): Phoebe married Samuel Martin (1759-?). They started in CT and eventually ended up in Broome Co., NY. Their children included these daughters: Fanny, Phebe, and Charlotte.

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Dorothy Tolles b. 1745 d. 1745?

I find nothing other than a record of Dorothy's baptism on 12/8/1745 in Nrew Haven Co., CT. My suspicion is that Dorothy was a twin to Desire and that Dorothy did not survive.


Desire Tolles Beecher b. 1745 d. 1812

Desire married Isaac Beecher on 4/28/1768. They had a large family that included the following daughters Frances, Elizabeth, and Betsy. Some children, as well as Isaac ended up in Litchfield Co., CT.

Mary married Noah Thomas (1756-1818) in Oxford, CT., on 9/8/1781. They had six children, only one of which was female, namely Laura, who may have married Elihu Roninson.

Eunice Johnson (Sperry?) b. 1703 d. 1725

Eunice died quite early in life (age 22). Only one source indicates that she may have married Asa Sperry, but I can find no confirmation of this. For now, I assume that Eunice died "without issue."



Kezia Lines Alling b. 1715 d. 1782

Kezia (1715-1782) married Samuel Alling (1712/1715-1799) in about 1737 in New Haven. Their children consisted of those in the accompanying picture.



Ruth Alling Hine b. 1738 d. 1777

Daughter Ruth married Daniel Hine (1734-1798). Their daughters were Mary (1757-?), Kezia (1759-?), Rebecca (1760-?), Eunice (1760-?), Elizabeth (1765-?), and Hannah (1767-?). The history of this family seems a little confusing and poorly defined. The daughters warrant more research.

I have not found more data about Mary Hine (b. 1757). She deserves more research.

It appears that Kezia Hine married Timothy Goodrich (1756-1829). They ended up in VT.

Rebecca Hine (b. 1760) may have married a Hubbard person and moved to VT. She seems to buried next to her sister, Elizabeth, in Rutland Co., VT. See memorial: https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/46521466/elizabeth-hine.

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Eunice Hine (b. 1760) seems to have married Jonathan Orms. They lived in Rutland Co.,VT, and had a large family.

Elizabeth Hine likely was not married and died in VT. See info about her sister Rebecca above.

Kezia Alling b. 1748 d. 1765

Daughter Kezia(h) died at about the age of 17 so I assume that she did not marry and so had no children. She was Cornelius' twin sister.

Eleanor Alling Frisbie b. 1751 d.?

Eleanor married Amos Frisbie. They lived in New Haven.

Hannah Alling Peck b. 1751 d.?

Hannah married Seth Peck. They also lived in the New Haven area. We have seen the Peck name elsewhere.

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Rebecca Cooper Alling b. 1689 d. 1770




Phebe Alling Talmadge Wolcott b. 1723 d. 1788

Phebe was married twice – first to Robert Talmadge in 1747 and then to William Wolcott sometime after 1754 by current estimates.

I can not find any children that Phebe had with Robert Talmadge (1715-1753). They were only married about 6 years before he died.

With William Wolcott (1730-1784) Phebe apparently had the following children, two of whom could have furthered the mtDNA line.






Along Hannah Thompson's Line




Sarah Utter (b.1730), daughter of Lydia Russell (b. 1692) and Abraham Utter (b. 1688)

There is conflicting information about the fate of Sarah. She may have died within a year of birth or she may have married Phillip Knight of Rhode Island, where she died in 1759, after having two daughters – Phebe (b. 1756) and Sarah (b. 1757). Requires more careful research to get a better idea of the truth.



Abigail Hodges (b. 1731), daughter of Abigail Russell (b. 1701) and Abraham Hodges (b. 1697)

I have found nothing other than a birth record, so she warrants more research.




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First Daughter of Sarah Shepard Chidsey (b.1728), Hannah Chidsey (b. 1747)

I have been unable to trace much information for this individual. There is a reference to Dodd's East Haven (register?) to indicate a death in 1840! More work is needed here to get a clear picture, if possible.

Sarah Chidsey (b. 1758), daughter of Sarah Shepard (b. 1728) and John Chidsey (b. 1720)

Sarah appears to have been married to Richard Barrett in East haven, CT, on 1/13/1780. However, it is not clear whether they had children. In fact it is not at all clear that this is a correct association. More investigation is required.



Rhoda Chidsey (b. 1764), daughter of Sarah Shepard (b. 1728) and John Chidsey (b. 1720)

Rhoda may have married William Seymour and ended up in Delaware Co., NY. If so, she had daughters. However, all that is available online that I can find appears to be hearsay. More work is needed here.

