Introduction

The purpose of this document is to be a repository of historical information pertaining to Sam Loy and his wife Anna Allen, although there is some information about Sam's first wife, Margaret Rower. I am doing this as a part of collecting genealogical information on all my ancestors. One of my grandmothers was Marian Loy, who is a daughter of Sam and Anna. I hope that this provides a coherent description of their lives as well as hints about their descendants and ancestors.

In 1997 John Allen compiled a very nice book describing the descendants of Lucia Elila Robbins and James Henry Allen. The book is titled *A Treasure, The Family of James Henry Allen, 1802-1997*, not copyrighted. I have drawn from it in many places to fill in details that he was able to assemble. Here is the introduction to his book.

A TREASURE THE FAMILY OF JAMES HENRY ALLEN INTRODUCTION

I retired in 1987, after 36 years of the practice of rural family medicine. In 1989 my wife and I took a fishing trip to South Dakota. On the way home it occurred to me that I had a cousin, Vera Alexander, living in Mound City, only a few miles from where we were fishing. I tried to call her but no answer. The time was short and we had to leave the next day. A friendly telephone operator called the Red Cross representative in Mound City who found that Vera was attending a baseball game in nearby Pollock. A messenger was sent, she called back, and the project was begun. Vera was living next door to the old family home and had collected a number of names and addresses of various relatives who had stopped over the years. She also had many wonderful old photos which are included in this book.

The reason for our research is that we had completely lost touch with all Allen relatives except Vera, Stella and Vincent Alexander. The understanding of our identity was incomplete. We needed to know who we were.

The material found in this book has been collected over the past seven years. Most of the older material had been saved by Lillian Allen. Marian Snorteland had filled in the master genealogy sheet. Information about the Canadian and Pennsylvania branches was obtained from other family members and from addresses left in South Dakota. Long distance information service has helped out several times. The reader is advised that the status and addresses of family members change often. Therefore, please bear with this and forgive when status and locations mentioned in the book are not accurate or are out of date.

This book contains the stories of the descendants of James Henry Allen and Lucia Elila Robbins and includes every member of each family, except for the few we were unable to locate. It is not a book of genealogy tables and charts - although genealogists should find much data. It is a book about life with its struggles, failures, achievements and successes.

Why write a book? Why not just gather information and be a resource person for others seeking information? I admit that I did consider that possibility. However, as I located and conversed with so many wonderful people, I realized that our family represents a great treasure. A source of rich and meaningful relationships. Many have suffered pain and hardship. Some are still struggling. Each of their stories has something to teach us. Each one has something to share. The earnest seeker will find something here with which he or she can identify. Many are linked by a common faith, and share that certainty that we will have an eternity of fellowship together.

But, we are all linked by ties of blood. Let each of us make an effort to know and appreciate one another during this lifetime. - by John Allen



Revision History

2016: The original draft of this document was created in the spring/summer of 2016.

2020, early September: After nearly 4 years of off and on research, I am finally updating this document to reflect my current best estimates of the history of Sam and Anna (Allen) Loy and their ancestors. You will find updates throughout this revision relating mainly to Sam Loy and his life with Anna Allen.

2020, late September: Holds updates to information about Anna Allen and her ancestors.

2020, October, 7: Updates based on analysis of Goberichen Ortssippenbuch. The fan chart and the ahnentafel report that show him ancestors is changed accordingly.



Historical Background

The information that follows focuses on a period of time during which Anna and Sam lived – roughly the period from 1860-1940. There is some information about their ancestors as well as their children, so the outer boundaries of the information extend back to the 17th century and forward to the 21st century.

To put Sam and his ancestors in historical context requires consideration of the political and economic instabilities of Baden in the 19th century as well as the gradual expansion of non-native populations from east to west in the US. It may be that Sam's father, Johann Georg Lay came to the US. partly because of the outcome of the 1848 Revolution in what was to become Germany. (It appears that Johann Georg came to Ohio in the early 1850s.) When Sam was a fairly young man, much of the Dakota Territory was opened to homesteading, and that must have lured him to move from Ohio. It appears that he moved alone.

Much of Anna's ancestral story is available farther into the past. It appears that her ancestors were in the American Colonies (primarily Connecticut) in the mid 1600s. This was a time when Puritans were moving from England to the colonies.

Anna's ancestors moved from CT into NY and Pennsylvania as lands were becoming available there in the late 1700s and early 1800s. This means that some ancestors participated in the American Revolution. In fact, I remember that when I was young my mother mentioned the possibility that we were somehow related to Ethan Allen. She even provided me with books about his exploits with the Green Mountain Boys. This connection has never been proven, but it is interesting that the names Allen and Warner figure prominently in Anna's ancestry. (One of one of Ethan Allen's close compatriots was named Seth Warner.)

In any event, once again, land availability in Dakota Territory eventually drew Anna's family further west from Pennsylvania later in the 1800s. This means that some ancestors could have participated in the Civil War prior to moving West.

In summary, the availability of land from the Louisiana Purchase, the 1848 German Revolution, and the expansion of colonial settlers to the West form the historical backdrop of the specific events in the lives of Anna Allen and Sam Loy and their ancestors.

Sam Loy

Here are some pictures of Sam taken at various places in South Dakota. The first is taken with his wife, Anna, and their family circa 1911. From right to left are Marian, Ruth, Anna, Howard, Sam, Ralph, and Guy.



This was likely taken later, with an annotation added by his daughter, Marian. There seems to be a "thing" about standing with hands on hips.



This one may have been taken later than the previous picture – in the vicinity of Lemmon, SD. Sam is second from the left. Anna is at the far left.





Here is a picture of Sam, seated. The person standing is one of his sons (Guy). The date, 1917, is about three years before Sam's death, and the location is probably the farm in Adams Co., ND.





Birth

I am assuming the date of 1/6/1859. This date contradicts his headstone, but it is consistent with most census records.

One further consideration is that, were the 1849 date correct, Sam's birth would have taken place in Baden, and his mother would have been Sophia Kälber, not Susannah Snyder. I have found no baptismal records from Baden that would support the 1849 date. And, DNA evidence is consistent with the fact that his mother was Susannah Snyder.

Regarding his birth place, I take it to be Prospect Township, Marion County, Ohio, based on the family location in the 1860 Federal Census. Sam was the son of Johann Georg Lay (John Lay) of Baden and Susannah Snyder of Pennsylvania. See an appendix entry (page 64) showing the 1860 Federal Census.



First Marriage (to Margaret Rower)

Summary

In the information that follows, you will see evidence that Sam's family migrated from Marion County, OH, to the vicinity of Van Wert County, OH. Marion Co. was an area that was populated by a number of people with Germanic roots. Descendants of his father's first wife, Sophia Kälber, and her first husband (Jakob Heidegger) also settled nearby. Their anglicized surname became Hydaker.

