In this document I assemble the information known to me that has a bearing on John Patrick Long and his wife, Mary Gill, and their children. Much information comes from two sets of notes created by James J. Long Jr, in 1987 and 1989. This information adds “color” and humanity to the otherwise dry birth/death records that I have provided. A copy of one set of these notes is in an appendix. In a second appendix you will find some photos of the birth family of James J. Long Jr. This seems fitting since his writing provides invaluable insight into the Long/Gill family.

This photo of John was likely taken sometime a little earlier than his death in 1905. His grandson, James Long Jr., gives a nice account of his life, including military service in a section that follows.

Summary by Grandson, James Long Jr.

1987 note . . .

was brought in. Grandfather died in 1905. He had lived in England near Liverpool before immigrating to the U.S. Grandmother

Grandfather's name was John P. Long

my Grandfather Long died in 1905 so I did not know him. They tell me he left Liverpool, England to come to America. The blood was Irish with a bit of Scotch blood. In the 1800's many people left Europe to come to America. I do not know how many brothers or sisters he had nor where he was born. In order to get citizenship in America, he joined the Army. He was assigned as a striker to a General's office. A striker attended to and waited on the General more than an Orderly would in today's army. Mary Gill and she left

Birth

There is little information about John's birth date and location. The 1900 Federal Census shows his birth to be June, 1854. However, his headstone shows a year of 1852. Military enlistment records pretty clearly indicate a birth date of June or July, 1853. I have taken the most reasonable estimate to be June, 1853. Searches into his past should probably use a range of years like 1850-1855 just because of the range of reported dates.

The location of his birth is alternatively reported as NY or PA or MD in official records. The 1900 census shows NY, but his children's records tend to report PA. -

- Military enlistment records consistently indicate his place of birth to be Philadelphia.
- Mamie's death certificate shows Maryland.
- Cora's death certificate shows Philadelphia, PA, in place of a crossed out Maryland entry.
- James' death certificate shows PA.
- Steven's death certificate shows PA.
- Thomas' death certificate shows PA.
- His own 1905 death certificate shows MD.

Notes from James Long Jr., however, indicate that he may have immigrated – traveling from Liverpool to the US. I wonder if this information actually pertains to John's father. So, I believe that the best guess for his birth location is Philadelphia, PA.

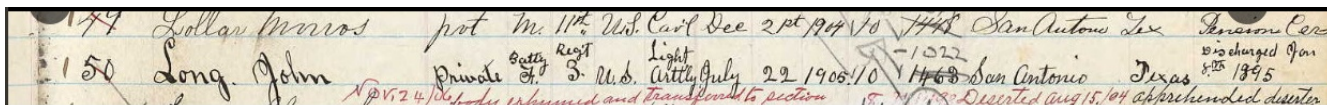
Conclusion is that John's birth probably took place in June, 1853, in Philadelphia, PA.



Death and Burial and Army Service

John died on 7/22/1905, purportedly of heart disease or osteosarcoma, depending on which source you believe. His body was originally buried in the National Cemetery in San Antonio based on his military service as documented below. His remains were moved to lie next to those of his wife, Mary, in San Fernando Cemetery #2 after her death. Supporting evidence follows.

From the National Cemetery Registry . . .



This record shows his unit to be Battery F of the 3rd U.S. Light Artillery and that he was discharged on January 8, 1895. - I have been unable to locate his military file, but his artillery unit was shown in the 1897 Battle of Flowers Parade two years after is discharge in the following photo. This Army field artillery unit has a long, complicated history dating from the earliest history of the USA. John's battery (F) was constituted 6/16/1861 and organized at Ft. Greble, PA, in Feb.,1861. John was probably too young to have been involved in the Civil War. No stories about service during the Civil War have come down through the family.



The following transcribed death record was obtained from the City of San Antonio. It has some errors, which I will describe.

