Overview

Sam Loy and Anna Allen encountered each other in Campbell County, SD. I suspect that Sam came to the area from Ohio in about 1888 or perhaps slightly earlier. Sam may have traveled there alone from OH– I believe just after separation from his first wife in 1885-1886. Anna and her family moved to the area perhaps somewhat sooner than that. Anna was part of a group of related families that moved from Crawford Co., PA.

To help understand the encounter, this note starts by exploring land patent information for the township (Fairview) where Sam and Anna lived prior to their marriage in 1895. Inter-relationships among certain of the people who settled in Fairview Township are presented in the context of these patents.

Some (much) of this information was earlier presented by John Allen in a publication entitled "A Treasure – The Family of James H. Allen." Here I focus on just one aspect of the lives (i.e.,locations) of the some of the people that John Allen discussed in more detail. Here is what he had to say about the move of Anna's family to SD.

In 1885 the Dakota Territory was open for homesteading. With the exception of son John, the whole family moved to what is now Campbell County, South Dakota. Cousins Frank and Ira Hatch had discovered the area when they were returning from the "Gold Fields" of Colorado. Mound City was 100 miles from the end of the railroad at Aberdeen. The move to South Dakota and the early years are well described by daughter Anna Loy.

Land Patent Information

The picture that follows shows select homestead "sites" in part of Fairview Township in Campbell Co., SD, based on BLM information for T125N R77W (5th principal meridian). Surnames mentioned are Allen, Hatch, Kimmy, Stuart, Robbins, and Loy. Except for Loy, all of these names represent families that moved from the vicinity of Meadville, Crawford Co., PA, in the last 15 years of the 19th century. At this time South Dakota had just become a state, and public lands were made available for settlement. In general, Campbell County was settled by German-Russians, Norwegians, and an assortment of others. This group of homesteaders is part of "the others."



Following are slightly more detailed descriptions of the land patents shown in the picture.

For now, I am ignoring the patents for Harry Eugene Robbins. His patents are much later than the others being considered here. However, his line may trace back to Robbins people in colonial CT, and so he may be distantly related to the other Robbins people, whose histories are discussed here. This might be an interesting line of research for the future.

The patent for John E. Robbins, however, is of interest as he is John Edwin Robbins III, the brother of Lucia.

Charles Stuart - in section 14

Charles has one patent where his family lives. He is related to Lucia by marriage to her sister, Martha. - sw=true|sadv=false

In the picture above, only two are pictured – those for Columbus and Frank W. Hatch. Columbus was married to Lucia's sister, Ester/Esther. By way of explanation, Frank, Ira, and Virgil Hatch are son's of Columbus. Vinona is Virgil's wife. (Her maiden name was Austin.)

Founders: The Robbins/Warner and Allen/Robbins Families

The homesteads mentioned above can be understood in the context of just two families. - The family of John Edwin Robbins Jr. / Electa Warner and the family of their daughter Lucia Elila Robbins and her husband James Henry Allen.


Relationships of Homesteaders to Lucia Robbins Allen

With this background, the homesteading families can be understood based on the relationships of the heads of households to Lucia Robbins Allen in the 1890s. I tend to think of her as the matriarch of or virtual focus at the center of this group of settlers. I wonder if she viewed herself in this manner.

Here are Lucia's . . .

- Husband
 - James H. Allen (husband)
- Siblings and Their Children
 - John E. Robbins (brother)
 - Charles Stuart (brother in-law; married to sister Martha Naomi Robbins)
 - Columbus Hatch (brother in-law, married to sister Louisa Esther Robbins)
 - Frank Hatch (nephew, son of Columbus and Louisa)
- Children
 - Sam Loy (son in-law, married to daughter Anna Louella)
 - Harry J. Allen (son, married to Mattie Hankins))
 - Myron Kimmy (son in-law, married to daughter Mary Electa Allen)
 - Albert R. Allen (son, married to Mary Hanes/Kightlinger (also from Crawford Co.))

Here is a revised version of the original picture, now showing the relationships to Lucia, depicted with the yellow star. Blue lines point to sons/daughters/nephew. Green lines lead to sisters/brother.



Family Details

Lucia Robbins and James H. Allen

Rather than re-write a description of this family, I'll just include a few excerpts from John Allen's publication and refer you to the family group sheet presented here earlier. Following is text describing James H. Allen's life. Along with that are copies of obituaries for him and Lucia.