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Mary Shepard's Identity(ies)

I am afraid that there is confusion in the ranks over two families - one headed by Mary Shepard and David Grannis, offspring of Russell and Lydia (Forbes) Grannis and Thomas and Sarah (Hotchkiss) Shepard. The children of this marriage are often listed with the sames names as the one from the other marriage - that being between Sarah Russell (daughter of John and Sarah (Russell) Shepard) and the same David Grannis.

The issue of the two Mary's needs to be resolved before anything can be confidently concluded about marriages and offspring.



Esther Palmer (b. 1751), daughter of Lydia Barker Palmer (b. 1712)

I have been unable to locate any information other a birth record for this individual, who was born in Branford, CT.



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Along Rebecca Thompson's Line

Elizabeth / Betsy Booth b. 1753

Daughter Esther had just a daughter, Elizabeth – born in Fairfield Co., CT. However there is confusion in the compiled records about another daughter named Betsy, who might actually be Elizabeth. If they are the same person, she likely married Hezekiah Sanford (?-1834?) and eventually died in Hartford Co., CT.

Sarah Gilbert (1758-?)

It seems clear that Sarah was a daughter of Eunice Todd and John Gilbert. However, I can find no clear evidence of her marriage or death. She would be easily confused with Sarah Gilbert (b. 9/9/1758) to Hezekiah Gilbert and his with Tameson Gregory in Fairfield Co., CT. More research could be done on this.

Her birth family in fact is somewhat uncertain because of research confusion. There is some confusion that may stem from the existence of two John Gilberts and/or two wives (Eunice Todd versus Lydia Ives). I was not able to sort out the conflicting views of history.

Mary Peck b. 1758 d. ?

I can find no clear records for Mary other than the record of her birth in New Haven Co., CT. More research is needed.

Pamela Peck b. 1761 d.?

I can find no clear records for Pamela. Just one pedigree submission mentions her. - "Pedigree Resource File," database, *FamilySearch* (https://familysearch.org/ark:/61903/2:2:SBQK-7FM: accessed 15 February 2019), entry for Pamela /Peck/; file (2:2:2:MM7Y-Z63), submitted 14 May 2011 by shalom [identity withheld for privacy].

Mary Dinah Peck b. 1767

I can find no clear records for this Mary other than the record of her birth, which shows her name as Mary Dinah. More research is needed.

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Along Mary Thompson's Line

Elizabeth Stone b. 1735 d.?

I can find no record of what might have happened to Elizabeth. This is a line that could be investigated further.

Mary (1757? -?), the Daughter of Ruth Alling Hine b. 1738 d. 1777

Daughter Ruth married Daniel Hine (1734-1798). Their daughters were Mary (1757-?), Kezia (1759-?), Rebecca (1760-?), Eunice (1760-?), Elizabeth (1765-?), and Hannah (1767-?). The history of this family seems a little confusing and poorly defined. The daughters warrant more research.

I have not found more data about Mary Hine (b. 1757). She deserves more research.

It appears that Kezia Hine married Timothy Goodrich (1756-1829). They ended up in VT.

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Eunice Hine (b. 1760) seems to have married Jonathan Orms. They lived in Rutland Co.,VT, and had a large family.

Elizabeth Hine likely was not married and died in VT. See info about her sister Rebecca above.

Eunice Johnson (Sperry?) b. 1703 d. 1725

Eunice died quite early in life (age 22). Only one source indicates that she may have married Asa Sperry, but I can find no confirmation of this. For now, I assume that Eunice died "without issue." However, this could be investigated. There may be another mtDNA line here.

Rebecca Painter (Sherman?) b. 1744 d. 1788

I have seen in ancestry.com that there is suspicion that Rebecca married John Sherman (1734-1803). The evidence does appear to be strong, but if it is correct, they had just one child – Nathan Sherman (1767-1857). See https://www.ancestry.com/family-tree/person/tree/151746240/person/342011163400/facts? phsrc=VqT14& phstart=successSource. This is the only hint that I have had about Rebecca's life. Given the lack of certainty, more research me be worthwhile.

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Amy Smith b. 1709 d.?

It is clear that Amy was born 3/10/1709 in New Haven to Samuel Smith and Mary Cooper Smith. There is speculation that she died in 1709, or before 1715, or Her actual fate is unknown based on the evidence that I have seen. More work might be useful here.

Mary Smith (Thompson?) b. 1737 d. 1773

There is speculation that Mary married Joel David Thompson (1737-1804). If that is the case, then there are a number of daughters to consider. This is VERY tentative, however.