I believe that I have found that Sam encountered a lady named Margaret Rower, originally from Putnam County, OH, who he married. Here is a copy of the record of the marriage of Sam Loy to Margaret Rower in 1882, when Sam was about 23 years old and Margaret was about 21. The location of the wedding is Allen County, which is just to the east of Van Wert County. Margaret's family was from Putnam County, OH, which shares borders with Van Wert and Allen Counties.

About a year later (in about June, 1883) Margaret and Sam had a son, named William H. Loy. I have been unable to find detailed information about what might have happened to Sam, Margaret, and their infant son during the mid-1880s. However, there are indications that William was raised partly by his Rower grandparents in Putnam County. At least he shows up there in the 1900 census. So, it seems that Sam and Margaret were divorced after William's birth.

Margaret remarries in 1891 to a neighbor named Samuel Clevenger. They ended up near Auburn, IN, which is where her son William operated a furniture store and undertaking business. His business was in fact the one that handled funerals for both Margaret and her second husband. Margaret was just one of her siblings that

married a Clevenger from a neighboring household of Clevengers.

William married Lillie M. Goll on 12/17/1903 in Paulding, OH, and they had daughters Mildred F. and Lola L. Lillie assisted in the undertaking business. In fact she was the undertaker that took care of her husband's body when he died. Mildred married John Manfroy and Lola married Harold Wiedenhoeft. William died in Indiana in 1963.

Note that this is the best guess that I can make at the time regarding Sam's first marriage. It would be useful to have some corroboration, however. To that end, I have tried to contact living descendants of William Loy, the local genealogical society in Auburn, IN, and existing funeral homes in Auburn, IN. So far I have only found dead ends and or silence. So, in the absence of negative evidence, I am sticking with the strong suspicion that Sam was married to Margaret Rower and that they had a son named William.

In any event, Sam went on to South Dakota, where he married Anna Allen. The 1905 South Dakota Census indicates that he had been in SD for 18 years, so Sam may have moved to SD in 1887. The first evidence of his presence there is a land patent that he was granted in 1893. This is consistent with the information above.



Relocating to South Dakota

Some time after the marriage to Margaret ended, Sam relocated to South Dakota. The 1905 South Dakota census indicates that he had been in the state for 18 years, which means an arrival in 1887. Because the Federal Census of 1890 has been largely destroyed, we may never know about Sam's activities between 1887 and 1893. It appears, however, that he arrived in Campbell County, SD, in 1886 or 1887 and applied for a homestead patent that he proved up on in 1893.

Sam proved up on a patent on land southwest of Mound City in 1893 as indicated below. [Another other Sam Loy (in Faulk County) is an unrelated person as far as I have been able to tell.] The 1893 date in this document is consistent with Sam's arrival in SD in 1886-7.

The associated Find-a-Grave memorial (95504249) provides this information. Given his most probable date of birth (1859), I think it is unlikely that Sam was a Civil War veteran. The wrong date of death is repeated here as well.

Anna Louella Allen

Anna was the youngest of ten children born to James Henry Allen and Lucia Elila Robbins. She was born in Crawford Co., Pennsylvania, on 2/4/1879 according to John Allen's book. See the excerpt in a subsequent section.

Her parents' lines can both be traced back to colonial Connecticut. Her first maternal line ancestors in North America came as a part of the Great Migration around 1640. After the US gained independence, descendants of these migrants started moving generally westward – through New York and then to Pennsylvania where chance brought her parents, Lucia and James together.

By all accounts, including ones from my mother who visited Anna's house, Anna was a pleasant, welcoming person. She must have enjoyed her grandchildren. I think that her obituary that follows below reinforces this.

Birth

I am assuming a date of 2/4/1879 based on the headstone information that follows and the information in John Allen's book. I have not located an actual birth record.

Relocating to South Dakota

John Allen's book indicates that the family move to South Dakota came in about 1885. In 1885 the Dakota Territory was open for homesteading. With the exception of son John, the whole family moved to what is now Campbell County, South Dakota. Cousins Frank and Ira Hatch had discovered the area when they were returning from the "Gold Fields" of Colorado. Mound City was 100 miles from the end of the railroad at Aberdeen. The move to South Dakota and the early years are well described by daughter Anna Loy.

On the following page is an account of their early experiences in what was then Dakota Territory. Read from top left down and then from top right down. I have also written an analysis of BLM land patent information to supplement the information provided in John Allen's book. See the following URL.

James was recognized as a man of wisdom and learning, as he was appointed justice of the peace. His daughter Anna writes that many trials were held in their home. The family settled on a claim southwest of Mound City. Neighbors included

family members Charles and Martha Naomi (Robbins) Stuart, Ed Robbins, and Myron and Mary Allen Kimmy. Life was difficult, but the family persisted.

TERRIBLE STORMS

Anna Allen Loy, who was only six years old when the family moved to Dakota, had vivid memories of those first years. She writes, "In early November a terrible storm came up, and we had to stay two days and a night with Ira Hatch who lived across the road from the school. As soon as the storm cleared Father came after us and carried us over a mile to our home. To this day a blizzard makes me so nervous that I walk the floor." "Later that winter was the famous blizzard of January 12 and 13. We had to open the windows and shovel the snow inside into tubs and onto the floor till father could crawl out and shovel the door clear. The barn was all covered and we had to carry feed and water to the three cows and a horse until March. We had to shovel down to hay stacks and to the log pile which we cut for fuel. As soon as we shoveled out the barn, it would drift in again"

CHASED BY WOLVES

Anna Loy continues with her tale: "I remember in the old days, father had to go to the county seat to file some papers. He had to go on horseback. Since the county seat was at LaGrace, he came home along the Missouri River Road to the Skinner Ranch where

brother Albert worked. He gave Albert an antelope. They were quite easy to catch because of the deep snow. Two men on horseback would drive them into a ravine



where they would get stuck, and the men would cut the throats of as many as they needed. On that occasion Father fastened one on to his saddle and started the 12 mile trip home. The snow was deep and darkness overtook him. Wolves followed him very closely and he killed one or two with a revolver. By the time he approached home they were close enough to count. He got mother to bring the lantern and they put the horse into the barn. That night the wolves continued to circle the house and run over the roof until Mother was near frantic. Father never went out after dark again during that winter as the wolves were starving. They even ate the rabbits we caught in traps."

TRAGEDY

In 1888 tragedy struck. While Mother Lucia was visiting in Pennsylvania, James Henry became acutely ill with influenza and died after only a three day illness. This was such a shock that Lucia took her three youngest children, Frank, Rolland and Anna, back to Pennsylvania where they stayed for several years. Lucia still owned the farm there. She then sold her property and moved back to South Dakota where they stayed until 1901.