Unfortunately this does not show who reported the death. Other items of note -

- As mentioned before, his place of birth is shown as MD. I believe that this is wrong.
- Parents places of birth (POB) are shown as Ireland.
- Location of birth is shown as 109 Victor in Ward 6. I believe that this is a transcription error. He was most likely living at 109 Vinton, as shown in other documents.
- The “certifier” is shown to be R. Caffecy, which again I believe is a transcription error. I propose that the correct name is Russell Caffery, a doctor of Irish descent who practiced in the Hicks Building in downtown San Antonio and who lived in the 700 Block of E. Carson (not far from the Long clan and the nearby Catholic Church).
- Cause of death of osteosarcoma conflicts with the later (1947) disinterment record, which says cause was heart disease. I suspect that one of these records has been transcribed improperly. A review of the original registry entries may reveal which.

Following are two related records. The interment record and then the disinterment record.

Since writing the first version of this document, I have located enlistment records for our John Long. There is a possible record in 1876, but there is a certain record in 1880, followed every five years by re-enlistment until final disability discharge in 1895. For sure, John spent 15 years in the Army in the artillery unit named above.

Here is an image of the 1880 enlistment record. John had brown hair, blue eyes, was fair complected, and stood 5 ft. 8 in. tall. At the time of enlistment in early December, 1880, he was 27 years and 5 months old. See <https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:QJDR-SCJ6>.



Ancestors

John's ancestors are not known with certainty at this time. However, taking the estimated birth date and location (June, 1853, Philadelphia), the following records suggest themselves. If these represent the right Philadelphia family, then John had an older brother named Samuel, a father named John, and a mother named Jane. Father and mother both being Irish, which makes a good deal of sense. Maybe these are the people described by Jim Long that spent time in Liverpool before coming to the USA.

And, this may be a record of the death of John's father. <https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/1:1:VKDV-NC3> If so, he died in 1864 from strychnine poisoning in Philadelphia. This record is consistent with the family shown above in 1860, and it would explain the appearance of the family in the 1870 census without a father.




Summary by Grandson, James Long Jr.

1987 note . . .



before immigrating to the U.S. Grandmother Long came from County Galway, from the town of Oughterard. Ireland. Oughterard is a seat of learning for the Gaelic language.

1989 note . . .



more than an orderly would in many ways. Grandmother Long was Mary Gill and she left Oughterard, County Galway, Ireland. She, too, had to be quarantined in Ellis Island but for some reason she was kept there three weeks before she could come into America. Catherine Wright Robertson told me Grandmother Long had a brother on the New York Police Force. She got a job as a maid for the wife of the General for whom Grandpa Long was his "stricker". They married in time and were transferred to Tallahassee, Florida where my Aunt Mame was born. Then they were transferred to Ft. . . . which they lived in tents . . .

Birth

Mary's birth year is not clear based on the following sources.

- 1900 census: May, 1864.
- 1910 census: 1910-41 = 1869
- 1920 census: 1920-57 = 1863
- 1930 census: 1930-67 = 1863
- 1940 census: 1940-83= 1857
- headstone: 5/24/1857
- marriage certificate & 1930 census: 1882-16 = 1866
- death certificate: 5/24/1863

Throwing out the two extreme values of 1857 and 1869 leads me to think that her actual birth date was May 24, 1863, although 1864 would not surprise me.

Mary was unequivocally born in Ireland. Many sources also indicate County Galway, and at least one indicates Oughterard in Galway. (See notes below from grandson, James Long Jr.)



Immigration and Naturalization

Here are some clues.

- 1900 census: immigration in 1872
- 1910 census: immigration in 1885
- 1920 census: immigration in 1877, naturalization in 1883
- 1930 census: immigration in 1880

Discovery of an immigration record from the period between 1870 and 1880 (inclusive) would settle this issue.


Life Together

There is a family story that John and Mary met through his military service as a type of orderly for an officer, whose wife employed Mary as a maid. Here's what Jim Long has to say.



On the East side from front to back were: Grandmother Long's ^{Bed} room - Uncle Johnnie + Aunt Cora's bedroom, my sister's bedroom - the bathroom and Uncle Tom's bedroom. The back yard was small but there was a three car garage with storage rooms over the garage. The chopped wood between

the garage, the chopped wood between the house and the garage and wood was stacked on the West side along the house at the back and in back of the garage. Grandmother Long owned the next property and Aunt Mamie lived there with her husband Frank Carroll and their only son - also called Frank Carroll. Back in those days Grandmother had a wash lady named Bertha who came to boil the clothes in the big black iron pot and

and they were washed on a scrub board. Bertha generally had one or two helpers with her. The house was located on the NW corner of Palmetto St (side) and Van Ness St. now called the access road to the expressway.

