Introduction

I am a great grandson of Agnes Moodie, about whom I have done some genealogical research. The purpose of the research has been to identify her Scottish ancestors. Recently I discovered a marriage record for her father, James Moodie. From this record I am attempting to build a coherent story of his life and thus the family into which Agnes was born. Here is the record.

Here is a transcription of the record from the Registrar General of Scotland form. It describes the marriage of James to Jemima Nicol.

James Shiel, Registrar

It reveals that James was a journeyman millwright, similar to his father, Thomas, who was a master millwright. Both were employed in jobs associated with the industrial revolution in Scotland. His mother was Elizabeth Litster.

Following is a mostly sequential rendering of James' life and what events I have found that led up to the birth of Agnes, his last child. At the end of this story, there is a short dive into possible deeper Moodie origins. <u>I don't claim that this work is definitive, more research may change how people are linked in the early 19th century.</u>

Birth of James Moodie in 1817 at Lilliesleaf, Roxburghshire

James was born to Thomas Moodie (b.1790-10-26) and Elizabeth Litster/Lister (b.1793-10-03). The birth took place in Lilliesleaf, Roxburghshire. Thomas and Elizabeth had been married in the previous year near Edinburgh.

Some sources claim that Thomas died in 1824 in India. This is not crazy when you investigate his ancestors a little more. I have not gone far in this direction, but you can see some hints in the very last chapter (page 32) of this document.

He was likely the first child. Here is a family group report for his birth family, to the extent that I understand it.

I will also mention here that there may be another child that should be considered for this family. His name is William Moodie, born in 1828 (?). I am not, however, certain and so will leave this to be researched further. He appears in the 1841 census, which indicates that he was born in Roxburghshire. See the next and last sections.

1841 Scottish Census – Lilliesleaf, Roxburghshire

James' birth family may be shown in the image here from the 1841 census.

If this is indeed James' birth family, then his mother (Elizabeth) may have died and Thomas may have remarried. (I have never found a death record for Elizabeth (Litster) Moodie, his mother.)

If this is a new family for Thomas, probably the very young children are its product, and the older child is a vestige of the original birth family of James. Perhaps, then, William is James' younger brother. (This may become important later.)

Here is a record of Thomas Moodie marrying Agnes Burn(s) 8/5/1831. This lends credence to the theory that William may be from an earlier marriage of Thomas to Elizabeth Litster. It would also explain the other two Burn(s) people residing with the family. Here's the marriage record for Thomas and Agnes. Note the location (Lilliesleaf, Rozburghshire).

Whatever the case, James is not present with this family in 1841. He would be about 24 at this time, so that is not surprising. I have not been able to find him unequivocally at this time in the 1841 census elsewhere. The correct "take away" from the 1841 census is that there is a lack of clarity. I present the information here just to indicate the lack of clarity and the need for more research.

1851 Scottish Census – Edinburgh St. Cuthberts, Midlothian

Here is a record that shows a person that I believe is the correct James.

He is a boarder, working as an engineer in Edinburgh.

And, note that one of his fellow boarders is shown as George Falconar, a name that is quite similar to Falconer, the surname for his wife to be (Margaret). (See next section.)

Perhaps James met his wife to be through association with George Falconer, who presumably was somehow related to Margaret.

By the way, at this time there is a Margaret Falconer of approximately the right age, living in the same parish, to the NW of the address shown here.

Marriage on 8/29/1851 at South Leith, Midlothian

I believe that this record shows the marriage of James to Margaret Falconer. This record is the best clue that I have found about Margaret's father. The location of South Leith is just to the north of the oldest part of Edinburgh.

Margaret Falconer b. 1823-4

Margaret was possibly born about 1823-4 in a place named East Calder, Midlothian. (Location based on 1861 census. Date based on this same census and the death record that follows.) There is such a place just to the west of Edinburgh. Her father's name was James. His mother's name was Janet. She may have had a relative named George B. Falconer.

By the way, the Falconer name is very common in Midlothian at this time, so sorting out who is who would be quite a job based on the on-line records that I have found.

A record of her death in 1862 follows. Denholm happens to be the location of the household of Thomas Moodie that we saw earlier in the 1841 Scottish Census.

This record indicates that she was born about 1823-4 to James Falconer (a schoemaker) and Janet, his wife, whose surname was not recorded. She died of consumption in Denholm, Roxburghshire. The registrar was George Moodie (a relative of James?). The record also confirms that James Moodie was a millwright.

One final note – in looking for a birth record, I found the following intriguing one. The date is believable, and the names are reasonable. The location is quite far north, however.

If it is correct, then she had siblings named George (!) b.12/3/1815 and William b.2/24/1821.

More research is needed

1861 Scottish Census at Edinburgh St. Cuthberts, Midlothian

I believe that this record shows the family in 1861. The location is just south of the oldest part of Edinburgh.