EVER ONWARD

In that year (1901) daughter Mary with husband Myron, sons Frank and Rolland, and Lucia moved to Alberta, Canada. The men went first and staked out claims. then went back to pack up their personal possessions. They all made the move by train. Frank married in Alberta, but by 1906 the health of his wife necessitated a move to Oregon. Lucia moved with them and lived with Frank and wife Mabel until her death in 1910 at age 76. During the last few years of her life she was very confused. According to grand-daughter Clara Allen Speerstra she was a very loving and devout woman who demonstrated courage and perseverance in spite of much tragedy and hardship.

> James H. Allen Allen, at his home near Mound City, Campbell County, Dakota died of typhoid pneumonia at age 55 years, 11 months and 25 days. Deceased was born in Brant, Cattaraugus County, N.Y. November 29, 1831 and died November 24, 1888. He moved from his native state to Crawford County Pa. when he was about nineteen, where he lived until Oct., 1885, when he, with his family, except one son, emigrated to Dakota. He died in the absence of his wife who was visiting with friends in Crawford.

June 15, 1941 DEATH SUMMONS MRS. ANNA LOY AT BISMARK SUNDAY

Moved to farm in Adams County North of Lemmon in 1916.

Death claimed Mrs. Anna Loy, widely known resident of Lemmon and the vicinity north of Lemmon, Sunday, June 15, at the Bismark hospital in Bismark, N.D.. Mrs. Loy had been in failing health for about the past five years.

Anna Luella Loy was born February 4, 1879, in Meadville, Pa., and was 62 years of age at the time of her passing. She lived in Meadville until seven years old when she moved with her parents to Campbell county in South Dakota. Here she attended school and grew to young womanhood.

She was united in marriage to Samuel Loy on December 25, 1895, and they established their home in Campbell county. Mr. Loy preceded her in death October 28, 1921.

In 1916 she, with her family, moved to a farm in Adams county, eight miles north of Lemmon, where she lived until 1936 when she moved to her house in North Lemmon, living there until the time of her death. Mrs. Loy made a host of friends and acquaintances during her residence in Lemmon and Adams county, who knew her as a cheerful, kind and loving lady. She was always ready to assist anyone in time of need, and her presence will be greatly missed by all those who had the pleasure of her acquaintance, and who will regret to learn of her death.

Mrs. Loy was a member of the Church of God in Lemmon.

Surviving relatives are two daughters, Mrs. Tom Scoular of Lemmon and Marian E. Bates of Gettysburg, S.D., and two sons, Ralph S. Loy of Mount Vernon, Wash., and Howard A. Loy of Lemmon. She was preceded in death by two sons, Arlo W. Loy, who passed away January 4, 1906, and Guy E. Loy, who succumbed September 2, 1923.

Funeral services will be held at the Church of God in Lemmon today (Thursday) at 2 o'clock with the Rev. D.C. Boatwright and Rev. D.K. Myers officiating. Pall bearers will be: E. Lane, L.R. Dayton, Jos. Wagner, "Dyke" Dyer, Rufus Hulbert and Roy Croninger.

The remains will be laid to rest in Greenhill cemetery.



Sam and Anna - Life Together

Sam and Anna met in Campbell Co., SD. Anna had moved there with her parents from Crawford Co., PA, in about 1885. Sam had moved there in about 1887. Anna was nearly 20 years younger than Sam. They were probably married late in 1895.

They farmed there and raised six children before moving to a farm in ND just NE of Lemmon, SD. This move took place around 1916.

Sam died in 1920 in Bismarck, not too many years after moving to ND.

Anna also died in Bismarck (in 1941), but she apparently had been living still in Adams Co., ND, first at the farm and later in North Lemmon with her sons. She appears in the North Lemmon area in 1930 and 1940 census enumerations. See sections that follow.

Marriage (1895)

John Allen puts the date of their marriage at 1895, but I have found no official record of it. Their first daughter, Ruth Irene was born in October, 1896, so the 1895 date is a reasonable one.



John Allen's Compilation

John Allen has compiled the following information about Anna. Parts of it describe some of what Sam and she experienced together. John's publication is *A Treasure*, *The Family of James Henry Allen*, *1802-1997*. I believe that Sam's age is again misstated by 10 years. Sam was 36 years old in 1895.

ANNA LOUELLA (ALLEN) LOY Born 4 February 1879 in Meadville, Pennsylvania. Died 15 March 1941 in Lemmon, South Dakota.

Anna was the youngest of ten children born to James Henry Allen and Lucia Elila Robbins. When she was only six years old the family moved to Campbell County, Dakota Territory with six of their children. James took up a homestead six miles south and two miles west of Mound City. She wrote of her vivid memories of growing up on the prairie, and how on a gala day each child was given ten cents to spend. She was sure that boys and girls never had as much fun as they had in those days. She also recalled the time when her father, who was a justice of the peace, received a five dollar gold piece for a court fee. Anna begged to be allowed to hold it. She dropped it and it rolled between the floor boards, which had to be taken up to retrieve it. Summers found the younger children herding cattle for neighbors. For 25 cents per head the cattle were cared for from May till October. Since they had to herd their own cattle "the money

was a clear gain." Much of their riding was done on calves or steers.

Only three years after the move, Father James Henry died of influenza while Mother Lucia was visiting in Pennsylvania. This was such a shock to Lucia that she took Frank,



Rolla and Anna, the three youngest, and moved back to their farm in Crawford County, Pennsylvania, where they stayed for several years before returning to South Dakota. When she was 16 years old (1895) she married Sam Loy who was 46 years old at that time. The couple had 6 children, Ruth, Guy, Marian, Ralph, Howard and Arlo. They farmed southwest of Mound City, adjacent to other family members. Because of their operation, which was increasingly directed toward livestock, they needed more land, and in 1916 they moved to a new place, 7 miles north of Lemmon, South Dakota (in North Dakota). Grandson Ralph Scoular describes the operation. They farmed 80 acres and used 1500 acres for grazing livestock. All in all, they operated about 1600 acres. Son Guy did most of the farming as Sam was gone a good deal, buying livestock. Their main source of income was buying and selling horses. They also raised pigs, and cattle which they fattened for slaughter. Anna was a great reader, a lifelong student, a good singer, and played the organ well. She was a fine horseman, an expert with the bull whip, and a crack shot. Sam died in 1920 at age 71. Anna was 41 at that time. She and the children continued to operate the farm for as long as they were able. Anna then moved into Lemmon where she lived for the rest of her life. She died of leukemia, in 1941, at age 62. Anna was a life-long Christian, reared in the Methodist faith. Some time in the early 1930s the Church of God held tent meetings in Lemmon. During those meetings Anna had a life-changing spiritual awakening. Her Christianity became greatly intensified after that experience. Howard, her youngest child, came to the Lord after a near drowning, and was a great joy to his mother.



This map from 1911 shows the quarter section (24) that Sam and Anna farmed as well as the owners around them.