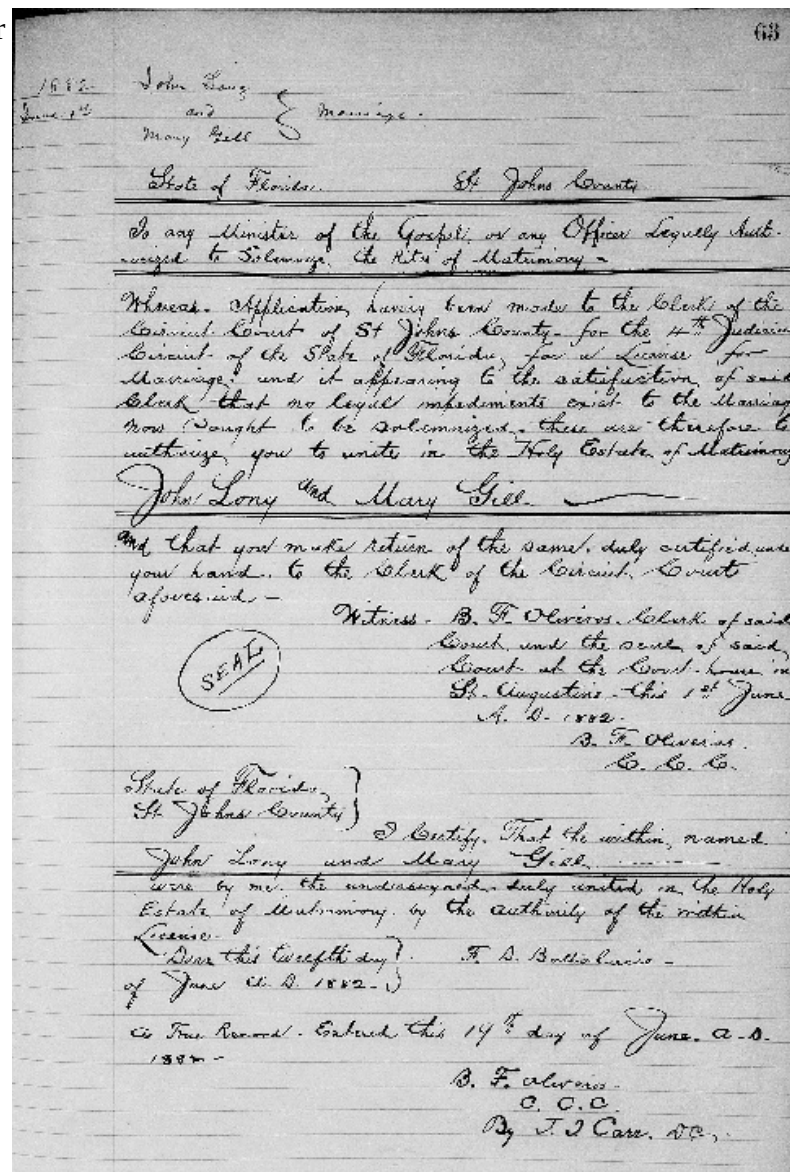

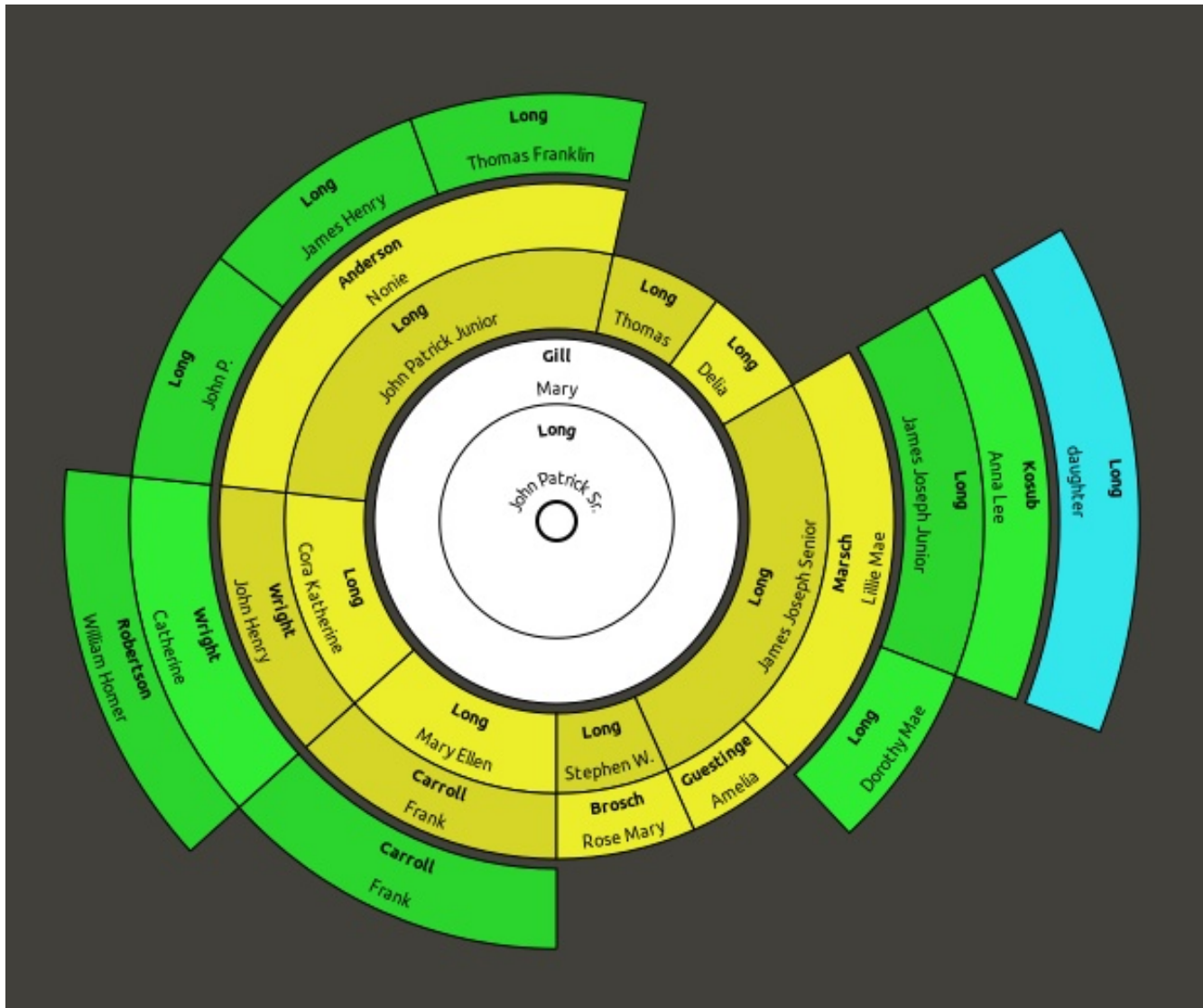
Children

Here is the only family photo of which I am aware. It is from before John's death in 1905, and it shows John, Mary, Mamie, and Cora (with the duck). Probably it was taken at their Vinton address. Note that Cora is wearing what looks like a wedding ring; this helps date the photo to 1904 or 1905.