Every thing makes sense about this except that Janet Moodie appears as a child of age 15. The key thing is that her birth precedes the marriage of Margaret and James in 1851. She could have been born "illegitimately" in 1846. However, another possibility is that she is the adopted daughter of a relative.

I have found a possible birth to William Moodie and Jane Lidell/Liddle that might fit. Perhaps this William Moodie is the William that appears in Thomas' house in 1841. It is also possible that Janet was actually born into a Falconer family.

All this is speculation, however, and warrants more research.

Summary of Children of Margaret Falconer and James Moodie

Janet b. 1846

I have found no clear record of her birth, which is expected to be about 1846. She just appears in census listings. She may in fact not be a biological daughter of James and Margaret.

Thomas b. 1852

Here is a record of Thomas' birth.

The cause of death was dropsy (edema) for a reason that I could not decipher. He must have been buried in Rosebank Cemetery. The family had apparently been in the South Leith area for about 1.5 years.

William b. 1862

There is indirect evidence that William was born in Roxburghshire. Here is a record of a marriage of a daughter (Marie Etta) that indicates William's birth location. I have never found the place named Hanrick. Perhaps it was meant to be Hawick, and there was a transcription error.

More follows.

The 1871 Scottish Census (at right) shows William's birth place at Teviothead. Teviothead is a real place, so I am inclined to accept this location, which is very close to Hawick in Roxburghshire. In fact the address given here for his residence is on the SW side of Hawick, north of the Teviot River.

I believe that William was actually Margaret's son. There are two reasons why I believe this. First, his birth date is a few months prior to the death of Margaret. Secondly, the amount of matching DNA shown for his descendants and my mother at ancestry.com is consistent with him being a half sibling to Agnes and Elizabeth, who are clearly daughters of Jemima.

It seems certain that the only mother figure that William could have remembered was Jemima. It should not be surprising that later in life he reported here are his mother rather than Margaret.

One unanswered question then centers on why the Moodie/Falconer family moved from the Edinburgh area to the Hawick area. It appears that sometime after the 1861 census the family must have moved.

The death of Margaret in the latter part of 1862 in Denholm does fit with this move.

It is not clear what drew the family back towards the Moodie relatives in Roxburghshire, and we may never know the reason.

Marriage on 12/7/1866 at Wilton, Roxburghshire to Jemima Nicol

In the winter of 1861-62 the James Moodie family is with out a mother and living in the Hawick area of Roxburghshire. Ages of the household members would be roughly as follows.

- James: 45
- Janet: 16
- James: 7
- William: infant < 1

So that probably leaves James with three children to support alone. Probably he would have sought help in the form of a female "servant" so that he could earn a living. Jemima Nicol could have been that person. And that bring us back to the marriage record of James to Jemima Nicol that was mentioned at the beginning of this document. -

Jemima is present, but Janet and James are not. Presumably they are housed elsewhere. This is another bit of research that could be done to confirm this speculation.

We do see that William is still present, and that there is a new child – Elizabeth.

So, who was Jemima? Fortunately there is more information in this regard.

I believe that Jemima was born 4/7/1836 to James Nicol (b. 1790) and Elizabeth Cavers (b. 1794 d. 1881). She was the last (11th!) child in a very large family. The family appears to have been from the Roberton, Selkirk area. I believe that this is a village just to the west of Hawick. (Selkirk is to the north of Hawick.) Here is a listing showing her family.




Note that the location for the family is the same as shown in the 1861 census. That is, Doorpool Cottage in Cavers. (A "Doorpool Farmhouse" appears in current maps of the Cavers area, but it is not certain that this is the same location.)

Immigration of Moodie Family Members to the USA in 1882

From what I can tell, the remains of the James Moodie family of Roxburghshire (his second family) left Scotland for the USA in 1882. I believe that William made the trip first and was then followed by Elizabeth, Agnes, and probably Jemima. (I can find no death record in Scotland for Jemima.)

Here is transport information for the three ladies. Note that the person most likely to be Jemima is recorded as Agnes, age 42. My guess is that this is really Jemima.



Since I can find no records for Jemima in the USA, I assume that she died after arrival. Perhaps she has an unrecorded death in southern WI, where her daughters and their half brother William settled.

Here is immigration information for William. Note the date. It is almost exactly 4 months prior to the arrival of his sisters and stepmother.

Immigration of Another Descendant of James Moodie to the USA

Recent DNA testing has helped reveal that there is another line of James Moodie descendants in the USA. I have had the pleasure of communicating with contemporary descendants from this line.

As mentioned above, our James Moodie (b.1817) had a son named James (b.1855) with his first wife Margaret in the vicinity of Edinburgh.

This son married a lady named Mary Pierson/Pearson (b. ~1857) according to trees on ancestry.com. They in turn had a son named Joseph (b. 1884 in Hawick). [Note the same location and and time frame as the second family of James b.1817!]