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

Note how close Lemmon, SD, is.



Sam and Anna and family moved to the NW quarter of section 25 of twp 130N rng 92W of the 5th PM. This may have been purchased from Charles N. Cooper, who was granted a homestead in 1910. See the "Locations" section above.

Given the fact that Anna appears in the SD census of 1915, that the whole family appears in ND in the 1920 Federal Census, and that the 1917 map above shows the land in ND as owned by Sam, it seems safe to assume that their move to ND took place in 1916.

Following is a view of the ND property in 2014. It does not appear that any structures that may have been built have survived. It is about 1 mile east and 2 miles north of Lemmon.

RUTH IRENE LOY

Born on 2 October 1896 In Lemmon North Dakota.



Died on 6 November 1958 in Lemmon, South Dakota. Ruth was the first of six children born to <u>Samuel Loy and Anna</u> <u>Louella Allen</u>. She grew up on farms in the Mound City and Lemmon South Dakota areas. Since her father was gone a great deal, she was very active in the

farming operation. She completed her high school education and attended normal school in Aberdeen,

South Dakota where she received a teaching certificate. Ruth was a teacher in rural schools and an accomplished piano player. She often sang in choral groups. In 1918 Ruth married William "Thomas" Scoular. Thomas had homesteaded near Bismark, North Dakota before his marriage. The couple had seven children, Janet, Duane, Ralph, Harold, Betty Jane, Eugene, and Marlene, all born between 1920 and 1936. After their marriage Thomas began a 50 year career of working in a lumber yard. Beginning in 1930, In addition to his lumber yard work, he added one year of ranching and two years as deputy sheriff. In 1932 Ruth developed a large goiter. She was hospitalized for six months during which time she underwent successful surgery to remove it. Ruth developed insulin dependent diabetes mellitus at age 54. She suffered two strokes, dying in 1958 at age 62. Thomas continued to work until his retirement at age 86. He died in 1965.

Ruth is remembered as an extremely hard worker and a very thrifty person. She was a fine gardener, often winning awards. She insisted on keeping two cows. She would rather do chores herself rather than insist that the children do them. She was an excellent cook and housekeeper, was quick to help others and a great worrier. She often fed hungry men (hobos) who came to her door. Thomas is remembered as a man with a strong work ethic which he passed on to his children. The family were Methodists.

Marian is my grandmother. John Allen has the following information about her.

MARIAN EVELYN (LOY) (BATES) SNORTELAND

Born 6 May 1900 in Mound City, South Dakota. Died 30 October 1995 in Selby, South Dakota. Marian was the third of six children born to Samuel Lov and Anna Louella Allen. Sam and Anna lived on a homestead claim south and west of Mound City on the Johnson Road. Except for the period 1920-1928 Marian lived her entire life in South Dakota. She attended rural schools and became determined to further her education. In 1916, against her parents wishes, she boarded the train in nearby Selby, and traveled to Aberdeen, some 100 miles to the east. She walked from the train station to Northern Normal and Industrial College where she announced that she wanted to attend school, and that she needed to find a job to support herself and pay her way. The people at the college gave her some names, and she searched the city until she found an employed widow with six children. She worked in that home for two years while she attended school and received certification to teach in rural schools. She then began teaching in Perkins County where she met Harry Bates, her future

husband. In 1920 Marian and Harry were married. Harry had lost an arm in a farm accident, but was a resourceful person and a hard worker. He worked as a mechanic in Bowman, North Dakota until 1928, when he took up farming in Perkins County, 12 miles south of Hettinger.. By 1940 his handicap required a move to Gettysburg where they operated a service station and motel. Since WWII was in progress, Marian worked in the Red Owl grocery store, and became the manager. The couple had three children, Blanche "Velma," Shirley Mae, and Dennis Alan.

After the death of Harry in 1946, Marian sold the



business, and she and Dennis moved to Spearfish where she attended college for two years, receiving her teaching certification. She then taught in the Mound City, Herried and Lemmon areas. She continued her education by correspondence and other courses, coming within


a few credits of a college degree. In 1956 she married Christ Snorteland. Christ owned a 21,800 acre ranch 6 miles NE of Lodge Pole, South Dakota on the Grand River.

Following her marriage to Christ, Marian continued teaching school at Ralph (Harding County). Christ died in about 1974. After his death she sold the ranch, and moved to Mound City. In the early 1980s she suffered a hip fracture, following which her health gradually declined. She had a heart attack, entered the Herried retirement home, and later transferred to the Good Samaritan Home in Selby. On 11 August 1994, Vincent Alexander and I had a chance to visit her. She was able to walk with a walker and remembered our parents and grandparents.


Marian was a very bright person. She taught in rural schools until she was 69 years old. After her retirement she rented an apartment in Aberdeen for a couple of winters where she did volunteer teaching and remedial work in the elementary schools. She was very interested in history and in education in general which she tried to pass on to her children. She was sociable and liked people. She was a hard worker, loved the out of doors, and enjoyed quilting, gardening and growing flowers in addition to reading and keeping up on current events. She was a Methodist. - *by Ralph Scoular and Velma Rhombs*)



The map that follows shows (with red border) a pretty desolate Castle Butte Township in Perkins County, SD. This is where Marian first taught school and where she must have met Harry Bates and his family. They were actually married in 1921 in Lemmon.



As mentioned In the John Allen document above, Harry took work in Bowman, ND. Their first two children (Velma and Shirley) were born in North Dakota. However, shortly after Shirley's birth in 1928, the family moved to a homestead claim in Castle Butte Township, SD. The map that follows shows where this property was in relation to Harry's mother (the Randall homestead), the city of Lemmon, and the Loy property in North Dakota.





This area was a difficult area in which to make a living, especially during the Great Depression and accompanying drought. However, the family stayed there until some time in 1940, when they took ownership of a Texaco gas station and some "camping cabins" in Gettysburg, SD.

Harry and Marian's son, Dennis, was born while the family was in Perkins Co., SD. Technically, he was born in ND at a facility in Hettinger, ND.

During the period in Gettysburg, Marian worked at the local Red Owl grocery store. Harry became ill in 1946 and died. (He is buried in Potter County.)

As John Allen indicates, Marian pursued her own education as a way to obtain employment as a teacher in order to support herself after Harry died.

She remained in the Dakotas until her death in 1995 in Harried, SD. She is buried near her father, Sam Loy, in the Mound City, SD, cemetery.

Education was important to Marian

Marian Snorteland had a teaching career that lasted more than 35 years and took her to many different areas in South Dakota and North Dakota until her retirement in the early 1970s.

Throughout her life she felt it was very important to continue education and she continued to return to college to take extra courses.

Marian died Monday Oct. 30, 1995 at the Good Samaritan Center in Selby at the age of 95.