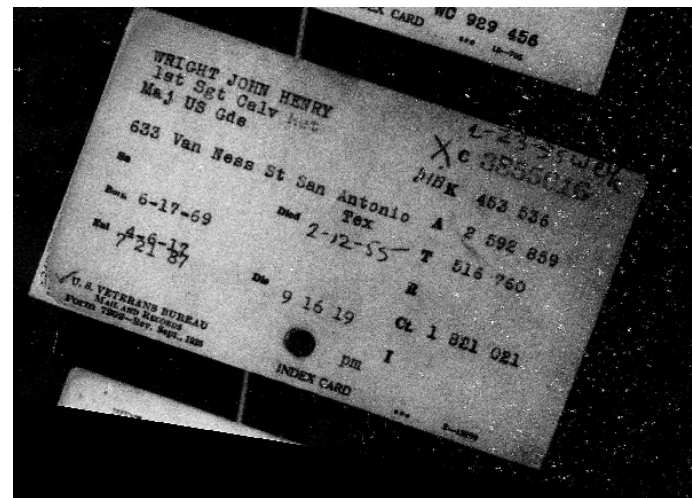

James Joseph Long Sr. (1892-1950)



James J. Long Sr is the father of my father in law, and as a result I have had access to more photos showing him than ones showing his siblings. The photo at right looks to be from his wedding to Lillie Marsch, daughter of John Peter Marsch and Caroline Fincke, in 1922.