The study of James Henry is fascinating. We have no record of his place of birth except that it was in New York. The records of Lillian Allen state that he came from Brant, Cattaraugus County, although Brant is now in Erie County. We find his name in the federal census of Crawford County, Pennsylvania of 1850. In 1854 he married Lucia Elila Robbins, the daughter of John Edwin Robbins Jr. and Electa Warner Only in the 1860 census is his mother "Mercy" listed with the family. The 1860 and 1880 censuses list him as a farmer. The 1870 census as a butcher age 39. In the 1880 census his wife Lucia age 45 and seven children are listed: Mary age 21, John age 19, Albert age 17, Harry age 12, Frank age 11, Rolland age 4, and Anna age 1. Presumably his mother had died by 1870. At any rate, James must have changed occupations from butcher to farmer. We have no photos of Elisha or James. In 1882, court house records show that James purchased two parcels of land in Crawford County. It seems reasonable to infer that his holdings would not be sufficient to provide employment for James and his five sons.

James H. Allen
Allen, at his home near Mound City,
Campbell County, Dakota died of
typhoid pneumonia at age 55 years,
11 months and 25 days. Deceased
was born in Brant, Cattaraugus
County, N.Y. November 29, 1831
and died November 24, 1888.
He moved from his native state to
Crawford County Pa. when he was
about nineteen, where he lived until
Oct., 1885, when he, with his
family, except one son, emigrated to
Dakota. He died in the absence of
his wife who was visiting with

friends in Crawford.

Mrs. Lucia Allen Passes Away.

Mrs. Lucia Allen, who has resided in this city for the past four years, passed away at the home of her son, Frank Allen on Thursday, October 20, after a brief illness. This makes the second death in the Allen family within one week, their 13 month old baby having died with infantile paralysis on Monday night, a few days previous.

Mrs. Allen's maiden name was Lucia Robbins and she was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Robbins of Crawford County, Pa. Mrs. Allen was born in Crawford County, October 15, 1833 and was aged 77 years at the time of her demise. She was married to James Allen when she was 19 years of age. Mr. Allen having died in the year 1888. Since the death of her husband, Mrs. Allen has made her home with her son, Frank.

After the death of Mr. Allen in Dakota, Mrs. Allen accompanied her son to Alberta, Canada, and from that place came to Canby.

Deceased leaves, besides her son, Frank E., of this city, three other sons and two daughters, who are Rolland, of Alberta, Canada, John of Meadville, Pa., Henry (sp) of Campbell, S.D., Mrs. Anna Loy of Campbell, S.D., Mrs. Mary Kimmy, of Sumas, Wash.; the latter who attended the funeral.

Funeral services were held at the family residence on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock and the interment was in the family plot in Zion Cemetery. The services were attended by many friends of the family and many beautiful flowers covered the casket.

Mr. and Mrs. Allen have many friends in this city who deeply sympathize with them.

Obituary for Lucia Robbins

John E. Robbins (brother)

I don't know much about John E. Robbins III. Based on ancestry.com trees, he may have been married to one or more ladies with maiden name of Price.

More research could be done into his history, but for now it appears that he was born on 3/5/1831 in Livingston Co., NY, and he died on 4/9/1901 in Erie Co., NY.

This means that he must have sold or forfeited the homestead in Campbell Co., SD. Further research might yield the details.

Charles Stuart and Martha Naomi Robbins (sister)

Below is an early photo of Martha from a collection found in Ankorage, AK. This was presumably taken there by her sister Sophia, who moved there with her husband. (See http://www.forgottenphotosproject.com/)

Martha was married to Charles Stuart in Meadville on 4/15/1866. The second photo that follows shows the family after relocating to Vernon Co., WI. She was born in 1845 and died in 1936 (at age 91!).

She/they had four children – Gertrude Helen, Eva Mae, Eva C., and Louise F.

First, from findagrave memorial 95317120, there is the following text about Columbus. - "Moved to Wisconsin . . ., joined the northern army . . ., Civil War veteran, saw action with General Sherman, to Campbell County in 1885. Married Louisa Robbins." Other information from ancestry.com sources indicates that he was born on Crawford Co., PA, on 6/2/1826. He married Louisa Robbins on 4/17/1850 in Blooming Valley, PA. He died in Campbell Co., SD, in May, 1904. Clearly he had an active life.

Louisa was born in Livingston Co., NY, in 1829 and died in 1922 at age 93(!). She is buried in Crawford Co., PA, so she must have moved back to PA some time after the death of Columbus. (The 1910 to 1920 federal and South Dakota census enumerations should clarify this.)

I believe that they had six children: Frank, Ira, George, Mary ("Minnie"), Cora, and Virgil. (I have not tracked this family in detail.) The children were born in an assortment of locations, which reflects the family's movement from PA to WI to SD.