She was born May 6, 1900, to Samuel and Anna (Allen) Loy on a farm in Campbell County near Mound City. She grew up in Campbell County and attended school there.

In 1915 the family moved to Lemmon, where she completed her education. She then attended Northerm Normal in Aberdeen where she received her teaching certificate. She returned to the Lemmon area where she taught rural school.

In 1921, Marian and Harry Bates were married and made their home on a farm south of Hettinger, ND. In 1941 they moved to Gettysburg where they ran a motel and service station.

Following the death of her husband in 1946, she returned to college at Black Hills State Teachers College and received her teaching degree. Marian married her second husband, Chris Snorteland, in 1956 in Belle Fourche. Following his death, she moved to Mound City where she lived until she entered the Good Samaritan Center in Herried, later moving to the Good Samaritan Center in Selby.

She enjoyed gardening and growing flowers in addition to her love for reading and keeping up on current events.

She leaves her son, Dennis Bates of Herried; two daughters, Shirley Nelson of Aberdeen and Velma Rhombs of Sarasota, Fla.; five grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

In addition to her two husbands, she was preceded in death by four brothers, a sister and her parents.

Graveside rites for Marian will be tomorrow (Thursday), 2 p.m., at the Mound City Cemetery. The Rev. Merle Hoots will officiate and Larson's Funeral Home of Mobridge is in charge of arrangements.

A prayer service will be held this evening, 7 p.m., with visitation from 6 p.m. at Larson's Funeral Chapel in Herried.

RALPH SAMUEL LOY

Born 8 September 1906 in Selby, South Dakota Died 31 December 1891 in Mt. Vernon, Washington. Ralph was the fifth of six children born to Anna Allen and Sam Loy. He grew up on a farm in the rural Selby - Mound City area. In 1916 the family moved to Lemmon where they were able to buy a larger farm. Since Sam was gone much of the time buying and selling livestock, Ralph was very active in the farming and livestock business. When it was time for Ralph to leave home, he worked at various jobs, and studied refrigeration in Chicago. He also became a pilot and flew planes for several years. In 1931 Ralph married Agnes Thompson, the widow of his brother Guy Loy. Agnes and Guy had one son, Helmer Guy, whom Ralph raised. Ralph and Agnes had two sons, Quentin Lavere and Glen Keith. During World War II the family moved to Mt. Vernon, Washington, and Ralph enlisted in the Seabees where he worked as an electrician and refrigeration specialist. After his discharge he went into the business of commercial refrigeration in Mt.

Vernon. Ralph and his sons built and drove stock racing cars for many years. Agnes was the

Washington State secretary for the racing association for one year. She died in 1985 - a severe blow.



Helmer, Ralph's stepson, died in 1990, and Nonna, Helmer's widow, moved in with Ralph and cared for him until his death. Ralph and Agnes were a delightful couple. They traveled a great deal in a motor home for several years. Agnes had a niece who worked in our office, and we had a fine visit with them once when our parents were here. Ralph and Dad (Claude Allen) were cousins. We had another opportunity to visit Ralph and family in 1990, at his home in Washington, and were overcome by the warm welcome and hospitality they showed. He was very close to his family who gave him much support. Ralph had a coronary artery bypass and aortic valve replacement in 1978. In 1990 he was alert and got around fairly well with a cane, but in November 1991 he suffered a hip fracture complicated by congestive heart failure, pneumonia and shingles. He died on 31 December. He was a Methodist. -by Ralph Loy, Nona Loy, Ralph Scoular and John Allen.

John Allen has the following information about Howard.

HOWARD ALLEN LOY

Born 5 May 1910 in Mound City, South Dakota. Died February 1972 in Sandpoint, Idaho Howard was the youngest of six children born to Anna Allen and Samuel Loy. The family moved to the Lemmon, South Dakota area when he was quite young, and he grew up on the farm there. Howard



was a talented mechanic and welder, and continued in this for the rest of his life, working for the railroad. As the youngest child he was very close to his mother. While he was still single his mother

"met the Lord in a powerful way,"

which transformed her life. Howard had a similar experience and became a great soul winner. He had been an alcoholic whose drunken episodes caused great embarrassment to his mother who was a very devout Christian. Once he and two friends rode donkeys into a tent meeting where they made some sarcastic remarks in loud voices. His mother confronted him with the prophecy that "The Lord will send you a message. He will change you, and you will stop drinking." A short time later he was swimming in the Cedar river when he was caught in a whirlpool and felt himself being sucked down. His mother never hesitated. She leaped into the water fully clothed, swam out and rescued him. She reminded him that "this was God's message for you". He immediately realized the enormity of his sin, repented, stopped his drinking; and shortly thereafter enrolled in a bible college in Minot, North Dakota. He was very active in the Church of God - Cleveland Tennessee, and volunteered part time as a missionary to Native Americans. He was a kind and gentle person, which increased his effectiveness as an evangelist. In 1935 Howard married Ina Peterson, They moved to Sand Point, Idaho where he worked for the railroad. Whenever he visited in South Dakota he made it a point to call on, and minister to, many





Genetics

I know of no one in a direct paternal line to Sam who has done genetic testing. There are people alive who are candidates for this.

Having said that, using autosomal DNA testing of myself and my mother, I have found relatives in the Ohio and Indiana area to confirm that Sam's father was John Loy and his mother was Susanna Snyder. Some of these relatives have done considerable research into other branches of the family tree – branches that emanate from the marriages of John Loy. You may be interested in a book written by a cousin named Winona Garmhuasen, who is from this area. Its title is Coming Together: Portrait of a Family, and it is available from Amazon and Google Books.



Many of the ancestral lines mentioned

in this book can be found in in the analysis that follows.

The DNA testing done to date has confirmed the information that follows.



Sam's Father: Johann Georg Lay

Sam's parents were Johann Georg Lay (a.k.a. John Loy) and Susanna Snyder. Johann emigrated from Baden some time around 1853. This is just after the 1848 Revolution that took place in the confederation of German states. (Germany did not exist as a country at this time.)

In Baden, Johann had married Sophia Kälber, with whom he had three children. These children were named John, Catherine, and Mary. Sophia married Johann after the death of her original husband, Jakob Friedrich Heidegger, with whom she had three children (Sophia, Friedrich, and Wilhelm).

One German birth/baptism document shows that Sophia died in 1853. It may be that she died giving birth to Mary (born in 1853 – in Ohio by records in the U.S.), but there is no proof of this. One genealogy by another Loy descendant indicates that she may have died in transit to the US. The simplest solution to the dilemma is that she and Johann came to the US in 1853 and that Sophia died after giving birth to her daughter, Mary.

At least some of Sophia's Heidegger children by her prior marriage immigrated to the US and ended up residing in roughly the same area of Ohio where John lived. These children can be found in the 1860 census in the homes of other people, not far from where John settled in OH. The Heidegger surname transformed into Hydaker in the U.S. Later in life some of these children can also be found farther west in OH, again not far from John.