Here is a list showing James' family. It shows his two children, Dorothy & James Jr (author of the notes used throughout this document). Family life was abnormal owing to James' struggle with alcoholism, which led to separation from wife Lillie. In 1930, during the separation, Lillie died in a horrible accident in which she was burned by the fuel from an iron. After her death, their children lived at times with aunts and uncles. In 1935, James remarried to Amelia Guestinger. Towards the end of his life, James was getting his life back together and was able to see a couple grandchildren. Unfortunately, he died roughly at age 58, not long into his recovery from alcohol addiction. James Jr talks about his father in the next section.

In my early days before my mother died we lived at 221 Stafford and I was to go to the public school at the end of the block. Well my first day there I didn't get a desk because I was one of the younger students - when I saw that I walked out! At home my dad said - it was so close but now I'll take you to St. Patrick's which is a mile away and you will have to walk to school and back. I said OK - so I was enrolled in St. Patrick's. I went there through the 7th grade. The old school was at the SW corner of Willow Street and Crosby St and it was torn down when the expressway was put in. The school was relocated on the SE corner of Muncey and Mason streets where it now is.

After my mother died we moved in with Grandmother Long at 633 Van Ness St. Grandmother Long lived on Benton or Venton Street and was bought out when the army wanted that land. It was in the area where warehouses are now - across N. New Brumfels are from the ^{East} back side of the Quadrangle. You will also find a brick building along the sidewalk on the East side of the Quadrangle near the back gate of the Dr. Grandfather Long's cannon was housed in that building and he pulled guard duty at the Quadrangle when the Indian Geronimo was brought in. 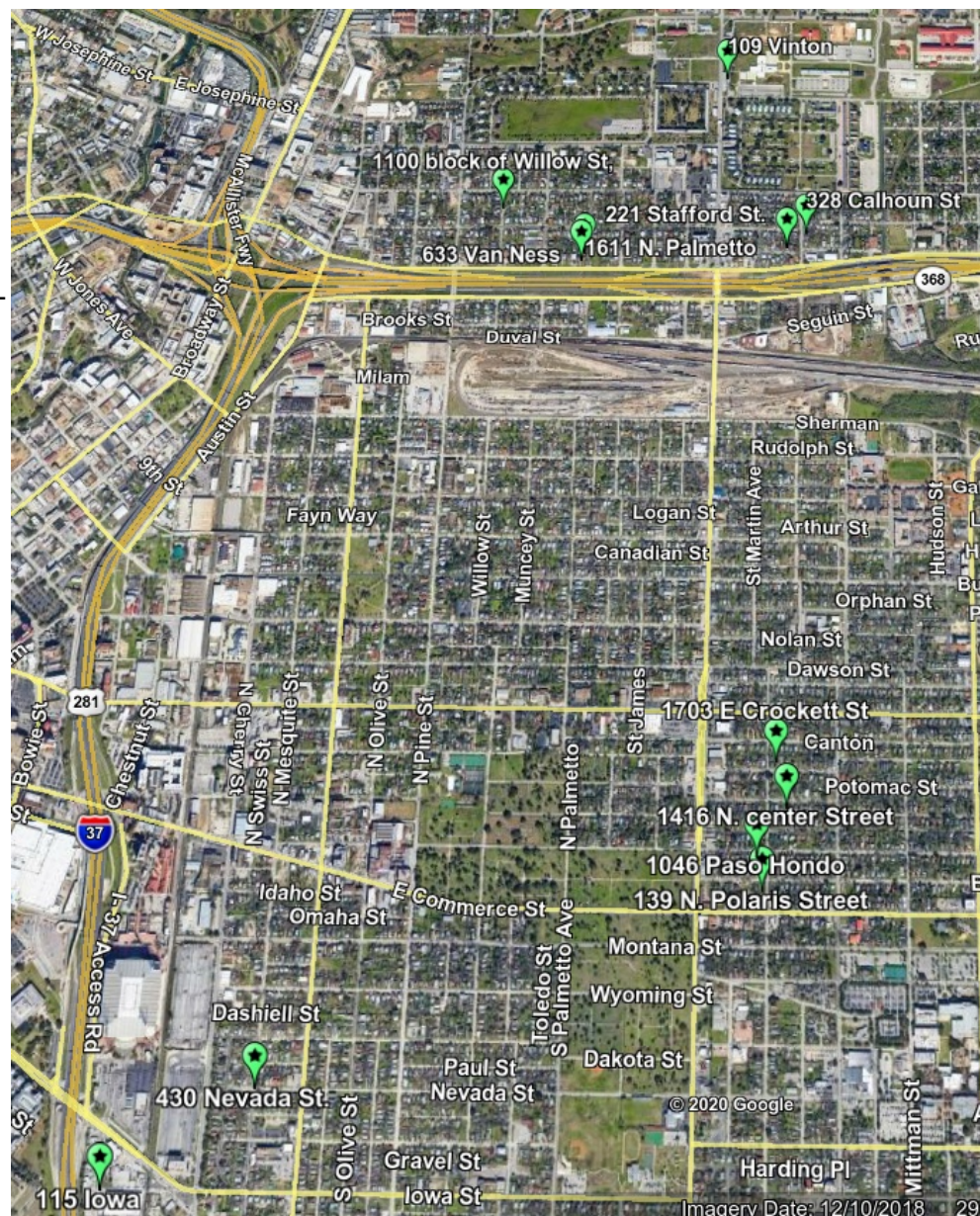

