## A Minnehaha County Cemetery Marker

Sometimes resolution of one mystery generates another. This is the story of the mystery of a burial location that is replaced by one about relationships. Seen another way, it is a brief account of the apparently difficult life of a second great grandmother of mine.

The main player in this story is Rhoda Satina Bates, and the initial mystery was the exact location of her burial. Satina, as she is frequently referred to, started life in eastern Pennsylvania in 1827. She moved to northern Illinois in 1840 with her parents and two younger brothers. Satina's father worked as a cobbler, and one of her brothers bought land to establish a farm in 1857. This farm remained with Bates families for over 100 years. In 1849 Satina married Jerome B. Tupper in Winnebago County, IL. She and Jerome had one child (a girl) there and four additional ones (three girls and one boy) in Wisconsin to which they moved some time after the 1850 Federal census. In 1860, Jerome is listed as a mason in Elkhart<sup>iii</sup>, but in 1861 he entered the 4<sup>th</sup> WI Cavalry. Due to a disability, he left the Union Army in about 1862<sup>iv</sup>, and by 1870 his family is shown to have moved to Grant County, WI. It is not clear where Satina and the children are during the period from 1860 – 1870. In the 1880s, the family was fragmenting/dispersing. Jerome is living alone in a home in Big Patch, WI, near Platteville in 1885. Satina and her youngest daughter named Ada are in Osage, IA, with/near another now married daughter (Clara) in 1880. The two remaining daughters (Mary and Ellen) and son (Charles/Clarence) have also married by the end of 1886 hen Jerome is clearly in a Soldiers' Home. The details of the process of everyone going their own way are not clear. That they did is clear.

Daughter Ada did not remain single for long as she married in 1887.<sup>x</sup> She next can be found in Minnehaha County, SD, in the last month of 1889, where she gives birth to a daughter.<sup>xi</sup> Satina dies and is buried in Bethel Cemetery<sup>xii</sup> in Minnehaha County early in the following month.<sup>xiii</sup> So, it seems that Satina has followed her youngest daughter's family to South Dakota. For what it is worth, by 1895, Ada and her family are back in IA (Cerro Gordo County).<sup>xiv</sup>

Discovery of Satina's burial place was facilitated by the Sioux Valley Genealogical Society, which supplied documentation on Bethel County Cemetery that indicated when and where R. S. Topper (sic) died and was buried. Her death apparently occurred at the farm/house of "Len Eldredge." This information comes from "Grave Records of Minnehaha County Cemeteries" and the WPA Graves Registration Project, both of which post-date Satina's death by a significant amount of time.<sup>xv</sup> This information resolved the mystery of her death and burial, but it also opened a new mystery. – Why was she at the Eldredge residence? Did Satina, Ada, or Ada's husband (Harry Williams) know the Eldredge family?


To try to resolve this mystery, I researched the Eldredge/Eldridge families in the Minnehaha County area and found one Julius C. Eldredge, who owned a farm near Bethel Cemetery<sup>xvi</sup> and who had a son named Lynn who took over the farm after Julius moved to Sioux Falls in the 1890s.<sup>xvii</sup> My suspicion is that the Len Eldredge associated with the burial information is actually Lynn Eldredge. Working on that assumption, what might be the relationship between the Eldredge family and Satina (or her daughter's family)? Trying to answer that question has led me to investigate the Eldredge family(ies) and that of Ada's husband.

## A Minnehaha County Cemetery Marker

Although the Julius C. Eldredge family can be traced to Rock County, WI, prior to homesteading in Minnehaha County, SD, I can not establish a link between the Tupper family in Walworth and Grant Counties and the Eldredge family in Rock County. Rock and Walworth Counties share a border, but the distance between the two households was about about 50 miles. Since Julius Eldredge and Jerome Tupper both served in the Union Army (in different regiments), perhaps their families could have become acquainted through pre-war or post-war events.

Another possibility comes from the family of Harry Williams, Ada's husband.\*\* This is an immigrant family from England that settled originally in Grant County, WI. Try as I might, I have not been able to establish a link between Harry Williams and his (large) family and the Eldredges. I have found that Harry's sister, Laura, married and lived in Edmunds County, SD, at the time of Satina's death.\*\* Minnehaha and Edmunds Counties are not close, so it does not seem likely that Ada and her family were in SD to visit her husband's sister. Consequently, the reason for Satina and Ada's presence in Minnehaha County, SD, in the winter of 1889-1890 is a mystery.

In the fall of 2024, since Satina's grave was unmarked, I was able to place a marker on her gave in Bethel Cemetery. XXIII One mystery laid to rest, but another revealed!