In any event, Johann/John probably immigrated to the US in 1853. I believe that he settled in the vicinity of Prospect, OH (now in Marion County, OH). There is also some evidence that John had a cousin named Jakob Lay (1801-1870) that settled in Crawford Co., OH, somewhat earlier. This is borne out by DNA matching evidence.

There is a naturalization record in the Delaware County, Ohio, archives that I believe describes Johann's naturalization in September, 1858. This would be consistent with (1) the changing boundaries between Delaware and Marion counties and (2) the 5 year period required between filing for naturalization and actually becoming naturalized. Assuming this is the right naturalization record, then immigration had to have happened during or before 1853. This could be consistent with records that indicate that her daughter Mary was born in OH in 1853.

My presumption is that John G. Ley is actually Johann Georg Lay in this document.

It is interesting to note that he is in the company of two groups of people – one Irish and the other perhaps from Baden. - I have tried to trace the two people with surnames of Koch in the 1860 Federal Census. If I am correct, Jacob Koch ended up in Sandusky, Ohio, and he was from Baden. William Koch may have ended up in Cincinnati, Ohio, and he was from Hesse. Perhaps Johann knew these two men prior to the naturalization court appearance.

Clearly there is room for clarification of what exactly happened in the period between 1850 and 1855 to the family of Johann and Sophia.



In the vicinity of Prospect Township in Marion/Delaware county, Johann met Susannah Snyder, who he married in about 1857. John and Susanna had three children together: Christina, Samuel (our guy!), and Sarah. At some point (1863, 1864, or 1865?) Susannah may have died or left John. After that the family relocated to Van Wert County, Ohio. It is also likely that Susannah's brother George died in the Civil War during this period.

Susannah seems to have been from a family of German ethnicity that had been in Ohio since the 1830s. They appear to have come from Pennsylvania.

Susannah has disappeared from the scene after roughly 1864 – presumably after the birth of Sarah Loy. However, there is some evidence that John may have married one Mariah Augustine (Augenstein/Eyestone?) in 1863. If this is in fact true, then Sarah may be her daughter rather than Susannah's. Another possibility is that Sarah's birth date is off by one year.

And then the 1870 census finds him together with another women, Catherine Klinger Lout) and her children and his. There are records to indicate that he married Catherine. She shows up a divorced in the 1880 census.

John was buried in 1892 in Delphos, OH.

Without more information, it is hard to say what is fact regarding certain critical parts of John's life. That is, when and under what circumstances did Sophia die, and did John in fact marry Mariah Augustine and Catherine Klinger Lout?

It is also possible that John had another other wife (a cousin) in Baden prior to Sophia. And, if you accept all the evidence about his wives, most of whom died rather early in life, then I wonder if John was very unlucky or a serial killer! Until more evidence is available, I'll go with unlucky.


John's Ancestral Locations

Here is a graphical summary of geographic areas that are likely important to Sam Loy's ancestors. Locations have been separated into those in Baden and those in the US.

The areas around Pforzheim are the ones associated with Johann Georg Lay (Sam's father) and his first wife, Sophia Kaelber. The names Lay, Kaelber/Kälber, and Heydegger/Heidegger still appear in current telephone directors for this area of Germany. In the 1861 map that follows, you will find Pforzheim north of Stuttgart and southeast of Karlsruhe.

The town of Göbrichen (north of Pforzheim) may be the seat of a number of Johann's immediate ancestors. People that are likely John's ancestors can be found in an Ortssippnebuch for Göbrichen. This book also indicates that the Lay family came to Göbrichen from the town of Bodelshausen, farther south in Württemberg during the 17th century.

Here is a map of the area with a "pin" at the location of Göbrichen.





Locations in Ohio and western Indiana are associated with Johann (John) and his family after immigration to the U.S. Sam's first marriage also took place in Ohio.

1857 Map – This map shows Delaware and Marion Counties in Ohio, Of particular interest is the border between the two. This shows it as it was in the early 1850s when it followed an Indian Treaty line from 1795. I believe that Johann settled west of Waldo, near the old treaty line. This is consistent with him having filed naturalization papers in Delaware County in 1858.





Sam's Mother: Susanna Snyder

So far I believe that Sam's father, John, and mother, Susannah, had German roots. John's are clear. Susannah's are inferred from her maiden name and the limited information in the 1850 Federal Census.

Susannah's birth family consisted of the following people based on the 1850 Federal census enumeration.

father: John b.1804 in PA mother: Catherine b.1795 in PA sister: Elizabeth b. 1839 in OH brother: George b. 1837 in OH sister: Martha: b. 1841 in OH

I have found that her sister Elizabeth married Jacob Boyer in 1859. They had a family and lived in Waldo for a while. Jacob was in the Civil War and was likely wounded. Most importantly, I have found descendants of this family with whom my mother shares DNA in an amount that is appropriate. This is a nice confirmation that Susannah was indeed the mother of Sam.

I have never been able to trace Martha. I wonder if she died early.

Likewise, I have never been able to clearly trace George. He was of the correct age to have served in the Civil War, so I wonder if he was killed in the war.

Susannah's background has been difficult for me to track. I believe that I have found her family in Ohio in 1850 and perhaps in 1840. My suspicion is that her family moved to Ohio shortly after her birth in approx. 1832.

1850 Federal Census

Here is the enumeration of Susannah's family. They are in Waldo Township of Marion County, Ohio, in September of 1850. This shows that she and her mother (Catharine) and father (John) were born in Pennsylvania.




1840 Federal Census

Unfortunately the 1840 census only shows the names of heads of households, so I can only guess at which record shows the family in 1840. I believe that the family must have been in Ohio by 1834 since Susanna's sister, Elizabeth, was born there in that year. (Susanna is the only child born in Pennsylvania. In fact a first guess is that her father and mother were married in about 1831 since she was born approximately in 1832.)

So, here's my guess at the right 1840 census record. For this to right, there must have been a male child younger than 5 years old in 1840 that did not survive to see 1850.

John (Johann) married Sophia Kälber near Pforzheim in Baden in 1848. She had been married before and had children (Sophia, Friedrich, and Wilhelm) by the first (deceased) husband, Jakob Heidegger. Following is information about Sophia, her family with her first husband and her family with Johann.

Sam would never have known Sophia since she died in 1853 – six years before Sam was born. He did, however, live with three half siblings (John, Catherine, and Mary) who were Sophia and Johann's children.

Johann, Sophia, children by her prior marriage, and children by their marriage traveled to the US in about 1853. Sophia must have died en-route or shortly after arriving. The children by her first marriage were "farmed out", and Johann went on to live with his children and to eventually marry Susannah Snyder. Together Johann and Susannah had children of their own – one being Sam (my great grandfather).