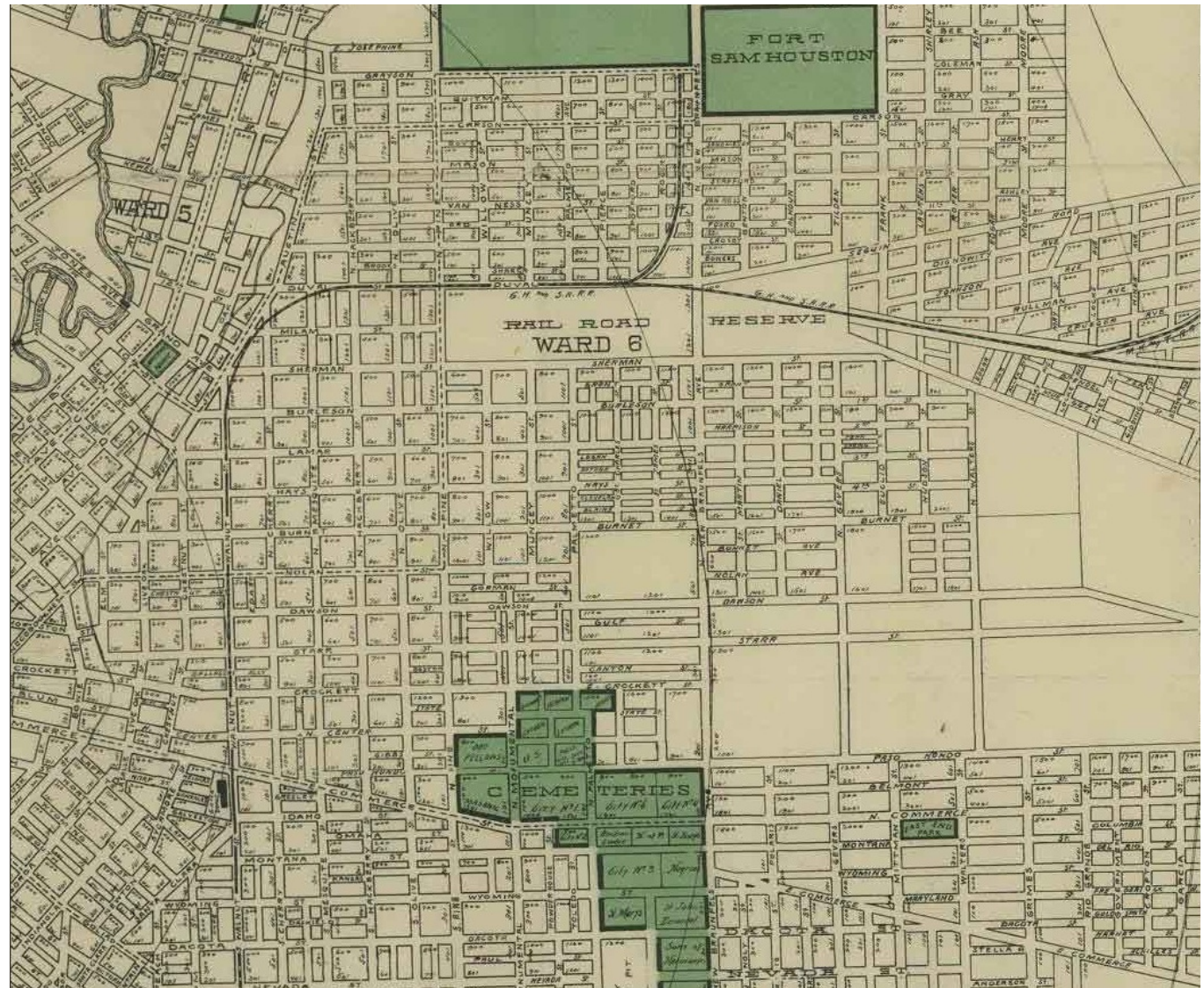
Locations

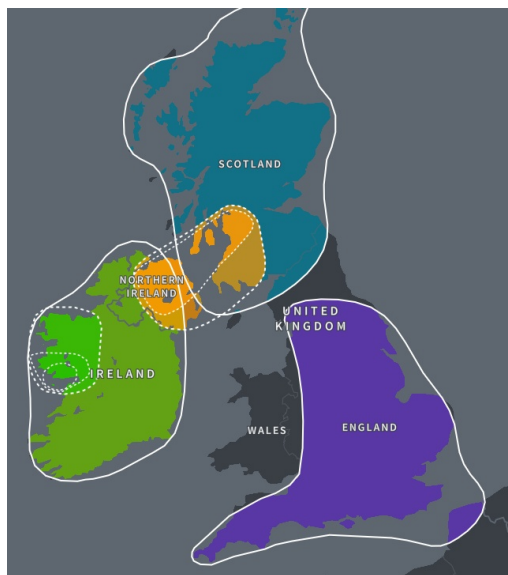

Genetics

I normally recommend that people treat admixture estimates from DNA testing companies with skepticism for a variety of reasons. Here are three examples for one of the great grandchildren of John and Mary. The ones on the left and right are similar, but the one in the middle stands out as being very non-specific. The two similar ones are consistent with the family stories that mention Oughterard in Galway for the Gills. Likewise they are consistent with the Scots-Irish hint for John Long.



I'll mention in passing that I have not started genetic investigations in any serious way. One initial pass, however, revealed a link to people descended from Mary's brother Thomas. This DNA link and census information makes it clear that Thomas was in New York working as a policeman just as James Long Jr's note indicates.





Appendix: Information from James J. Long Jr. dated 1989

We are fortunate to have some notes written by a grandson to provide additional clues about the Long/Gill family.

Following are all pages from his 1989 note describing the family of his grandparents.

From the desk of

My grandparents.
Additional information as I
recall.

Page 13 7/4/18/1989

My Grandfather Long died in 1905 so I did not
know him. They tell me he got Liverpool, England
to come to America. The blood was Irish with a bit
of Scotch blood. In the 1800's many people left Europe
to come to America, & do not know how many of them
wistfully he had now where he was born. In order
to get citizenship in America, he joined the Army.
He was assigned as a striker to a General of the
Army. He was ordered to not wait in the General's
army. More than an orderly would in the Army.
Grandmother Long was Mary Gill and she left
England, County Down, Ireland. She, too, had to
be guaranteed in Ellis Island but for some reason
she was kept there three weeks before she could come
into America. Catherine might be the name of the
mother's name. She had a brother in the New York Police
force. He got a job as a mail for the wife of the
General for whom Grandfather Long was the "striker".
They married in time and were transported
to Talahasse, Florida where my Grandmother
was born. Then they were transported to
New Houston. At first they lived in tents
outside the Prudhoe. They caught water by
the barrel for twenty five cents a barrel was raised
from the barrels (well) by mules pulling a wagon.