Joseph immigrated to the USA on 3/24/1904 on the ship named the Majestic with a number of other folks from the Roxburghshire area. (This is nearly 20 years after William, Agnes, and Elizabeth – his uncle and aunts made the trip.) Joseph made his way to Idaho.

I wonder if Joseph and Agnes ever knew of the presence of the other in the USA? James Moodie (b.1817) certainly never imagined that, nearly two hundred years after his death, a DNA technology would make it possible for his descendants to discover each other!



Here is a record of the family into which Thomas was born in 1790. This is from an old Parish register in Lilliesleaf. I feel pretty sure that this is the family of "our" Thomas. The timing and location seem right.

It shows that Thomas' father was James Moodie and that there were three siblings: Robert b.1789, Thomas b. 1790, and James b.1800. (Oh, how I wish that there was more variety in given names!)

The most likely supporting marriage record is the one that follows showing a marriage between James Moodie and Jean Richardson in Ancrum, Roxburghshire. (This is the town where James died of "brain softening.")

So, assuming that this is the right marriage, we know who the parents of Thomas and his brothers, Robert and James. And, in support of this, I have found a distant DNA match on ancestry.com who traces his line back to the next generation back from James and Jean. The DNA match is associated with Nelson Moodie, Jr., and we share just 10 cM of DNA, which is reasonable given the distance back to a common ancestor.





Melsetter Estate and Another Thomas Moodie

As a part of my foray into understanding Thomas Moodie, James' father, I have turned up some colorful history that you might want to investigate in more detail. I will just outline it here until I (or someone else) can confirm it. I am not at all convinced that the families described below are related to my/our Moodie families. <u>Connections to our Moodie line are not proven!</u>

First, it appears that there was a Thomas Moodie of about the right age as our Thomas that may have been in the military, and may have died in India. This Thomas was perhaps a member of a large family headed by a Major James Moodie, whose likenesses are presented below. (See https://www.ancestry.com/family-tree/person/tree/78644683/person/410097253721/gallery .) If so, this Thomas' mother was named Elizabeth Dunbar, and she and Major James were married in Caithness (also mentioned above in the context of Margaret Falconer). <u>Again, I do NOT think that this is </u>"our" Thomas since the information does not sync with the family information of James Moodie as recorded in the Parish Register in Lilliesleaf and shown in the section immediately above. The simplest explanation is that the ancestry.com tree is wrong and that there were multiple James/Thomas Moodie people in Scotland at the same time. (Not so far fetched.)

This "ancestry" Major James Moodie is identified as the Ninth Laird of Melsetter House, an historic place in the Orkneys. Here he is in uniform.





Here he is later in life.

And the same ancestry.com reference provides the following text.


"the Ninth Laird

In 1769 Major James Moodie became ninth Laird of Melsetter and inherited Breckness, Snelsetter Castle and Melsetter. He married Elizabeth Dunbar and had 6 children (Henrietta, Janet, Thomas, Benjamin, Donald and John; and there is mention of another son, James, who was possibly illegitimate, born to an Elizabeth Taylor). The Moodies were an ancient family and could claim to be able to trace their descent directly from Robert the Bruce. The first written record of the family seems to date from about 1470, when William Mudie appears in a list of Scottish bishops as Bishop of Caithness. The nonconjectural pedigree of the Moodies (or Mudie, as it was in the fifteenth century) starts with another William, the first Laird of Melsetter, who was a man of some importance, being, among other things, Chamberlain in Orkney to Mary Queen of Scots. His lands were listed and confirmed by King James VI in 1591. At that time he disposed of his properties on the mainland of Scotland to consolidate his position in Orkney.

In 1818, Major James Moodie was forced to sell the estate which had been in his family for more than 500 years, despite his strenuous efforts to save it. James Moodie died heartbroken and is buried in the Canongate Parish Churchyard in Edinburgh. The breaking up of the Melsetter estate gave rise to an acrimonious and extended legal battle involving, among others, Lord Dundas, and was never settled to the satisfaction of the Moodies. Although the connection between the Moodies and Melsetter in Orkney was irrevocably severed by the sale of the estate in 1818, another Melsetter connection was created years later in another continent. Just before the sale of the estate, the son Benjamin and others had emigrated to Africa and within a few years the Moodies had become one of those pioneering families whose story is interwoven with the history of Southern Africa in the nineteenth century. One of the family, Thomas, led a trek to Gazaland, in what was then Rhodesia, and founded the town of Melsetter at an altitude of 1586 m in the Chimanimani Mountains."

I think that many folks have researched this line, so I'm sure that if you have an interest you can reach out and find more. For example <u>https://themoodies.co.za/home</u> . BTW, the guy in the picture at right (from this web site) is not me, but we could be brothers. The shirt says "I can't keep calm I'm a Moodie." What can I say!





According to this site, the Ninth Laird came up with this coat of arms. Meaningless symbolism today, but the only such thing that I have found while doing my genealogy.

Maybe someday we will determine if we are related to the Melsetter Moodies somewhere back in time.