Sometime in the early 1860s, however, I lose track of Susannah, who may have died or divorced. Johann (now known as John) moves with his children to the vicinity of Allen and Van Wert Counties in OH. Sam eventually left OH, but his brother and sisters stayed, and their descendants have been confirmed via DNA matching.

Here is information about Sam's half-siblings (children of Johann and Sophia).



Mary Loy (b.1853)

There is a child named Mary, born in 1853, who I assume was a child of Johann and Sophia. I have not, however, been able to find a record of her birth in Baden or in the U.S. Some sources indicate that she was the child of Johann and Susanna Snyder, but the sequence of events does not seem to support this.

Mary could have been born in the same year that Sophia died, but she could not have been born after Sohia's death. Perhaps the birth date of 9/26/1853 that appears on the record of Mary (Kopp's) death is right, but another good reference is necessary to confirm this conjecture. It does, however, sync with the 1853 date shown in the 1860 census. It also argues for the her mother having made it to the US, where she presumably dies after Mary's birth.

Here is the record of Mary's death that indicates she is the daughter of Sophia.

SARAH MORGAN

Local Resident Dies Monday Moruing at Home of Mrs. Albert Evans — Services at First Presbyterian Church.

Mrs. Sarah Morgan passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Albert Evans, West Seventh street, at 4:00 a. m. Monday. She had been seriously ill for the past two weeks.

Born in Allen county on February 2, 1864, Sarah Loy was a daughter of John and Sophia Loy. She was united in marriage to Samuel W. Archer, whose death occurred in 1920. One daughter, Mrs. Evans, was born to this union. Mrs. Morgn was later matried to Charles R. Morgan, who died in 1943.

Had she lived until February 2, Mrs. Morgan would have been eightytwo years of age. She was a member of the First Presbyterian church in this eity and of the Women's Association of the church.

Surviving, in addition to the daughter, are a step-son, Hollis Morgau, Alberta, Canada, two grandchildren and four great-graudchildren.

Services are to b_0 held at the First Presbyterian church with the paster, the Rev. Donald Wayne Amsler, officiating. Buriat will be in Walnut Grove cometery. Mrs. Morgan's father, John Loy, was the first man to be buried at Walnut Grove.

The time for the services has not been definitely set as yet. The remains were removed from the Harter funeral home to the Evans residence Monday afternoon.

Presumably, all of his children had dispersed by this time.



Genetics


Autosomal DNA matching has verified the family tree as presented above into the 18th century. This is about as far as can be expected for autosomal analysis.

Analysis using mtDNA matching has revealed a cluster of about a dozen people that share an old common maternal line. In some cases, testers have family trees that reach back into the 17th or 18th century. These point to people from Connecticut in almost every case. These cases can be investigated in hopes of identifying common ancestors. I have started such an effort. See the following link.


Locations

In NY, Fabius and Cortland figure prominently in the Allen line. Farther back in time, the line seems to trace to CT, with a possible detour to Vermont.

Anna's maternal lines (surnames like Robbins and Warner) appear elsewhere throughout NY. The lines converge in Crawford County, PA, where Anna's parents (Lucia Elila Robbins and James Henry Allen) are married.

Such a migration to the west out of CT after American independence was very typical. I suspect that the families did not move alone from CT. Instead they probably moved with friends and relatives westward from CT. This pattern continued as the Allen, Robbins, etc. families and their neighbors moved further west from PA to Dakota Territory. See earlier references to the group that moved to Dakota Territory.



Following is a depiction of the places where Anna and her family and friends settled in Campbell Co., SD, in the 1880s. This is an area just about 5 miles south of Mound City, SD. The orange line is a township line and purple designates public land survey sections. The main north/south road is along the section line just to the east of the Frank Hatch Homestead.

Anna's home (the James H. Allen Homestead) is in section 12 of township 125N, range 77W, of the 5th meridian. The homesteads, with the exception of the Loy Homestead, that do not bear an Allen name are associated with the families of Anna's maternal (Robbins) aunts. She grew up in the company of aunts and uncles, brothers and sisters.





Albert Allen was an older brother, married to Mary Jane Hanes in PA.

Columbus Hatch was married to her aunt Louisa Robbins. Frank Hatch was their first son, born in 1851.

Charles Stuart was married to her aunt Martha Robbins. They eventually moved to WI.

John E. Robbins (III) was her uncle, married to a lady(ies) named Emma and/or Elizabeth. See the section on further research topics.

Harry J. Allen was another older brother, married to Hattie Mae Hankins.




Details of Anna's Family and Their Ancestors

Once again, John Allen has provided some information, which I copy below and to which I add some information.

Allen Ancestors

Following is picture of a family tree representation centered on James H. Allen, Anna's father. Following that is some text from John Allen's book.



Fabius, Onondaga County New York

The only record of Elisha Allen is found in 'The Genealogy of the Benedicts in America" by Henry M. Benedict, published in 1870. On page 262 of volume I, it states that Mercy, daughter of Enoch Benedict of Groton, New York, born March 7, 1802, married Elisha Allen of Fabius [Onondaga County] on February 2, 1831. Fabius lies about 15 miles southeast of Syracuse which is the county seat of Onondaga County, New York. Brant, Cattaraugus County New York

The information handed down to us indicates that James Henry Allen was born in Brant, Cattaraugus County, New York. Today Brant lies in Erie County, just north of the county line, about 20 miles southwest of Buffalo. There is no town there. Only a town hall, a small park and an historical marker. The countryside in Cattaraugus County is hilly and heavily forested. A large Indian reservation lies just south of the north county line. Census searches sugest that the family may have moved to Cortland County by 1840.



Meadville & Crawford County Pennsylvania

Census records appear to show James Henry Allen in Crawford County, Pennsylvania by 1850. He settled in Woodcock Township and appeared there in each Federal Census until 1880 when he is listed as living in Mead Township. Blooming Valley is in Woodcock Township. In that area he lived, married, sired 10 children and, after 35 years, set out on that fateful odyssey which was to claim his life after only three years and to disperse most of his family west of the Mississippi

The best evidence that I have seen indicates that James Henry Allen was the only (surviving?) child of Elisha and Mercy (Benedict) Allen.

Mercy's ancestors are reasonably well understood, and they trace back to the Danbury, CT, area during colonial times. John Allen's book shows a fairly extensive family tree for this line.

Investigating the Allen line farther back in time is hampered by the fact that the town records of Fabius burned in 1854. The trail becomes hard to follow farther back than Elisha's father, Peter. Peter Allen's will survives as does a Bible from the family of his son, Marvin Allen. These documents confirm the existence of certain family members in the Fabius area, including Peter's wife Roena. However, I have not seen explicit references to siblings of Roena or Peter. Nor have I seen references to their parents or other ancestors.