Georgina Smith, a descendant of Mary and Myron, has written the following on familyserach.org. -

"Myron Samuel Kimmy was the seventh child born to Peter Kimmy and Mary Pike in Meadville, Pennsylvania. He had one younger brother, Perry, who was four years younger. Their mother died when Myron was eight years old. In 1870 Census he was dwelling with Samuel Hobbs, and wife, who was a hotel keeper in Meadville Ward 2. He was age 13 and worked in a Cigar Factory. Nov 8 1883 he married Mary Electa Allen in Blooming Valley, Crawford County, Pennsylvania. In 1900 they were living in Madison Township Lake County, Ohio where his brother Perry lived. Occupation

of Myron was carpenter. In this Census Mary indicated that she was the mother of 4 children and 3 were living. No information has been found about the other child who would have had died young. When they moved to Alberta Canada Myron applied for Canadian Citizenship. He farmed on a homestead obtained. When he went to Washington State in 1910 he had to apply for United States Naturalization which seemed rather strange since he was born in Pennsylvania, United States. "


Here is a copy of the marriage license for Albert and Mary.

Albert's wife, Mary Jane, was a part of the William Kightlinger family, which settled in the same area in Campbell Co., SD. Her maiden name is reported as Hanes, however, and she was born prior to the marriage of William to his wife, Anna. So, there is a story waiting to be discovered to explain her association with the William Kightlinger family. The Kightlingers were also from Crawford Co., PA, and they are ikely related to a large number of people in PA with the same surname.

After Albert's death, Mary remained in the Campbell Co. area until her death in 1923. It appears that her children remained in the area as well.

Sam Loy and Anna Louella Allen (daughter)

Following are pictures of Sam an Anna extracted from other group pictures.







Anna Louela Allen

Anna's birth family is fairly well described above. Sam was from Ohio, and there exists some information about him that I believe is inaccurate. Based on my research, I believe that he was born in 1859 to John (Johann) Loy and Susanna Snyder, who were married in 1857.

Sam's father immigrated from Baden just after the 1848 Revolution that preceded the formation of a united German state in 1871. Johann had been married to Sophia Kaelber, who had previously been married to Jakob Heidegger. (Sophia and Jakob had three children, some of whom I believe immigrated to the US and adopted the surname Hydaker.) In any event, Johann and Sophia had three children (John E., Catherine, and Mary). Sophia either died in transit to the US or shortly before.

When John/Johann married Susanna, their family consisted of themselves and John's three children. (Susanna was part of a family that came to OH from PA.) John and Susanna had four children (Christina, Lizzie, Sophia, and Sam). Sometime, not too long after Sam's birth in 1859, Susanna disappears from the family for an undocumented reason.

In 1863 John marries again, this time to "Mariah Augustine" according to a marriage certificate. Based on period records for the area in Ohio around prospect and Waldo, OH, where John lived, I suspect that Mariah's surname was actually Augenstein and that her full name was Maria Catherina Augenstein. Although exact dates are somewhat elusive, John and Maria added two children (Mary M. and Sarah Ann) to the family.

The point of all of this is that Sam had a number of siblings in OH. Their own families are pretty well documented and confirmed from DNA testing. There is no evidence that I have seen that Sam participated in the Civil War as suggested by findagrave.com memorial 95504249.

I believe that in 1882 (age 23) Sam married Margaret Rower. They had a child named William H. (b.1883). However, something happened that resulted in Sam moving to South Dakota and Margaret marrying Sam E, Clevenger (a former neighbor of Margaret's) in 1891. William was left with his maternal grand parents, James and Sarah Rower. [All of this is based on paper records, but I hope to confirm it through DNA testing.]

So, this brings us back to the story in South Dakota, where Sam encounters Anna Allen and marries her in 1895. There is likely a 20 year difference in their ages, not the 30 years reported by some. Their own family is depicted in the family group sheet that follows.

Here is an excerpt from John Allen's publication that focuses on Anna but describes the exploits of the Allen/Loy family better than any other source of which I am aware.

1879: Edison invents the electric light.

ANNA LOUELLA (ALLEN) LOY

Born 4 February 1879 in Meadville, Pennsylvania. Died 15 March 1941 in Lemmon, South Dakota.