They bought the house on Buxton Street. There
a 2 story house. The family grew - as it included them
for you - Aunt Mame (born in Florida) married
Frank Cornell and they had a son named Frank
Cornell Jr. Frank, the father, worked for the U.S.
Copper Co. in San Antonio (Hoffman - Hayman Office).
Aunt Mame got tuberculosis and died from it.
As I remember Frank Jr. attended Central and took
some courses at St. Mary's U. Then he joined
the Navy and he was at Pearl Harbor when the
Japanese bombed it. He is retired from the Navy
living in California, San Francisco College and has
a business there. He and Catherine Wright
Roberson were close being, never in age - I
do not know his immediate family.
Next - John P. Long (Uncle John) who married
Nancy Anderson (Aunt Mame). They had three
sons - the eldest - John P. Long died in W. W. II of
Pneumonia. James & Henry Long, married to -
Mary Corling. They had three children, James
is deceased. He, like his father, Uncle John, died of
Cancer. Next - Thomas F. Long married to Louise
- They had three children.
Next Thomas Long - (Uncle Tom) he never
married but he took care of Grandmother Long.
Next - Carl Long (Aunt Ann) who married
John H. Wright. (Uncle Johnny). He had two

and race since before joining the Army. He was commissioned in World War I and he attained the rank of Major. He was from Pennsylvania. They had a daughter Catherine who graduated from our lady of the lake and taught school for years in St. Paul's school. She could keep you laughing when she told of "anovers" she received from children. He married William H. Robertson (Billy). He was General Manager for AAA here for years. His decessed as is Catherine who died a few months ago. Aunt Dorothy lived with them for a number of years. They had a daughter Jay Robertson, who is a doctor (MD) in Dallas next was my Dad - James Long. He married Julie Marshall - she lived just beyond Thousand Oaks Semetary. School which is built on the south end of John Marshall's property, which came to him through his wife Caroline from her father a Mr. Frick. I didn't know him. I was born James Long in 1923 and Aunt Dorothy, my sister, was born in 1925. Aunt mother was at the farm and a goodie pie (over)

expected. She was burned from the wrist up and she was burned internally as well. She seemed! She lived a week and died in the Bayley Hospital. The hospital is gone and torn down but it was on North Street, backing up to the river and across the bridge from Jiggs' Keams General Home - across from Providence and Central. Mom died in 1930. Our father remarried Amelia Quastinger in 1935. He died in 1950 and Amelia died years later. They are buried in St. Remond's Catholic Cemetery in San Antonio, Texas. (wade love) (wade Rose) Next - Stephen Long - He married Rose Broad who was born in Yakima! The last was working in San Antonio when they met. I left home when I was 18 out of High School and lived with Aunt Rose and Uncle Stephen. Catherine Robertson was married to William H. Robertson (Billy) and he had a sister named Gretchen who was married to Walter Roberts who worked at Frost Bank and he got me my first job at the bank when I got out of High School next Melvin Long. She died in infancy and I did not know her.

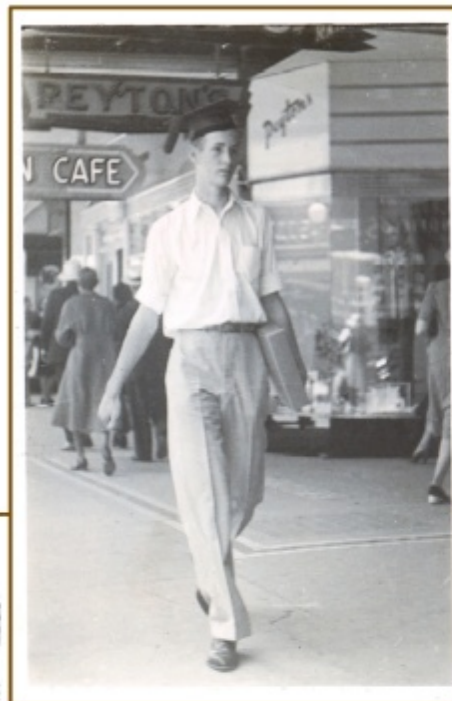