Census enumerations prior to 1850 for the Fabius area show people with the names Allen and Pierce/Pearce who may be clues as to the origins of Peter and Roena. Quite a bit of research could be done to solve the puzzle of their origins. For example, the 1810 census whose link follows Allen and Pearce names that could be investigated. <u>https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:XH2Z-S8X</u> The 1800 census shows a Peter Allen as well as William Allen. As indicated by John Allen, census enumerations show the family of John and Lucia from 1860-1880.

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

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

A map of Fabius, NY, in 1860 follows. This is after James H. Allen had left the area, but it might still provide some insight based on those people that remained. 1860 is about 6 years after the town records burned.



On the road northeast out of town you will see the names S. Allen and G. Beebe. The name J. Warner is present on the opposite end of town.

I have not investigated these names in detail. However, the Beebe name traces back to colonial CT and at places Beebe people mixed with Warners. We have some distant Beebe and Warner cousins based on common ancestors from the colonial period.

From a quick analysis of the 1860 Federal Census, S. Allen may represent Spafford Allen (peddler?), his wife Almena, and their daughter Sarah.

Robbins Ancestors



Here is a picture of a family chart centered on Lucia.

The Robbins, Warner, and Hickox lines can all be traced back to Colonial Connecticut and then to England. The Chandler line becomes difficult in that the identity of the person named Elizabeth Corning Chandler is not clear.

Lucia's maternal line has been of great interest to me since my it represents the history of my mtDNA and since there are about a dozen people that match this DNA in <u>www.familytreedna.com</u>. Some day it may be possible to use this information to identify common ancestors in England as well as contemporaries there that share this mtDNA (haplogroup X2b). I feel certain that it traces to immigrants to New haven, CT, in the mid 1600s. See the following URL for more information.

Migration from CT to NY to PA

Prior to being in Crawford Co., PA, Lucia's Robbins/Warner family traces to New York and then back to CT. Their paths were likely quite similar to the paths of the Allens and Benedicts, and it may be no great accident that they were together in Crawford Co. at the same time.

Lucia's father, John Edwin Robbins (Jr. or II), was born near Hartford, CT, in 1801. Her mother, Electa Warner was born in Chemung Co., NY, in 1807 after her family moved from the vicinity of Waterbury, CT.

Most of Electa's Warner relatives settled in the area of Pitcher, Chenango Co., NY, so it not clear if her birth location is inaccurate or if the family started in Chemung Co. and then moved to Chenango Co. Chenango Co.,

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


NY, is where Electa's parents (Richard Warner and Polly Hickox) are buried. Polly and Richard Warner had fifteen (!) children.

The exact path of the Robbins family (John Edwin Robbins and Elizabeth Chandler) to NY from CT is not clear to me, but at least one child was born in Oakland, Livingston Co., NY. It seems reasonable to think that they settled in Livingston Co., NY, which is where Electa and John (II) started their family.

I am not sure how Electa and John met, but their first first six children appear to have been born in Oakland, Livingston, Co., NY. Lucia was in this first group of six. Some time around 1839, the family moved to Crawford Co., PA, where their remaining four children were born.

Land ownership maps from the mid-1800s for Crawford county show the Robbins name as well as others that have importance to the Robbins family daughters and in the eventual move to Dakota territory. Here is a map from 1865 that shows the general area of Blooming Valley in Crawford Co. It is from a Library of Congress collection - <u>https://www.loc.gov/item/2012590195/</u>.





Zooming in on the area just to the north and east of Blooming Valley yields the following view. It shows locations for J. H. Allen, J. Robbins, and R. Robbins. R. Robbins could be Ransom Robbins, brother of John Robbins. J. H. Allen could be Jame H. Allen. Based on the proximity of these properties it is easy to imagine that the families were acquainted.

By the way, there is a Hatch household just south of town. This could be Samuel Hatch, brother to Columbus Hatch, who married Louisa Robbins, Lucia's sister. See picture to the right.

The family of Charles Stuart (who married Martha Robbins, Lucia's sister) is in Richmond Township as well.

Here is the John Robbins family in Crawford Co., PA, in 1950. I am not convinced that birth locations are correct since they conflict with other sources. Edwin is probably John Edwin Robbins (III). A family of Thompson's is "next door", and I wonder if this family is related to the family of Samuel Thompson who married Sophia. Nancy is probably Mariah (due to an enumeration error?).

John's wife, Electa, died in 1863. Daughters Mary married George Everman/Eberman in 1861. Mariah/Nancy may have married Jacob Braymer in 1867. Josephine married Richard Fross in 1871. So I would have expected to find John and Helen Josephine somewhere in the 1870 federal census.

In fact, here is Helen living with sister Mariah (now Braymer).

Helen (b.1847) married Richard Fross, and did not travel to Dakota Territory. She was the youngest sister.



Martha Naomi (Robbins) Stuart and Sofia Electa (Robbins) Thompson.





Martha (b.1845) made the trip to Dakota. She was married to Charles Stuart. They eventually move to WI from Dakota. Martha was the next to youngest daughter.

Sophia (b.1832) was the the third child, two years older than Lucia. She married "Lucky" Thompson and moved to Alaska but seems to have died in Crawford Co., PA, in 1871. She never made the move to Dakota Territory. She was the probably owner of these pictures, which were discovered in Alaska.




It is quite remarkable that it has survived all these years (since it was printed in 1864).

Appendix: Future Projects

- Investigate Sam's marriage to Margaret Rower to determine when and why it dissolved.
- Continue to look for more evidence of the relationship between William Loy and Sam Loy.
- Determine where Sam was around the time of the 1880 census and why I have not been able to find him there.
- See if there are records in Campbell Co. from the period 1885-1893 that would further document land transactions associated with Sam.
- Determine what became of the homestead in Campbell Co., SD, and the land in Adams Co., ND.
- Find more information about the ancestors of Sam's mother, Susannah Snyder.
- Clarify the identity of the woman (and family) living with John Loy and his family, including Sam in Ohio as documented in the 1870 census.
- Investigate the possible relatives of Peter Allen and Roena Pierce in Fabius, NY, in hopes of finding clues to their ancestors.
- Considerable work could be done to fill in details of the years spent in NY by Allen, Robbins, and Warner families.
- The life of John E. Robbins (b.1831) needs to be clarified. He may have been married to Ann Price, Elizabeth Price, and Emma Mays/Maize. Here is the best speculation at the present.
 - John Allen indicated in 1999 that John Edwin Robbins (III) married Ann Price, Elizabeth Price & Mrs. Mays. So, the story may be complicated! Children with the Elizabeth Price marriage may be John L Robbins (b.1868) and Grace May Robbins (b. 1870). Elizabeth may have remarried to Frank McFadden.
 - Was he in Indiana in 1870, married to a lady named Elizabeth Price, and is she a sister to Ann Price?

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