Anna was the youngest of ten children born to James Henry Allen and Lucia Elila Robbins. When she was only six years old the family moved to Campbell County, Dakota Territory with six of their children. James took up a homestead six miles south and two miles west of Mound City. She wrote of her vivid memories of growing up on the prairie, and how on a gala day each child was given ten cents to spend. She was sure that boys and girls never had as much fun as they had in those days. She also recalled the time when her father, who was a justice of the peace, received a five dollar gold piece for a court fee. Anna begged to be allowed to hold it. She dropped it and it rolled between the floor boards, which had to be taken up to retrieve it. Summers found the younger children herding cattle for neighbors. For 25 cents per head the cattle were cared for from May till October. Since they had to herd their own cattle "the money

was a clear gain." Much of their riding was done on calves or steers.

Only three years after the move, Father James Henry died of influenza while Mother Lucia was visiting in Pennsylvania. This was such a shock to Lucia that she took Frank,



Rolla and Anna, the three youngest, and moved back to their farm in Crawford County, Pennsylvania, where they stayed for several years before returning to South Dakota. When she was 16 years old (1895) she married Sam Loy who was 46 years old at that time. The couple had 6 children, Ruth, Guy, Marian, Ralph, Howard and Arlo. They farmed southwest of Mound City, adjacent to other family members. Because of their operation, which was increasingly directed toward livestock, they needed more land, and in 1916 they moved to a new place, 7 miles north of

Lemmon, South Dakota (in North Dakota). Grandson Ralph Scoular describes the operation. They farmed 80 acres and used 1500 acres for grazing livestock. All in all, they operated about 1600 acres. Son Guy did most of the farming as Sam was gone a good deal, buying livestock. Their main source of income was buying and selling horses. They also raised pigs, and cattle which they fattened for slaughter. Anna was a great reader, a lifelong student, a good singer, and played the organ well. She was a fine horseman, an expert with the bull whip, and a crack shot. Sam died in 1920 at age 71. Anna was 41 at that time. She and the children continued to operate the farm for as long as they were able. Anna then moved into Lemmon where she lived for the rest of her life. She died of leukemia, in 1941, at age 62. Anna was a life-long Christian, reared in the Methodist faith. Some time in the early 1930s the Church of God held tent meetings in Lemmon. During those meetings Anna had a life-changing spiritual awakening. Her Christianity became greatly intensified after that experience. Howard, her youngest child, came to the Lord after a near drowning, and was a great joy to his

Ruby Beckman, later to become a lay pastor, lived with Anna during the 1935-36 school year. She writes about the profound influence which Anna had on her, and about how, in a very patient and tender way, she led Ruby's brother to the Lord. Photos taken late in her life show a radiant and joyful person. The reader is referred to two articles written by Anna for details of her early life. She was certainly a remarkable woman. From "Memories" by Anna Loy and from information supplied by Duane and Ralph Scoular and Ruby Beckman

RUTH IRENE LOY

Born on 2 October 1896 In Lemmon North Dakota.



Died on 6 November 1958 in Lemmon, South Dakota.

Ruth was the first of six children born to <u>Samuel Loy and Anna</u> <u>Louella Allen</u>. She grew up on farms in the Mound City and Lemmon South Dakota areas. Since her father was gone a great deal, she was very active in the

farming operation. She completed her high school education and attended normal school in Aberdeen,


A Robbins Family Bible

A few years ago, a bible was discovered in SD that is special to the descendants of Robbins/Warner family. The provenance of the bible is as follows.

- 1864 Published in Hartford, CT, by Case, Lockwood and Company. (This is interesting, even if it is a coincidence, as the maternal line of this family traces back to Colonial CT (Hartford, New Haven ,etc.))
- 1864 Given to Daughter Lucia by her father John Robbins within a year of the death of his wife Electa Warner.
- 1873 Passes from Lucia Robbins Allen to her daughter Mary Electa Allen Kimmy.
- 1898 Passes to the youngest daughter of Lucia, namely Anna Luella Allen Loy.
- 1941 Passes to Anna's daughter Marian Loy Bates.
- 1980 Passes to Marian's daughter Shirley Bates Nelson.
- 2004 Passes to Shirley's daughter Kristie.

The bible was restored in 2004. Unfortunately, nothing was recorded in the bible other than its passage along the maternal line. It is a special artifact that documents part of an interesting maternal line that can be traced to Colonial CT and then to England.






Related Census Information

Also shown is the household of Lucia's recently widowed daughter in-law, Mary (wife of son Albert). Albert had died earlier in the year. Note that Mary's oldest brother, Robert Kightlinger, is present in the house with Mary's family. It makes sense that he is helping after the recent death of Albert. The rest of the Kightlinger family is nearby.

The fact that the Kightlingers do not appear in the 1895 census is an indication that they arrived in the area some time between 1895 and 1900.
